PATRIOTS POWER: Through two games in this week's series, Somerset has smashed eight home runs. Thursday night's 11-3 thrashing included 10 extra-base hits, which set a Somerset Patriots Double-A record. The Patriots also tied a season-high of five home runs, after setting the mark six days prior on June 23 vs. New Hampshire in the 12-1 win that clinched the first half title. Six different Patriots have homered in the two games, including two each from Tyler Hardman and Everson Pereria.

TEAM EFFORT: In Thursday night's 11-3 win, all nine members of the Patriots' lineup reached base, while 8/9 batters collected at least one extra-base hit. Five different players homered for the second time in the last six days.

SUMMER OF SWEENEY: On Thursday night, Trey Sweeney homered for the sixth time in his last 10 games. During the month of June, Sweeney has hit 8 of his 11 HR, while slashing .282/.362/.602 with 18 RBI, 16 R and 11 BB.

SEVEN HEAVEN: With his two doubles on Thursday night, Austin Wells extended his season-best hit streak to seven straight games. During the seven-game hit streak, Wells is 9-for-30 with 6 RBI, 3 R, HR, 4 2B and 3 BB. The seven-game hit streak is tied with four other players (including Mickey Gasper) for the longest active streak in the Eastern League. During Gasper's 7-game hit streak, he is 11-for-23 with 7 RBI, 9 R, 3 HR, 2 2B and 3 BB.

EVERSON'S EXCELLENCE: Everson Pereira has now homered in three of four games since returning from injury, going 5-for-12 with 6 RBI, 6 R, 3 HR and 2 BB over that span. Pereira's ninth inning homer on Thursday his season-best on-base streak to 16 games. During the streak, which dates back to May 16, Pereira is slashing .418/.484/.800 with 12 RBI, 11 R, 6 HR, 8 BB and a 1.284 OPS.

2023: Sauer began the 2023 season on Somerset's 7-day Injured List with a right-forearm strain. He began a rehab assignment with the FCL Yankees on 6/5, before a stop in Hudson Valley prior to being reinstated from Somerset's Injured List on 6/23. Sauer made his season debut for Somerset on that day, when he started the Patriots' first half-clinching 12-1 victory.

2022: Sauer began the 2022 season in High-A Hudson Valley, going 5-3 with a 3.77 ERA over 18 starts that included 100 K in 88.1 IP. He was named the South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week on 6/5 this year, following start in Aberdeen where he went 7.0 IP, with a H, BB and 6 K. Sauer was promoted to Somerset on August 9. In his third Double-A start on August 25, Sauer struck out 17 batters over 8.0 IP, both of which were career highs. Sauer's 17 strikeouts were the most by any full-season MLB or MiLB pitcher since 2019, and they set a Somerset Patriots franchise record. This came two starts after he allowed a career-high 9 ER on a career-high 9 H in his Double-A debut.

2021: The 2021 season wound up being Sauer's first full pro season, beginning in Single-A Tampa where he made 15 appearances (13 GS), before finishing the season with eight starts in High-A Hudson Valley. Over 23 total appearances (21 GS), he went 5-6 with a 4.69 ERA and 127 K in 111.1 IP.

2019: What was supposed to be Sauer's first full pro season in 2019, began with two starts in Low-A Charleston and was cut short due to a torn UCL. After undergoing Tommy John Surgery that April, Sauer used the lost 2020 season to continue rehabbing.

2018: Sauer spent his second season in 2018 with short-season Class-A Staten Island, starting 13 games and going 3-6 with a 3.90 ERA.

2017: After being selected in the second round of the 2017 MLB Draft, Sauer spent his pro debut season that year in the GCL, pitching in six games and going 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the second round of the 2017 MLB Draft (pick No. 54 overall) out of Righetti High School in his hometown of Santa Maria, CA. Sauer signed for \$2,497,500, which was over-slot amount after they drafted Clarke Schmidt in the first round and signed him for below slot value. Sauer began touching 97 mph with his fastball as a senior in high school.

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. 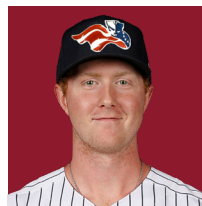

2022: Rosario was claimed on waivers by the Yankees from the Red Sox in the final week of MLB Spring Training in 2022.
