LHP EVAN SHAWVER (1-1, 2.65) VS. RHP SPENCER ADAMS (0-1, 9.53)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Express meet for the first of three series on the year and first of two in Round Rock ... Albuquerque is expected to start Evan Shawver, while Spencer Adams is slated to take the hill for Round Rock.

ATTENDANCE: The Isotopes have tallied a total attendance of 281,225 over 42 openings—the highest in the Pacific Coast League (second: Las Vegas, 249,741; 39 openings) and third-highest in Minor League Baseball.

CHAD: Chad Stevens has a 60-game Triple-A on-base streak dating back to September 11, 2025, with Salt Lake, the second-longest active in pro ball (longest: Mike Sirota, 63, Great Lakes and Tulsa) ... During streak Stevens is slashing .342/.437/.495 with 16 doubles, three triples, four homers, 43 RBI and 35 walks.

-Is the third-longest on-base streak in Triple-A since 2005 (second: Michael Stefanic, 62, Salt Lake, September 2, 2022-June 8, 2023) ... The longest: Nick Martini, 66, 2018, Nashville).

-Is the 9th-longest in MiLB since 2005 (longest: Jeff Natale, 79, 2005-06, Lowell, Greenville, Wilmington).

-During the 60-game streak, has reached base once in 22 games ... Of those contests, reached base in last PA seven times (all in 2026: March 29, April 2, April 25 GM1, May 3, May 14-16).

-Has a 50-game Triple-A on-base streak in 2026 (every game with Albuquerque in 2026 with PA), an Isotopes franchise record.

THE RIT MAN: Ryan Ritter went 1-for-5 with a single Sunday, extending his Triple-A on-base streak to 43 games, the fourth-longest active streak in MiLB ... 20 multi-hit games during streak.

-During stretch, is slashing .360/.442/.719 with 14 doubles, four triples, 14 homers, 47 RBI and 23 walks.

VEEN, VEEN: Zac Veen went 3-for-5 Sunday with a double and his 13th homer, third leadoff homer of the season and second in his last three games (June 25 vs. Salt Lake) ... Has five game-opening homers with Albuquerque since 2025 ... Was his 10th game of 2026 with three-plus hits and sixth since May 27.

-Since May 22 (32 games), is leading the PCL in hits (51), total bases (103), doubles (15) & triples (5), second in SLG (.786), third in OPS (1.207), tied for third in homers (9) and sixth in RBI (28).

-Has 85 hard hit balls—7th-most in PCL—with an average exit velocity of 90.1 MPH, T-12th-highest in PCL (min. 175 at-bats).

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 3-for-4 Sunday with five RBI and two homers, his third multi-homer game of the season (also: March 28 at Oklahoma City, June 12 at Tacoma).

-In the month of June, paces all PCL hitters in homers (nine) and RBI (30), tied for first in triples (4) and second in total bases (63) and OPS (1.233).

-Over his last 17 games, is slashing .375/.487/.938 with one double, four triples, nine homers, 10 walks and 27 RBI.

-Twenty-six of his 36 XBH in 2026 have come in his last 33 games (May 19) ... Since that date, has the most home runs (13) and second-most triples (four), RBI (38) and total bases (97) in PCL.

-Has 88 hard hit balls in 2026—5th-most in PCL—with an average EV of 90.4 MPH, T-8th-highest in PCL (min. 175 AB).

PCL POTW: Charlie Condon was named the PCL Player of the week yesterday ... Went 10-for-24 with a double, two triples, three homers and nine RBI ... Led the PCL in hits, total bases (24), tied for first in runs scored (eight) and triples and second in RBI and homers.

-Is his first weekly award of his pro career and third for the Isotopes in 2026 (others: Cole Carrigg, April 28-May 3, and Eiberson Castellano (June 2-7)

THOMPSON: Sterlin Thompson went 0-for-2 with three walks Sunday, extending his on-base streak to 27 contests, fifth-longest active streak in Triple-A ... During streak, is slashing .370/.532/.533 with three doubles, four homers, 27 RBI and 27 walks.

PCL LEADERS: **Vimael Machin:** 10th, RBI (47); 12th, TB (120); 13th, hits (75) ... **Drew Avans** is 7th, SB (16) & 11th, BB (42).

-Charlie Condon is 2nd, runs (66); T-3rd, 3B (5), HR (17) & XBH (36); 4th, TB (149) & OPS (.975); T-4th, BB (49); 5th, RBI (55); 6th, SLG (.564) & 8th, OBP (.411).

-Zac Veen is T-1st, 2B (22); 2nd, OPS (1.005), SLG (.593), XBH (40) & TB (160); 3rd, hits (89); T-3rd, 3B (5); 6th, RBI (54) & AVG (.330); T-6th, HR (13); 7th, OBP (.412); T-7th, runs (56); T-9th, SB (14).

ON THE MEND: In his fourth rehab game with the Isotopes Sunday, Brenton Doyle went 1-for-4 with a walk. Over his first four rehab contests, is 4-for-16 with a double, an RBI, two walks and three punchouts.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE: Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
