History vs. Quad Cities

The Lugnuts are 79-88 all-time vs. the River Bandits, 41-37 at home and 38-51 in Davenport.

The Nuts have played at Quad Cities for four straight seasons, 2023-2026, but the River Bandits have traveled to Michigan's state capital only once in the last five years: 2023, when the Lugnuts won four of six.

It's the fourth of 11 Copa de la Diversión games for the Lansing Locos, an identity dating back to 2019 and chosen to reflect the fans' rallying cry of "Let's Go Nuts!" with ¡Vamos Locos! The Loco logo features the potoo bird, or "ghost bird," an amazing animal: the potoo stays still with its eyes half-closed for hours during daytime, camouflaged to appear like part of a tree stump, then goes hunting at night for insects.

Last Game, Sunday: Lugnuts 8, Cubs 3. Making his 2026 Midwest League debut, Nathan Dettmer brought a no-hitter into the 7th inning, settling for 6 1/3 innings of one-hit, seven-strikeout, shutout ball to help the Nuts win the finale at South Bend.

LUG-NOTES

Milestone Watch: Lansing is three wins from the 2,000th victory in Nuts history and three players away from 1,000 players all-time.

Moving On Up: Bobby Boser and Davis Diaz were each promoted to Double-A Midland yesterday, making their debut this morning as the RockHounds' No. 7 and No. 8 hitters... and they hit back-to-back home runs in a 9-7 victory! Boser and Diaz are the first two Lugnuts position players to be promoted to this season.

Welcome to Lansing: 21-year-old Myles Naylor joins the Lugnuts from Single-A Stockton and makes his Midwest League debut as the Nuts' left fielder. The 39th overall selection in the 2023 draft, Naylor was batting .375/.464/.708 in six games this month, with three doubles, one triple and one home run. Overall, Naylor was hitting .274/.373/.476 with four doubles, two triples, three homers and three stolen bases in 22 games for the Ports.

Bolting to the Show: 2024 Lugnuts outfielder Henry Bolte put together a remarkable 12-for-12 streak from May 7-9 for Triple-A Las Vegas en route to a Major League callup to the Athletics. The streak was part of a ridiculous hot stretch for Bolte: 25-for-42, five doubles, one triple, five homers, .595/.622/1.119 in the month of May. Should the 22-year-old Bolte make his debut tonight for the A's against the Cardinals, he will become the 203rd all-time Lugnut to reach the Major Leagues and the third this season.

Prospecting: The Nuts' roster boasts five players on MLB Pipeline's Top 30 rankings of Athletics prospects: No. 8 (Devin Taylor), No. 16 (Steven Echavarria), No. 19 (Zane Taylor), No. 26 (Nate Nankil) and No. 30 (Bobby Boser).

That's Quality: The Lugnuts have tossed four quality starts this season, and they've come in bunches on the road. The first two were recorded by Jackson Finley and Steven Echavarria from April 21-22 at Quad Cities, and the most recent two came from Tzu-Chen Sha and Nathan Dettmer on May 9-10 at South Bend.

Triple Time: The Nuts came into Saturday's game at South Bend with one triple in 31 games... and then Rodney Green, Jr. and Casey Yamauchi each tripled on Saturday, followed by a Justin Riemer two-run triple on Sunday. Not to be outdone, the Cubs tripled four times in the series.

Pitcher's Best Friend: Lansing turned nine double plays in the series at South Bend, increasing the club's league-leading total to 42. Contrast that with West Division-leading Wisconsin, which has turned only 15 double plays this season. On the other hand, no Midwest League team has grounded into as many double plays as the Lugnuts (34).

Cooperstown Bound: An original 1996 Lugnut as a member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, Carlos Beltrán went to be voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, was named a nine-time All-Star, and won three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and the 2017 World Series during a 20-year MLB career. On July 27, Beltrán will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown.

2009: The Lugnuts started right-hander Ryan Koch (pronounced "Cook") against South Bend right-hander Ryan Cook (pronounced "Cook"). Johermyn Chavez and Brian Van Kirk hit back-to-back solo home runs in the 7th, but those were the only runs allowed by Cook in a 6-2 Silver Hawks win at The Cove.

2012: Kevin Pillar, batting sixth in the order, tied both the Midwest League and the Lugnuts franchise records, going 6-for-6 with a ninth-inning grand slam and six RBIs in a 16-4 rout at Fifth Third Field against the Dayton Dragons. Noah Syndergaard picked up the win in relief, striking out seven Dragons in four innings.

MLB Pipeline's No. 16 A's prospect / No. 7 pitcher (behind Jamie Arnold, Gage Jump, Wei-En Lin, Braden Nett, Kade Morris, Shotaro Mori); grades: Fastball 55, Curve 45, Slider 55, Changeup 45, Control 45, Overall 40... topped the 2025 Lugnuts in starts (25)... closed out the A's 2026 Spring Breakout win, tossing the final two innings vs. Brewers prospects.

2026 Campaign: 2026 Lugnuts Opening Day starter, gave up 2 R in 1st inning vs. Dayton, April 2, but that was all; finished with 4 2/3 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 4 K on 74 pitches, 52 strikes... tossed quality start against Quad Cities, April 22: 6 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 1 HR, 1 BB, 3 K on 80 pitches, 50 strikes... limiting left-handers to .217 avg., but 10 BB/10 K... right-handers are hitting .246 with 1 HR, but only 5 BB/14 K... allowing .308 avg in 1st inning, .150 in 2nd, .091 in 3rd, .391 in 4th.

Gatorade, Not Gator: Echavarría posted a 0.28 ERA with 80 strikeouts in 50 innings as a senior at Millburn High School, allowing only one extra-base hit the whole season. He was named New Jersey's 2022-2023 Gatorade High School Baseball Player of the Year and the top prep prospect in the state. Initially committed to Oregon, he changed his commitment to the University of Florida as his senior year dawned, but then signed with the A's for \$3 million to head into professional baseball – the only New Jersey high schooler taken in the 2023 MLB Draft.

Pro Ball: After signing, Echavarría debuted in instructional league ball in 2023. He was slated to pitch in the 2024 Spring Breakout for the A's against the Giants, but the game was canceled due to rain. On May 2, 2024, Game 22 of the Stockton Ports' season, he made his official professional debut, starting against Visalia and working three scoreless innings before allowing two unearned run in the fourth... posted 9.00 ERA in six May starts (20 R/18 ER in 18 IP)... limited opposition to one run or fewer in nine of his final 13 starts of the year, including stretch from June 25-August 4 with just 2 ER allowed in 25 2/3 IP... vs. right-handers: .306/.386/.387, 1 HR, 5 GiDP... vs. left-handers: .316/.431/.474, 3 HR, 1 GiDP... best inning was the fourth inning: 3-for-26, .115 avg. against... base-stealers were successful in 11 of 13 attempts.
