## Lake County Captains (39-36) at Dayton Dragons (41-33)

RH Daniel Espino (0-2, 6.00) vs. LH Jacques Pucheu (3-1, 4.20)

**Today's Game:** The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lake County Captains (affiliate of the Cleveland Indians) in the fourth game of a six-game series.

**2021 Season Series:** Lake County 5, Dayton 4. **Current Series:** Dayton 2, Lake County 1.

**Last Game:** Thursday: Dayton 4, Lake County 1. JC Keys fired five scoreless innings as a fill-in starting pitcher after the trade of Noah Davis and James Free had two doubles for the second consecutive night. The Dragons scored in the second, third, and fourth innings to build an early 4-0 lead and limited Lake County to just five hits. The Captains only run came in the eighth. Ricky Karcher struck out the side in order in the ninth for the save.

**Season Highs from Last Game:** Most Doubles and Most Extra Base Hits, Game (Individual): Free, 2 (matched team season high in both categories).

**Current Series:** The Dragons are 2-1 in the current series with Lake County. Dayton is batting .297 in the series and averaging 4.3 runs per game. The team ERA in the series is 3.67. The Dragons have committed five errors in the three games.

**Trade:** The Dragons saw starting pitcher Noah Davis depart on Wednesday after he was traded by the Cincinnati Reds to the Colorado Rockies organization and assigned to the Spokane Indians. Davis and another minor league pitcher, Case Williams, went to the Rockies organization in exchange for major league relief pitcher Mychal Givens. Davis is the first Dayton player to be traded during the season since the Reds sent pitcher Franderlyn Romero to the Orioles on May 24, 2016. The last players acquired in trades during the season and assigned to the Dragons were Aneurys Zabala, from the Dodgers, on July 4, 2018 and Lorenzo Cedrola, from Boston, two days earlier on July 2, 2018.

**High-A Central League Playoffs:** Major League Baseball has announced that leagues at three classifications, including the High-A Central League, will conduct playoffs in September. The top two teams in each league, regardless of division, will meet in a best-of-five series.

**Playoff Race:** The Dragons currently trail Cedar Rapids by one-half game in the race for the #2 seed in the 2021 post-season.

**The Mythical First Half Division Title:** The Dragons were the winners of the "Mythical First Half" East Division title as the midpoint of the season concluded with games on Sunday. Note that the league is not utilizing a split-season format in 2021. There is no First Half or Second Half, and no First Half championship race in 2021 in the High-A Central League. The Midwest League was split into two equal halves for every season from 1988-2019, and from 1956-1981. The league did not play a split season from 1982-87.

### Player Notes

- Francisco Urbaez has an active 35-game on-base streak. Urbaez ranks second in the league in both on-base percentage at .435 and batting average at .341. Urbaez is fifth in the league in OPS at .913. Urbaez is batting .364 over his last 48 games since May 29 to rank third in all of full-season Professional Baseball (150 teams; MLB and MiLB) over that time period.
- Victor Ruiz is batting .313 with 11 doubles over his last 26 games to raise his average from .213 to .268.
- Miguel Hernandez is batting .373 with 13 RBI over his last 16 games to raise his average from .241 to .275.
- Jacob Hurtubise is batting .350 over his last 13 games.
- Alex McGarry is batting .321 over his last nine games.
- Quin Cotton is batting .400 over his last six games.
- Juan Martinez has a six-game hitting streak, batting .373 over the six games.
- Ricky Karcher has earned a save in each of his last three appearances, working 3.1 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 7 SO.

### Team Notes

- Dayton is in first place, one-half game ahead of Great Lakes in the High-A Central League East Division.
- Dayton has held at least a share of first place after 55 of the 74 games they have played this season. They have not been lower than second place in the standings at the end of a night and have not been more than one and one-half games out of first at any time this season.
- The Dragons are 24-10 in games decided by two runs or less, the best mark in the league.
- The Dragons are 10-1 in one-run games at home. They are 15-2 when scoring first at home.
- BATTING:** The Dragons current team batting average of .250 would surpass their full-season average in each of the last four years. They last topped that mark when they batted .251 in 2015.
- PITCHING:** The Dragons have allowed three runs or less in six of their last 11 games and four runs or less in eight of the last 11...Dragons pitchers are averaging 4.69 walks per game in 2021. The club record for most walks allowed per game over a season is 4.32 in 2005, when the team issued 600 walks in 139 games.
- July:** The Dragons are batting .263 in the month of July to rank third in the league, but they rank 10th in runs per game at 4.20. They are tied for second in the league in runners left on base in July with 192. They have hit only seven home runs in July to rank 12th in the league (the #11 team has 17). Francisco Urbaez leads the team in batting in July at .378 with a 1.021 OPS...Miguel Hernandez is hitting .293 in July...Quin Cotton is hitting .291...Victor Ruiz is hitting .290...The team batting average over the last seven days is .276, which ranks third in the league.
- The team ERA in July is 5.16, 12th (last) in the league...The team ERA over the last seven days is 3.91, which ranks sixth in the league.
- The Dragons roster is headlined by outfielder Michael Siani. Siani is listed by Baseball America as the "Best Athlete" and "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization. He is ranked as the Reds 10th best prospect overall. Other Dragons players ranked by Baseball America are RHP Lyon Richardson (#13) and OF Jacob Hurtubise (#41).

Notes: Named pronounced in accordance with French-Canadian ancestry (first name like JOCK; last name PEE-Shoe)...Went undrafted in 2019 after a record-setting career at Austin Peay State University before briefly joining the Evansville Otters of the independent Frontier League...Reds purchased Pucheu's contract from Evansville on June 22, 2019...After one year in junior college, Pucheu spent his remaining three years of college baseball at Austin Peay in the Ohio Valley Conference. His best year came as a senior in 2019 when he went 8-4 with a 3.07 ERA to earn 1st Team All-OVC...Pucheu was initially sent to the Arizona League Reds in Goodyear, where he made 11 appearances including three starts, producing an ERA of 4.08. He was promoted to Greeneville in mid-August and made four appearances with the G-Reds including two starts, allowing just three runs in 18 innings for an ERA of 1.50. His best outing came August 23 when he fired seven shutout innings, allowing just four hits and one walk with nine strikeouts.

**Pucheu in 2021:** Had been utilized exclusively as a reliever prior to start on June 23 (in rotation slot vacated by Graham Ashcraft with his promotion to Chattanooga on June 22)...Allowed one run in four innings in first start in Dragons win at West Michigan...Over first three starts, allowed just three runs (two earned) over 14.1 innings...Allowed four runs in 2.2 innings in fourth start...Opened season with five consecutive scoreless outings covering 9.2 innings, allowing just three hits while striking out 11...Finished month of May with an ERA of 0.69 in 13 innings...Posted 8.16 ERA in June...July ERA is 3.57...Last two starts combined totals nine innings, just three hits allowed and two runs.

Longest outing: 6 innings (July 6) High pitch total in an outing: 78 (July 18)

**Last Start:** Struck out a season-high nine batters over five strong innings at Fort Wayne last Saturday in Dragons 4-3 win...Left the game with the score tied 1-1...Allowed just one run on two hits and one walk.

**Against this Opponent:** Made two relief appearances at Lake County in first week of June...Combined to pitch 2.1 innings while allowing seven hits and seven runs.

## Dragons Manager/Coaches:

**Jose Moreno** is in his first season as Dragons manager and his second year in the Reds organization. The 2021 season is Moreno's 22nd year as a coach, instructor, or coordinator in professional baseball. As a manager, he has won three league championships with affiliated clubs, guiding his teams to titles in 2002, 2007, and 2010. Moreno also led his teams to back-to-back championships in the Venezuelan Winter League in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Moreno was a catcher in Cleveland Indians and Baltimore Orioles farm systems.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** joins the Dragons in 2021 as pitching coach. Garman was slated to serve as the Dayton pitching coach in 2020 before the season was canceled. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for the previous two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2021 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18. He is in his sixth year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Goodyear Reds in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. He was slated to return to Chattanooga in 2020 before the season was canceled. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

**Darren Bragg** returns to the Dragons in his 15th year as a coach or instructor in the Reds organization. He will serve in a newly named position within the Reds organization, carrying the title of development coach. Bragg was the Dragons hitting coach for two seasons in 2007-08, helping the club to the playoffs in both years as he worked with future Reds Todd Frazier, Zack Cozart, Chris Heisey, Drew Stubbs, Juan Francisco, and others in Dayton. Bragg served as the Reds minor league outfield coordinator from 2009-18 before returning to a coaching assignment with an individual team. He was the bench coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2019 and was slated to fill the same role with Daytona in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled. Bragg spent 11 years as a player in Major League Baseball from 1994-2004, appearing in 916 big league games with nine teams
