YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Harrisburg Senators, 19-0. The Flying Squirrels tied the franchise record for runs allowed in a game. They also allowed 19 in losses on April 17, 2012 vs. Reading (L, 19-6) and May 22, 2022 at Altoona (L, 19-8). It was the most lopsided loss in franchise history, surpassing 14-run losses on April 13, 2013 at Trenton (15-1) and August 10, 2024 vs. Hartford (15-1). It was also the most lopsided shutout loss in franchise history, surpassing a 13-0 loss on July 13, 2013 at Bowie, and it was the largest deficit in a shutout in the digitized era (since 2005) in the Eastern League. It was tied for the fifth-largest margin of defeat in the Eastern League in the last 20 years. The 12 walks issued by Richmond pitching were one shy of the franchise record and the most in a nine-inning game since a 12-walk outing on August 28, 2017 vs. Altoona.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game road series against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. The two teams played in Harrisburg's first home series at FNB Field from April 9-13, with Richmond taking two-of-six in the series.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,894 fans per home game, which ranks second among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7.290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS split last week's series against the Patriots, winning three straight games from Thursday through Sunday for their longest win streak of the season. Their 8-20 start is the worst in franchise history. The 2015 Flying Squirrels started 3-2 before losing a franchise-record 15 consecutive games, falling to 3-17. They snapped the losing slide with a six-game win streak and finished the year 72-68, one game out of a postseason spot.

THE SENATORS have won six-of-their-last-eight games, including taking four-of-six last week at Reading. Harrisburg lost four straight games to open the season but have gone 14-10 since. The Senators lead the Eastern League in hits (230) and total bases (382) and rank second in homers (28). The Harrisburg pitching staff is tied for the league lead in saves (10). Harrisburg's roster includes three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including RHP Jarlin Susana (No. 3), 3B Cayden Wallace (No. 9) and 18/3B Yohandy Morales (No. 22). Harrisburg's roster also featured three players included in MLB. com's top-30 Nationals prospects list, including Susana (No. 2), Wallace (No. 10) and Morales (No. 12).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Jack Choate makes his sixth start of the season and the third of his career against the Senators. In his last start, he threw five scoreless innings and allowed one hit last Thursday against the Patriots. In his last three starts since April 19, Choate is 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (1 ER/12.2 IP). He pitched at Harrisburg on April 13 and allowed five runs over three innings in a no-decision. He also pitched in Harrisburg on August 17, 2024 and was hit with a loss after allowing three runs (two earned) over 4.2 innings. Last year, Choate spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. He entered 2025 ranked by Baseball America as the No. 28 Giants prospect and No. 27 by MLB.com. For more on Choate, see page two.

FOR HARRISBURG: Left-hander Dustin Saenz makes his seventh appearance of the year and the fifth of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Thursday at Reading and allowed five runs over 5.1 innings. He has allowed five-ormore runs in four-of-five starts this year, with the lone exception being his start on April 11 against the Flying Squirrels, when he allowed one run over six innings for a win. For his career against Richmond, Saenz is 1-1 with a 3.95 ERA (6 ER/13.2 IP). Dating back to 2023, he has gone 7-13 with a 5.89 ERA in 29 games (28 starts) for the Senators. Saenz was selected by the Nationals in the fourth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Texas A&M.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey** and **Zach Morgan** have combined to throw out 17 stolen base attempts this season, which is first among all 30 Double-A teams. Sugastey is tied for first in Double-A with 10 runners caught stealing, which is also tied for first the EL. Morgan is fourth in the EL with seven.

THE BRYCE IS RIGHT: Northern Virginia native **Bryce Eldridge** returned to the Richmond roster last Tuesday after missing the start of the season with an injury. He hit a solo home run in his first plate appearance of the year. The 20-year-old first baseman played at four levels in the Giants organization in his first full professional season last year, including nine games with Richmond in September. For the year in 116 games, Eldridge hit .291 with 23 homers and 92 RBIs. He is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 11 prospect in baseball. Eldridge is also the fifth Virginia-born player to suit up for the Flying Squirrels in franchise history. On Thursday, he tied his Double-A high with three hits. After batting .111 (1-for-9) in his first three games of the season, Eldridge is batting .333 (11-for-33) in his last eight games.

HOWELL AT THE MOON: Carter Howell opened the season batting .189 (14-for-74) in his first 20 games through April 26. In his last seven games dating back to last Tuesday, Howell is batting .367 (11-for-30) with three homers, two doubles, five RBIs, three walks and six runs scored. After hitting three homers in his first 136 Double-A games, he homered three times over a five-game span from last Wednesday through Sunday. On Monday, he was named Eastern League Player of the Week for the first time. Last year, Howell was named Richmond's Player of the Year and led the Eastern League in doubles (30) and triples (7) and leading the Flying Squirrels in batting average (.272), OBP (.347), SLG (.391), OPS (.738), hits (121), runs (64) and stolen bases (15).

GO, DIEGO, GO: Diego Velasquez had his league-leading 13-game hitting streak snapped on Sunday afternoon. In those 13 games from April 18-May 2, Velasquez hit .392 (20-for-51) with a homer, four doubles, eight RBIs and eight runs scored. In his 68 games with Richmond dating back to last year, Velasquez is batting .308 (76-for-247). His 13-game hit streak was the longest since a 13-game streak by **Shane Matheny** in 2022.

CLOSING THE DOOR: On Thursday, Tyler Myrick closed the 14th save of his Flying Squirrels career, tying ninth place on the franchise's all-time list with Brett Bochy (2012) and Melvin Adon (2019, 2022). In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Myrick has converted 82.4 percent of his save attempts, which is tied for fifth-highest in franchise history (min. 15 attempts). In 2023 between Richmond and High-A Eugene, Myrick went 15-for-15 in save attempts, the only pitcher in MiLB with a perfect mark and at least 12 tries.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is fourth in hits (30), Jairo Pomares is tied for fifth in homers (5). John Michael Bertrand is tied for first in games started (6) and tied for 10th in innings pitched (26.0). Jack Choate is tied for ninth in strikeouts (30).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 212 wins in his career, which is four away from tying the franchise's all-time wins record for a manager. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

AWARDS SWEEP: On Monday, **Carter Howell** was named Eastern League Player of the Week after homered three times against Somerset and **Joe Whitman** was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week after throwing six perfect innings on Saturday with 10 strikeouts. It marked the fifth time in franchise history the team has swept the league's weekly awards, joining **Daniel Mayora** and **Justin Fitzgerald** (July 9-16, 2012), **Steven Duggar** and **Andrew Suarez** (July 18-24, 2016), **Brett Auerbach** and **Wil Jensen** (August 1-7, 2022) and **Grant McCray** and **John Michael Bertrand** (May 20-26, 2024).

SO LONG, MANN: Devin Mann was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on Monday. He signed with the Giants last week and played five games for the Flying Squirrels, batting .286 (6-for-21) with two doubles, two homers and five RBIs. Mann was originally drafted by the Dodgers in 2018 and spent last year with the Royals organization in Triple-A.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes seven players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bryce Eldridge (No. 1), Joe Whitman (No. 10), Diego Velasquez (No. 13), Sabin Ceballos (No. 16), Trent Harris (No. 26), Aeverson Arteaga (No. 27) and Jack Choate (No. 28). There are also seven players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Eldridge, (No. 1), Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Cebasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27). Eldridge is also ranked No. 11 overall by Baseball America and No. 22 by MLB.com.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1960: The Richmond Virginians beat the Rochester Red Wings, 4-0, at Parker Field. Bill Stafford, a 20-year-old right-hander, threw a seven-hit shutout with nine strikeouts and no walks. 1987: A baseball game at The Diamond opened the Legends Fest of Sports, a charity fundraising event that also included golf and tennis events. The baseball game featured a Legends team facing Virginia all-stars. The Legends won, 7-0. Pitchers Bob Gibson, Warren Spahn, Gaylord Perry and Wade Blasingame struck out eight in the six-inning game. Chuck Boone had two of the Virginia team's five hits. Lou Brock, Curt Flood and Ernie Banks combined for seven hits and drove in three runs. The Legends lineup also included Ron Santo, Hank Aaron, Joe Torre, Bill Skowron and Brooks Robinson. Willie Mays, Dick Allen, Jerry Koosman and others were also at the event. Earl Weaver managed the team. The Virginia team included Lew Burdette, Eddie Mathews, Gene Alley and others. 1988: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 5-4, at The Diamond. David Justice had four hits in the game. John Smoltz started and entered the ninth with a 5-1 lead and struck out the first two batters before allowing three runs. Jose Alvarez entered and recorded a three-pitch strikeout to end the game. 1993: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 7-6, at The Diamond. Down, 6-2, entering the bottom of the ninth, the R-Braves scored five runs to win the game. Four of the first five batters in the inning walked, including one with the bases loaded. Javy Lopez hit an RBI single and Jerry Willard hit a two-run double to tie the score. Ron Jones won the game with a walk-off single. 2011: The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 5-0. Eric Surkamp re-corded double-figure strikeouts for the third straight start, a franchise re-cord that still stands today. It was the fourth 10-strikeout start of the year. Surkamp finished the season with eight outings with 10-or-more strike-outs. No one else in franchise history has more
