**Tonight** the Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the Athletics, and Great Lakes Loons, High-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, play the opener of a six-game series. Consider that 81 games remain in the 2026 season, and the Nuts and Loons will be playing one another in 24 of those games: 30% of the remaining schedule. Time to get acquainted!

**Last Game, Sunday: Lugnuts 10, Whitecaps 1.** The Nuts completed a four-of-six series victory over the same West Michigan team that beat them in six straight games in April, completing their first series win against the Whitecaps since May 2022 with an overwhelming Sunday rout. Pedro Pineda and Carlos Franco homered in the win.

**On the Air:** Catch Jesse Goldberg-Strassler and Adam Jaksa on [milb.streamguys1.com/lansing](http://milb.streamguys1.com/lansing), while John Vicari and Brad Tunney call the action on MiLB TV.

**On Deck:** The Lugnuts and Loons play one another at 7:05 p.m. each of the next four nights before wrapping up the series with a Sunday matinee. The Nuts then return to Michigan's state capital for a six-game homestand against the Cedar Rapids Kernels.

### LUG-NOTES

**Prospecting:** The Nuts' roster has four players on MLB Pipeline's Top 30 rankings of Athletics prospects: No. 8 (**Devin Taylor**), No. 16 (**Steven Echavarria**), No. 19 (**Zane Taylor**) and No. 24 (**Nate Nankil**). Baseball America's recent re-ranking of A's prospects puts Devin Taylor at No. 10, Echavarria at No. 16, Zane Taylor at No. 18 and **Nathan Dettmer** at No. 21.

**Ace Day:** Today's scheduled starting pitchers including No. 16 prospect Echavarria for Lansing, the A's No. 2 prospect **Jamie Arnold** for Double-A Midland, and 2025 Lugnuts Opening Day starter **Gage Jump** in his second career MLB start for the Athletics; last Tuesday, Jump fanned five Mariners in his MLB debut while allowing four runs on nine hits in five innings, becoming the 204th all-time Lugnut to reach the Majors and the fourth this season (**Daniel Susac** with the Giants, **Eduardo Rivera** with the Red Sox, and **Henry Bolte** with the A's).

**Milestones:** This season, the Lugnuts' 30th season in Lansing, the Nuts have played their 4,000th game, won their 2,000th game, and had their 1,000th player suit up.

**Two for the Price of One:** The Lugnuts have turned 64 double plays (in 51 games), which leads Minor League Baseball (2nd - OKC Comets, 59 in 56 games, and El Paso Chihuahuas, 59 in 57 games) and Major League Baseball (1st - SF Giants, 60 in 60 games).

**Starting Strong:** Lansing's sextet of starters in this series combined to toss 36 2/3 innings against West Michigan, averaging six innings per start: **Steven Echavarria** worked 5 1/3 innings on Tuesday; **Samuel Dutton** fired seven shutout innings on Wednesday; **Zane Taylor** allowed one run in 6 2/3 innings on Thursday; and **Ryan Magdic** gave up two runs in 5 2/3 innings on Friday; and **Tzu-Chen Sha** worked six innings-plus Saturday; and **Nathan Dettmer** finished things off with one run in six innings on Sunday.

**Walk It Off:** Saturday night's **Dylan Fien** two-out, two-run homer in the bottom of the ninth marked the Nuts' first game-winning home run since **Cameron Masterman** on May 14, 2024, vs. Lake County. It was also the Nuts' third walk-off win of the year: a bases-loaded HBP of **Dylan Fien** on April 30 vs Dayton, and an RBI fielder's choice for **Ali Camarillo** on May 26 vs. West Michigan.

**May Standouts:** Entering the first game in June, let's take stock of the Lugnuts' standouts last month. Starter **Samuel Dutton** posted a 1.14 ERA in four starts, giving up four runs (three earned) in 23 2/3 innings, while second baseman **Casey Yamauchi** slashed .348/.435/.446, reaching base 47 times (32 hits, 11 walks, 4 HBPs) in 24 games.

**Patience is a Virtue:** No player in Minor League Baseball has seen more pitches outside the zone than **Devin Taylor** (450 in 227 PAs, an average of 1.98 balls per plate appearance). Taylor has received 998 pitches overall in 227 PAs, leading the MWL by 88 pitches: 4.396 per plate appearance. Taylor has played in all 51 games this year for Lansing.

**Green Power:** On May 12, **Rodney Green, Jr.** launched a 490-foot home run into the second floor of the Outfield Lofts apartments, the longest tracked home run of the 2026 season, Major League or Minor League.

### JUNE 2 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2010:** Mike Trout went 4-for-5 and threw out A.J. Jimenez at home, but the Lugnuts still beat Trout and the Cedar Rapids Kernels, 8-6, at Cooley Law School Stadium.

**2012:** A rare poor appearance for Noah Syndergaard, who gave up six runs in 2/3 of an inning, part of a seven-run 5th for the South Bend Silver Hawks at Stanley Coveleski Regional Stadium in an 11-1 South Bend win.

**2024:** In the shortest seven-inning game in franchise history, the Nuts defeated the Peoria Chiefs 5-1 in one hour and 23 minutes. A 5-3 victory in Game 2 behind a debuting Chen Zhong-Ao Zhuang (4 IP, 5 K) concluded a sweep in three hours and ten minutes.

2026 Campaign: 2026 Lugnuts Opening Day starter... tossed quality start against Quad Cities, April 22: 6 IP, 4 H, 3 R, 1 HR, 1 BB, 3 K on 80 pitches... quality start in rematch vs. QC, May 12: 6 2/3 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 5 K on 90 pitches... lefties are hitting .230, righties hitting .221, though lefties have drawn 15 of 23 walks... allowing .297 avg in 1st inning, .103 in 2nd, .091 in 3rd, .394 in 4th, .133 in 5th... with no outs, allowing a .317 avg., but drops to .196 w/ one out, .130 w/ two outs.

Gatorade, Not Gator: Echavarria posted a 0.28 ERA with 80 strikeouts in 50 innings as a senior at Millburn High School, allowing only one extra-base hit the whole season. He was named New Jersey's 2022-2023 Gatorade High School Baseball Player of the Year and the top prep prospect in the state. Initially committed to Oregon, he changed his commitment to the University of Florida as his senior year dawned, but then signed with the A's for \$3 million to head into professional baseball – the only New Jersey high schooler taken in the 2023 MLB Draft.

Pro Ball: After signing, Echavarria debuted in instructional league ball in 2023. He was slated to pitch in the 2024 Spring Breakout for the A's against the Giants, but the game was canceled due to rain. On May 2, 2024, Game 22 of the Stockton Ports' season, he made his official professional debut, starting against Visalia and working three scoreless innings before allowing two unearned run in the fourth... posted 9.00 ERA in six May starts (20 R/18 ER in 18 IP)... limited opposition to one run or fewer in nine of his final 13 starts of the year, including stretch from June 25-August 4 with just 2 ER allowed in 25 2/3 IP... vs. right-handers: .306/.386/.387, 1 HR, 5 GiDP... vs. left-handers: .316/.431/.474, 3 HR, 1 GiDP... best inning was the fourth inning: 3-for-26, .115 avg. against... base-stealers were successful in 11 of 13 attempts.
