CAPTAINS LOG

LAST TIME OUT: Lake County scored 3 runs in the top of the 9th and held on for a 4-3 win over Dayton on Tuesday at Day Air Ballpark, winning Game 1 of the Midwest League East Division Championship Series.

PLAYOFF COZY: C Jacob Cozart, MLB Pipeline's No. 12 Cleveland prospect, delivered a go-ahead 2-run single in the top of the 9th to put Lake County up 4-2. Between the 2024 NCAA Tournament (with NC State) and Midwest League Playoffs, Cozart is batting a combined .406 (13-for-32) with 6 RBI.

RAPP GOD: LHP Shawn Rapp entered the 9th inning with the runners on the corners and no outs with a 4-3 lead. Rapp got a swinging strikeout, a successful play at the plate and another swinging strikeout for the save. Rapp has recorded a save in each of his last 4 appearances.

WRECK IT RALPH: LF Ralphy Velazquez, MLB Pipeline's No. 4 Cleveland and No. 74 overall prospect, launched a game-tying double in the top of the 9th. His 63 RBI in the regular and postseasons are tied for 6th in the Cleveland PD system.

IT'S GENAO OR NEVER: INF Angel Genao, MLB Pipeline's No. 5 Cleveland and No. 87 overall prospect, hit a solo homer in his first postseason at-bat. He has hit safely in 54 of his first 66 High-A games. His 148 hits across Lake County and Single-A Lynchburg rank tied for 2nd in MiLB and lead the Cleveland system. He is the only player in MiLB with a .330+ AVG, 50+ XBH, and 25+ SB this season. The lone MLB player with these numbers this year is KC's Bobby Witt Jr.

THE 30-40 CLUB: INF Alex Mooney, MLB Pipeline's No. 23 Cleveland prospect, stole his 40th base of the season on Tuesday, August 27 versus Cedar Rapids, joining current Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre OF Greg Allen (2015) as the only Captains in franchise history with 30+ extra-base hits and 40+ stolen bases in a season. Mooney is 1 of 16 Minor Leaguers and the only Midwest League player in 2024 with 35+ XBH and 40+ SB this season.

WINNING WAVES: By clinching a winning record this season, the Captains have now had a winning record in 14 of their first 21 seasons, including in each of their last 5 campaigns. By winning the Midwest League East First Half Division title, Lake County is making its 8th playoff appearance in franchise history (6 Midwest League, 2 South Atlantic League), with its 2010 Midwest League Championship being the team's sole league title in franchise history.

TRENDS & NOTABLES

A REGULAR SEASON TO REMEMBER: Lake County closed the season 77-53, owning the best winning percentage in the MWL for the 2nd time in the last 3 seasons. The Captains 77 wins are tied with the 2010 MWL Championship Team for the 2nd-most wins in a season in franchise history.

REGULAR SEASON VS. DAYTON: Lake County and Dayton split their regular season series 9-9, with the Captains going 6-3 at Classic Auto Group Park. On July 5, Lake County beat the Dragons 20-1, setting franchise single-game records for runs scored and largest margin of defeat.

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE: The 2024 Captains finished 2nd in franchise history in walks (588) and 3rd in on-base percentage (.342), both the highest since 2007.

NO SCORE ZONE: Lake County led the Midwest League with a 3.55 ERA, securing its 2nd league ERA title and 1st since leading the South Atlantic League in 2003. Former Captain and current Double-A Akron RHP Trenton Denholm won the MWL individual ERA crown with a 3.29 ERA, while RHP Carter Spivey finished 2nd with a 3.32 mark. Denholm is the 1st Captain to lead the MWL in ERA since the team joined the league in 2010.

TUGBOAT CRUISE: LHP Matt Wilkinson ranks 2nd in MiLB with 174 strikeouts, a 1.90 ERA, a .169 opposing AVG, and a 0.91 WHIP. Wilkinson nearly became the 1st Minor League pitcher to win both the MiLB ERA and strikeout titles since eventual 3-time MLB All-Star and 2-time World Series Champion Josh Beckett did so in 2001 across Class A-Advanced Brevard County and Double-A Portland.

THE ATLANTIC CAMPAIGN: Since 2021, 15 of Cleveland's draft picks have come from the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC), including 6 in the 2023 MLB Draft and 2 in the 2024 Draft. Of those 13 ACC draftees, 7 have been Captains this year (LHP Shawn Rapp, LHP Parker Messick, OF Angel Zarate, 1B/LF C.J. Kayfus, C Cooper Ingle, and INF Alex Mooney, C Jacob Cozart), with 6 total '23 draftees being current Top 30 Cleveland prospects by MLB Pipeline.

COMEBACK KIDS: Last Tuesday at Peoria, 1B Maick Collado's 2-run home run in the top of the 9th fueled a 4-3 comeback win. Lake County has 7 wins when trailing in the top of the 9th, most by a Captains team since at least 2005 and tied with Double-A Tulsa (LAD) for the 2nd-most in MiLB this season, trailing only Single-A Inland Empire (LAA).

ACE OF BASE: In Lake County's 3-1 win over Beloit on August 2, CF Jonah Advincula stole team bases No. 167 and No. 168 on the season, setting a new single-season franchise record in the team's 21-season history. The 2024 Captains surpassed the 2009 team that stole 166 bases. Lake County leads MiLB with an 86.8% stolen base percentage this season.

29 INF Angel Genao, MLB Pipeline's No. 5 Cleveland and No. 89 overall prospect, collected his 29th multi-hit game as a Captain on Sunday at Peoria. Since being promoted to Lake County on June 3, he has more than twice as many multi-hit games (29) than games without a hit (12).

19 The Captains are 19-14 in the Midwest League postseason since joining in 2010, the year they won the title. LC's 19 playoff wins in that span are the 3rd-most in the MWL.

LAST TIME OUT: In his final regular season start on September 6 at Peoria, Dylan DeLucia (ND) went 3.2 innings, allowing 1 run on a season-high 6 hits, striking out 5 and walking 1 on 72 pitches (46 strikes) in the 4-3 win (11 innings). After allowing an RBI single in the top of the 2nd, DeLucia retired 5 of his last 7 batters faced. From his debut on July 26 through the end of the regular season, DeLucia ranked 6th in the MWL in ERA (2.52) and 7th in strikeouts (39).

CAPTAIN OF THE WEEK: DeLucia was named Captain of the Week on August 26, presented by Official League, for his 2 strong starts at West Michigan. In his 2 starts against the Whitecaps, he pitched 9.2 shutout innings, allowing 4 hits and a walk while striking out 8. DeLucia was 1 of 5 Minor League pitchers to make 2 scoreless starts. In 3 starts from 8/13 to 8/25, DeLucia had an 0.61 ERA, a .122 opposing AVG, and 17 strikeouts.

RETURN FROM INJURY: After undergoing Tommy John surgery in June of 2023, Dylan DeLucia returned in 2024 making 2 starts for ACL Guardians and 3 for Single-A Lynchburg. With ACL Guardians, he made 2 scoreless starts and pitched 5 shutout innings, allowing 3 hits and striking out 3 in his first appearances since the 2022 College World Series at Ole Miss. From July 1 to July 21 with Lynchburg, he posted a 4.15 ERA (4 earned runs) while striking out 10 across 8.2 innings. In his 3 starts for the Hillcats, DeLucia threw 69% of his pitches for strikes.

OMAHA LEGEND: DeLucia spent his 3rd and final season of college baseball with Ole Miss in 2022, where he led the Rebels to their first College World Series title and won CWS MVP. In the CWS, he pitched went 2-0 with a 0.53 ERA (1 earned run), 17 strikeouts and no walks in 16.2 innings. On June 23 versus Arkansas - his last college start - he pitched a 9-inning, complete game shutout to send Ole Miss to the CWS Finals. DeLucia threw 100+ pitches in each of his last 4 starts in the Super Regionals and College World Series. There are 35 pitchers to win CWS Most Outstanding Player, including 2024 All-Star Game starting pitcher Paul Skenes (LSU, 2023), former Cleveland Guardian and Lake County Captain Adam Plutko (UCLA, 2013) current Oakland Athletics manager Mark Kotsay as a two-way (Cal State Fullerton, 1995), and Baseball Hall-of-Famer Dave Winfield as a two-way (Minnesota, 1973).

HOTTY TODDY: In 2022 at Ole Miss, DeLucia was named a 3rd Team All-American by Baseball America, starting 12 of 21 games in Oxford, MS. The Daytona Beach, FL native ranked 2nd in the SEC in innings pitched (95.1), 2nd in strikeouts looking (33), 4th in in strikeouts (105), and 12th in ERA (3.68). In the Coral Gables Regional on June 4, he fanned a career-high 12 batters in the 7-4 win against Arizona. College Major: Multi-Disciplinary Studies.

JUCO BANDIT: After spending the 2019 fall season at the College of Charleston, DeLucia pitched 2 seasons at Northwest Florida State College in Niceville, FL from 2020-21, where he was 1st Team All-Conference and 2nd Team All-State. In 23 career appearances and 18 starts, he was 15-2 with a 1.91 ERA, 163 strikeouts and 32 walks across 127 innings. In 2021, he led NJCAA Region 8 with 119 strikeouts and 9 wins. 2 notable NWF alumni are 11-year MLB pitcher and 2005 Lake County Captain Tony Sipp, and 11-year MLB outfielder and former Cleveland Indian Jason Michaels.

TRAVIS TRAVERSES THE WATERS: On Friday, July 19, the Cleveland Guardians announced that 2B Travis Bazzana would begin his Minor League career with the Lake County Captains. After being officially assigned to Lake County on Friday, July 26, he became the 716th Captain of all-time.

MAKING HISTORY: On Sunday, July 14, the Guardians selected Bazzana with the 1st overall pick in the 2024 MLB Draft. He is the first No. 1 overall pick in Cleveland franchise history, as well as the 1st second baseman and Australian-born player taken No. 1 overall in MLB Draft history.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: On Friday, August 16 versus the Great Lakes Loons, Bazzana tied a Captains single-game franchise record with 3 doubles, which were in each of his final 3 plate appearances. His last 2 doubles each drove in a run, as he was responsible for both of Lake County's runs in an eventual 5-2 defeat. Bazzana became the 14th Captain to achieve the feat, and the first since INF Alex Mooney did so on April 27 at West Michigan.

INSPIRING HIS COUNTRY: Bazzana is seeking to become the 36th Australian-born player in MLB history. There have been 3 MLB All-Stars born in Australia: 3-time All-Star closer Liam Hendriks, 2013 All-Star closer Grant Balfour, and 1999 All-Star catcher Dave Nilsson. "The premise of everything I want to achieve is I want to make Australia a powerhouse in baseball," Bazzana told MLB.com's Sonja Chen. "It's not going to come from me, but I want to start that trend."

KING OF CORVALLIS: Bazzana played 3 collegiate seasons at Oregon State. The left-handed hitter set many school records, including career marks for: hits (251), doubles (52), home runs (45), total bases (460), stolen bases (66), and walks (180). His 36 stolen bases in 2023 also set a single-season school record, and he helped lead the Beavers to a pair of NCAA Super Regionals appearances in 2022 and 2024. Bazzana was a 3-time 1st Team All-Pac-12 honoree, while being named an All-American by multiple organizations in each of his last 2 years at Oregon State. Additionally, he played for the Corvallis Knights of the West Coast League in 2021. Bazzana had a remarkable season, leading the league in: batting average (.429, then-single-season league record), hits (81), runs (46), triples (5, tied), slugging percentage (.593), OPS (1.064), and total bases (112) en route to WCL MVP honors and Corvallis's 5th straight league championship.

A SEASON TO REMEMBER: This year, Bazzana ranked top-10 in Division I in: walks (76, 2nd), on-base percentage (.568, 2nd), slugging percentage (.911, 2nd), runs (84, T-6th), home runs (28, T-7th), total bases (195, T-7th), and batting average (.407, 8th). His 84 runs, 28 home runs, and .911 slugging percentage, and 195 total bases were all Oregon State single-season school records, while his 70 walks tied a single-season school record. Bazzana was named the 2024 Pac-12 Player of the Year, while being recognized as a 1st Team All-American by the ABCA, Baseball America, the College Baseball Foundation, D1baseball.com, the NCBWA, and Perfect Game. He was also a Golden Spikes Award finalist (best amateur baseball player in U.S.) and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist (national college baseball player of the year).

BAZZANA TAKES THE CAPE: Bazzana dominated in his lone season in the Cape Cod Baseball League (CCBL) last year. He was named the 2023 Cape Cod Baseball League Pat Sorenti MVP after winning the league's batting title with a .375 average. Bazzana also tallied 51 hits, 33 runs, 6 doubles, 6 home runs, 31 RBI, 14 stolen bases, and a 1.037 OPS in 33 regular-season games.

A PLAYER BEYOND HIS YEARS: When he was 3, Bazzana was playing baseball against 6-year-olds. Then, 12 years later, he was already playing professionally in the Australian Baseball League at just 15 years old. "I was always competitive," Bazzana told ESPN's Jeff Passan. "That's the one thing that I think was the base for me to go far in whatever I was pursuing: a competitive nature to where I was going to find a way to be a little bit better than the next guy or the guy next to me or whoever I was competing with."

THE ATHLETIC AUSTRALIAN: During his time at Turrumurra High School in Australia, Bazzana represented Team Australia in the 2019 U18 Baseball World Cup. He recorded 6 hits and 4 RBI in 9 games. Bazzana also played cricket for his high school team, captaining his squad to its first state championship in school history. He also played basketball, soccer, and rugby for Turrumurra, while participating in track and field (100m dash, long jump, and high jump) as well.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

Chris Antonetti, Cleveland Guardians President of Baseball Operations: "We view him to be a dynamic player. He's a guy that makes really good swing decisions, controls the strike zone really well, rarely swings and misses, and can really impact the baseball. And we think he's got a chance to impact the game in a variety of ways.

But as impressive as he is as an athlete and as a player, he's just as impressive, or more impressive, as a person. He has been relentless, I think from the time he was 3 years old, to take advantage of every resource available to him to become the best baseball player he can possibly be. And I think it's a testament to his hard work and the support system that he's had around him to be able to get to this point."

Rob Cerfolio, Cleveland Guardians Director of Player Development: "We are incredibly excited to welcome Travis to the organization and for him to make his Minor League debut with the Captains. Travis's on-field successes over his college career speak for themselves, but we are even more impressed with the type of person he is and his dedication to maximizing his ability. We look forward to partnering with him on future growth both on and off the field."

MLB Pipeline: "Bazzana drew mild interest from big league teams as an Australian amateur before deciding to play collegiately in the United States and impressing Oregon State at an Arizona showcase. He was a Freshman All-American in 2022, then set a Beavers record with 36 steals and won the Cape Cod League MVP award and batting title (.375) as an encore. He took his performance to another level this spring, slashing .407/.568/.911, finishing second in NCAA Division I on in-base percentage, slugging and OPS (1.479) and breaking another school record with 28 homers. After overcoming long odds to win the Draft Lottery, the Guardians selected him with the No. 1 overall pick and signed him for \$8.95 million. Bazzana has no discernible weakness at the plate, where his lightning-fast and compact left-handed stroke allows him to barrel balls with ease. He makes excellent swing decisions, uses the entire field and consistently produces high-end exit velocities. While he's more hitter than slugger, he gets to most of his plus raw power, and it plays from left field to the right-field foul pole. Adding to his offense package, Bazzana possesses plus speed and looks to steal and take extra bases. His athleticism gives him range in the middle infield, where his quick hands are an asset, though his fringy to average arm strength limits him to second base. With Gold Glove Andrés Giménez manning the keystone in Cleveland, it's possible that Bazzana's quickest route to the Majors could be as a center fielder."

Baseball America: "Bazzana has put on a hitting clinic in three years at Oregon State. The Australia native played in the college summer West Coast League as an 18-year-old in 2021 and excelled, setting the stage for a strong freshman season in 2022. Bazzana hit over .300 in each college season and improved year over year, culminating in a 2024 campaign in which he battled Georgia's Charlie Condon for the best overall offensive season in the country. A 6-foot, 199-pound lefthanded hitter and second baseman, Bazzana's offensive profile is built around his elite bat-to-ball skills. He has an unusual-looking swing with a deep bat tip behind his shoulder and a sizable leg kick, but he has always found the barrel at a high clip and produced an 84% contact rate in his three seasons with the Beavers. He pairs that skill with a savvy approach at the plate and strong swing decisions, helping him walk more than he struck out in his career. In 2024, his excellent 25.8% walk rate ranked second only to Nick Kurtz for the best among Division I hitters. Bazzana added more home run power in his draft season as well, going from 11 home runs in 2023 to 28 in 2024, with a corresponding increase in his exit velocity data. Bazzana's swing seems optimized to maximize the power he does have, and while he's nearly maxed-out physically, he might be the sort of player who always makes the most of his natural raw power. Bazzana is a plus runner and strong athlete who should be able to play second base, though he frequently throws with an odd sidearm slot that some scouts question. He could be athletic enough to play center field as well. Bazzana has all-star upside and is the best prospect from Oregon State since Adley Rutschman in 2019."

Oregon State Head Coach Mitch Canham (via The Oregonian/OregonLive's Joe Freeman): "He wants everything. Scouting reports, data, video. He doesn't get locked up mentally by all the analytics. He wants them all."

Trent Oeltjen, former Australian MLB outfielder and current mentor to Bazzana (via ESPN's Jeff Passan): "He understands that he's doing this for the whole country. And he knows all the kids are now looking up to him and want to be in Travis Bazzana's shoes. He remembers where he comes from, and he's very proud of where he did come from, and he's driving to really change the game of international students and Australians to follow behind him."

Steven Kwan, Cleveland Guardians left fielder, 2024 American League All-Star starter, and former Oregon State Beaver (during Captains rehab media availability on 5/25): "He's a leader. He's playing for something bigger than himself, which I think is really cool. He plays fundamental baseball, and I think that's a really cool thing."

CAPTAINS TO THE MAINLAND

7 former Lake County Captains have made their MLB debut during the 2024 season.

INF/OF Jhonkensy Noel: On Wednesday, June 26, **INF/OF Jhonkensy Noel** made his MLB debut for the Cleveland Guardians on the road against the Baltimore Orioles. He started at first base and batted 9th in the Guardians' order, finishing 1-for-4 with 2 strikeouts. **In his 1st MLB at-bat, Noel hit a 413-foot solo home run to center field, becoming the 4th player in Cleveland franchise history to homer in his 1st career MLB at-bat. He was the first to do so since 2004 Captain Kevin Kouzmanoff, who became the 1st player in MLB history to hit a grand slam on his 1st MLB pitch on September 2, 2006.** Noel played 88 regular-season games for the Captains across the 2021 and 2022 seasons, hitting .238 with 78 hits, 12 doubles, 27 home runs, 67 RBI, a .521 SLG, and an .827 OPS.

LHP Raymond Burgos: On Monday, June 24, **LHP Raymond Burgos** made his MLB debut for the San Francisco Giants at home against the Chicago Cubs. He pitched 1 inning of relief, allowing 3 hits, 1 earned run, and 1 walk, while throwing 1 strikeout. **Burgos** made 48 regular-season appearances (11 starts) for the Captains across the 2019, 2021, and 2022 seasons, going 10-6 with a 2.83 ERA, 115 strikeouts, a 1.29 WHIP, a .255 opposing batting average, and 8 holds, converting 1 of his 2 save opportunities.
