GAME INFORMATION

GRANITE STATE SERIES RECAP: Binghamton dropped the seven game series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats from Delta Dental Stadium, 5-2. The Rumble Ponies dropped the first three games, being no-hit on Tuesday in a 6-0 loss. On Thursday, Binghamton won 6-3 behind six different hitters recording RBIs including Kevin Parada (3-for-5, 2B, R, RBI). During Sunday's seven inning finale Binghamton tallied their first shutout win of the season, 3-0 as left-hander Zach Thornton tossed 4.0 innings and punched out seven batters. The Ponies were outscored 37-21 in the series and have now dropped their last three series (5-14).

ELITE ELI: OF Eli Serrano III, the Mets' No. 13 prospect, has been an extra-base hit machine through his first 23 games in Double-A. On Thursday night he smacked an RBI double and his seventh double against New Hampshire. In game three of the series, he smashed an RBI double to give Binghamton a 3-0 lead. He now has 11 extra base which leads all Ponies hitters. He hit a go-ahead two-run single on April 18 at Akron and smashed the first home run of his Double-A career with a two-run homer in the 6th inning on April, 17. Over 23 games, (one HR, three 3B, seven 2B). At the Double-A level and is slashing .215/.340/.405/.745. He ranked T-3rd-most 2B (21) in the High-A South Atlantic League Last season with High-A Brooklyn. Serrano was drafted by the New York Mets in the 4th round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of NC State.

REIMER REASON: INF Jacob Reimer, the Mets' No. 5 prospect is riding a four game hit streak and has three multi hit games over his last four. Reimer has eight doubles this season and has cashed in three more two-baggers in three of his last four games. The 22-year old collected his third career four hit game on April 22 against Erie (4-for-4, R, 2B). Reimer collected four hits last season on August 14 at home against New Hampshire. Reimer is hitting .225 through his first 80 at bats (4 RBIs, 8 2Bs, HR). He Last season, Reimer hit .282 with 17 home runs and 77 RBIs across 61 games with High-A Brooklyn and Binghamton.

VAMOS RAMOS: OF Jose Ramos is riding a five game hit streak (7-for-18, 3 R, 2B, 7 RBI, 5 BB) which began on Wednesday, April 29 of the New Hampshire Series. Ramos accounted for 10 of Binghamton's 21 runs in the series against New Hampshire and now has 16 RBIs which leads all Binghamton hitters. Ramos is hitting .187 but has a .338 OBP and a .778 OPS through his first 22 games. The 25-year old from Chepo, Panama has spent seven seasons in the minor's most recently spending 2025 with the Dodgers organization playing 58 games in Double-A Tulsa and 44 games in Triple-A Oklahoma City clubbing 18 homers and slashing .251/.326/.456/.782.

ELEVATED EWING: OF A.J. Ewing, the Mets' No. 3 prospect and MLB Pipeline's No. 85 overall prospect has been promoted to Triple-A Syracuse. Over his first four games he is 11-for-22 with one 2B and 3B. In his debut on Tuesday night, Ewing went, 3-for-4, 2 R, 2B, 3B, 2 RBI. In 18 games for Binghamton Ewing slashed .349/.481/.571/1.052, 9 XBH (6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR) with 17 BB and just 15 SO with 12 SB. Ewing reached base safely in all 16 of his 18 games in 2026 with at least one hit in 14 of them. The 21-year-old ranked among Eastern League hitters: SB (T-2nd), 2B (6th), OBP (4th), AVG (6th). Ewing played 45 games at the Double-A level (.342 AVG, .413 OBP, .891 OPS 16 RBI, 13 2B, 2 HR, 24 SB).

WHO'S THE GOAT?: The Hartford Yard Goats (Double-A Affiliate Colorado Rockies) are off to a 11-15 start and sit in 5th place, 4.5 games back of first. They come off a six-game home series against the Reading Fighting Phis splitting the series 3-3. Hartford allowed double digit runs twice times in the series (15, 11) and hold a team ERA of 5.55 which ranks 10th in the Eastern League. Their lineup is led by 21-year old Andy Perez who is hitting .340 with a .859 OPS through 100 at bats. The Yard Goats are loaded with top 30 prospect talent including OF Jared Thomas (IL,#4) IF Roc Riggio (#10) C Cole Messina (#21) LHP Konner Eaton (#26). Riggio is off to a slow start hitting .202 but has driven in 16 runs which is second on the roster. Messina is hitting .209 with a .719 OPS over his first 21 games. Eaton has made five starts and holds a 3.70 ERA through 24.1 innings pitched. The left-hander has had control trouble with 22

18 MICHAEL COLLINS MANAGER

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.

-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.

-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.

-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.

-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.

-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



25 MARIANO DUNCAN BENCH COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 5th **YEAR WITH NYM:** 8th **HOMETOWN:** San Pedro de Macoris, DR

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.

-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.

-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



32 MATT CARASITI PITCHING COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Berlin, Conn.

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.

-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.

-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.

-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.

-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.

-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.

-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.

-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.



5 RACHEL FOLDEN HITTING COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Baldwin Park, Calif.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.

-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.

-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).

-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.



9 JAKE HAGER ASSISTANT HITTING COACH / INFIELD COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Sierra Vista, Nev.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.

-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.

-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.

-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

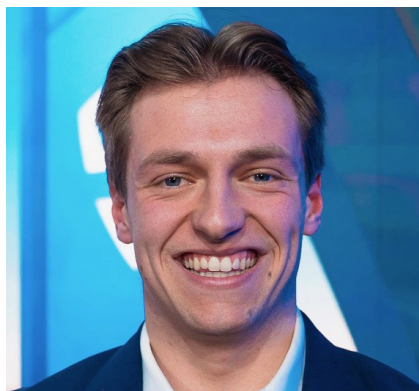
