APRIL 27th SYRACUSE (11-14) at WORCESTER (14-10) 12:05 pm Doubleheader

G1 Syracuse Mets RHP Blade Tidwell (1-2, 4.43) vs. Worcester Red Sox LHP Shane Drohan (2-0, 0.96)

G2 Syracuse Mets RHP Justin Hagenman () vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Austin Adams (0-0, 0.00)

Double Feature (Again and Again and Again and Again) – For the fourth time this season - and for the fourth time in the last 19 days - the Worcester Red Sox will play a make-up doubleheader when they take on the Syracuse Mets this afternoon in a twin bill beginning at 12:05 pm at Polar Park. It will also be the second twin bill in this series as the WooSox swept a make-up doubleheader this past Wednesday afternoon vs. these Mets by identical, 5-4 scores. Doubleheaders have become somewhat normal for the WooSox lately as they split a doubleheader at home vs. Columbus on Wednesday, April 9; swept a doubleheader in Rochester on Thursday, April 17; and pulled off the aforementioned sweep of the Mets this past Wednesday, April 23. For what it's worth...the WooSox played ten doubleheaders all of last season (going 0-2-8 in those...no sweeps, twice swept, and 8 splits) and the Worcester club-record for most twin bills in a season is 11 in 2023.

On the Air - Today's games, both 7-inning contests, will be game numbers six and seven of this long 7-game series between Worcester and Syracuse with the Sox leading, 4 games to 1. Today's Game 1 is live on NESN+ while Game 2 is on MiLB.TV and Bally's Live. Both games can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network.

Sunday Funday - Plenty of special happenings will take place before, during, and after today's doubleheader. It will be...Kristian Campbell Replica Jersey giveaway for the first 5,000 fans, presented by Manny's Appliances; Princeton Town Takeover; Fallon Health Sunday Funday, which includes the Fallon Health Future Starters program, when youngsters take the field with the WooSox and receive an autographed baseball; and Kids Run the Bases post-game (after game two).

No Saturday in the (Polar) Park – After yesterday's rainout, the WooSox have now had each of their first three scheduled Saturday home games at Polar Park either postponed or cancelled due to inclement weather. The WooSox had their first Saturday home game on March 29th vs. Syracuse postponed due to rain, their second scheduled Saturday game at Polar Park vs. Columbus on April 12 cancelled due to four inches of snow, and then yesterday due to rain. Thankfully, yesterday was the final Saturday in April! Let's see what next Saturday, May 3rd brings when the WooSox attempt to host the Toledo Mud Hens at Polar Park.

Weather or Not - Yesterday marked the fourth home postponement already this season (the others on March 29 and April 8 & 12). Worcester also had a road game postponed due to snow on April 16 in Rochester, NY. Overall last year, Worcester had five home postponements as well as five road postponements. In 2023 the WooSox also had five postponements at Polar Park among a club-record total of 14 games either postponed (11) or canceled (3) with nine of those coming on the road. Worcester had only two home postponements during all of 2022 and five home postponements & one cancelled home game during their abbreviated inaugural 2021 season.

Double Your Pleasure – The WooSox went almost 22 months (and 13 tries) between sweeping a doubleheader, but they have now done so twice in a little over a week. A week ago Thursday on April 17 in Rochester, Worcester earned their first doubleheader sweep since June 29, 2023 in Buffalo when they swept the Red Wings by 8-0 and 4-3 scores (the latter in 8-innings). Then, this past Wednesday here at Polar Park vs. Syracuse, the WooSox turned the trick again with a pair of 5-4 victories to sweep these Mets.

Splitsville – The Sox split their other make-up doubleheader this season on April 9 vs. the Columbus Clippers at Polar Park. Columbus won Game 1, 6-5 before the WooSox earned the split with a walk-off, 5-4 victory in the nightcap. Worcester went 0-2-8 in their 10 doubleheaders last season...no sweeps, swept twice, and eight splits. Worcester was swept in a pair of doubleheaders last season...on April 20 at home vs. Durham (12-2 & 4-3) and on April 24 at Toledo (5-3 & 3-2), but split their other eight twin bills. The WooSox went 5-2-4 in their franchise-high 11 doubleheaders in 2023 and they played seven doubleheaders during each of the 2021 and 2022 seasons going 1-2-4 both those years.

NEXT ON TAP - The probable pitching match-ups for the upcoming series vs. the Toledo Mud Hens this week and next weekend at Polar Park are TBD at this point. We do know the promotions and special events happening though!

What Have You Done for Me Lately – Some recent WooSox standouts (in alphabetical order). Batters...OF **Roman Anthony** has reached base safely in 16 games in a row (since April 6) including 13 games with at least one hit and the other 3 games with at least one walk. He has hit safely in 5 straight (7-for-14, .500) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 2 RBI, 5 BB, and 7 runs scored. OF **Nate Eaton** has hit in 7 of his last 8 games (8-for-31, .258) with 3 2B, 1 HR, 3 RBI, and 8 runs scored. C **Yasmani Grandal** has hit in 4 in a row (5-for-11) with 3 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBI. 1B **Nathan Hickey** has hit in 7 of his last 8 games (11-for-32, .344) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 6 RBI, and 6 runs scored. C **Mark Kozloszky** has hit in 5 straight (9-for-18, .500) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 8 RBI. INF **Marcelo Mayer**, who did not play on Friday, had his streak of six straight multi-hit games (April 18-23) snapped on Thursday but he had 2 more RBI on the night and leads the International League with 28 RBI on the season (including 18 RBI in his last 7 games alone). Injured OF **Tyler McDonough** has hit in 3 games in a row (7-for-12) with 1 2B, 1 HR, 3 RBI. And INF **Abraham Toro** has hit safely in 8 of his last 10 games at a .378 clip (14-for-37) with 3 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, and 10 runs scored. Pitchers...Reliever **Nick Burdi** has allowed just 1 run in his 8 relief appearances on the season (10.2 IP) going 2-0 with 1 SV with just 3 BB with 16 SO. Starters RHP **Cooper Criswell** has given up just 1 ER in his 11 IP (3 games), LHP **Shane Drohan** has allowed just 2 ER in his 18.2 IP on only 9 hits with 28 SO in his 5 games, and RHP **Robert Stock** has yielded 3 runs in his 19.2 IP with 24 SO in his 5 games.

High Five – Worcester’s second season-high 5-game winning streak came to an end Friday night with an 8-3 loss to Syracuse as the Mets earned their first victory in five tries in this series. The WooSox won 5 in a row from April 13-18 and again from April 20-24. Even with the loss, the WooSox have still won 10 of their last 12 games since April 13.

Happy 25th – Game 1 today is Game #25 for the WooSox which puts them 1/3rd of the way through the first half of the schedule. The International League plays two halves with games 1-75 from March 28 through June 22 and then games 76-150 from June 24 through September 21. The winner of the 1st half (top overall winning pct. among all 20 IL teams) plays the winner of the 2nd half in the International League playoffs in a best 2 out of 3 series from September 23-25 with the 1st half winner hosting all three games (as necessary). Last year after 25 games the WooSox were 10-15 on April 27, 2024. They come into play today with a 14-10 record.

This Series – After winning the first four games of this series, the WooSox could not overcome an early deficit Friday night and fell for the first time all week, 8-3. The Sox lead the series, 4 games to 1 with two games remaining. After scoring 5 runs during each of their first three victories in this series, the WooSox erupted for 14 runs on Thursday night en route to a 14-1 rout of the Mets. The Sox blanked the Mets in the series opener on Tuesday night, 5-0 and then swept a make-up doubleheader Wednesday afternoon by identical, 5-4 scores. After today, the WooSox and Mets will next meet on July 1st here at Polar Park for the start of a home and home series that begins with three games in Worcester (July 1-3) followed by three games in Syracuse (July 4-6).

Stats This Series – The WooSox have out-scored Syracuse, 32-17 in the first five games of this 7-game set. The Sox are batting .293 in the series (44-for-150) with 7 HR while WooSox pitchers are 4-1 with a 3.07 ERA (14 ER in 41 IP) with 1 HRA.

Four Below to Four Above – Since April 13th the WooSox have won 10 of their last 12 games to go from a season-low 4-games below .500 (4-8) to 4-games over .500 (at 14-10). They were a season-high of 5-games above .500 on Thursday (14-9). They have also moved from 8th-place in the division and 6½-games behind to their present standing of a tie for 3rd-place and 5-games behind 1st-place Jacksonville who have a 20-6 record.

A Fresh Dozen – The WooSox are hitting .317 during these 12 games (127-for-401) with 39 2B, 17 HR, and 89 runs scored while Sox pitchers are 10-2 with a 3.69 ERA (41 ER in 100 IP) giving up 46 runs and 13 HR.

First in Class – Worcester leads the 20-team International League in a host of offensive categories. WooSox batters are 2nd in the league in Average (.268), but are 1st in runs scored (140) – they also led the league in runs last season with 869 – are 1st in doubles (56), total bases (355), slugging percentage (.449), and OPS (.805). The Sox are 3rd in HR (27). They also have the best run differential in the IL at +40 runs (140-100). Jacksonville is next at +38. Not to be forgotten, Worcester pitchers pace the league with 5 shutouts while their 3.91 ERA is 7th best in the IL. The WooSox staff did not earn their 5th shutout victory last season until July 6th which was their 86th game.

Home Run Derby – The WooSox have maximized their use of the long-ball all season as 19 of their total 27 HR on the year have come with runners on base. Worcester batters have belted eight solo HR, thirteen 2-run homers, three 3-run blasts, and three grand slams.

Baker's Dozen – The WooSox are 4-1 thus far on their season-long 13-game homestand that runs through next Sunday, May 4. After an offday tomorrow (Monday), the WooSox will open a 6-game series vs. the Toledo Mud Hens starting Tuesday night at 6:05 pm. The clubs will play Tuesday – Friday evenings all at 6:05 pm and then next Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm.

Where Things Stand – Worcester (14-10) comes into play today in a tie for 3rd place in the International League East division and 5-games behind Jacksonville who sit atop the league with their 20-6 record.

Take Home a Dozen or More – This current 13-game homestand is the longest in terms of games for Worcester this season. The WooSox do have another double figure homestand from July 29 – August 10 that will be 12-games including six vs. Lehigh Valley and six vs. Buffalo. Worcester has played seven extended homestands of 12 games or more - featuring two series each - during their first four years of existence. They have had four winners and three losers during their seven “long” homestands in WooSox history (the first two of which included Syracuse)...

This Season vs. Syracuse – The WooSox have a 5 games to 2 lead over the Mets in the season-series thanks to their 4-1 lead in this 7 game set. The clubs met for what was originally to be a 3-game weekend series to begin the 2025 season here at Polar Park from March 28-30. Syracuse spoiled Worcester's home-opener on March 28 with a 4-3 victory, the clubs were rained out the next day, and then played a single game on March 30 with the WooSox gaining a split of the series with a 12-0 rout.

Last Season vs. Syracuse – The WooSox won the 2024 season-series over Syracuse by a 13-11 margin going 5-4 vs. the Mets here at Polar Park and finishing 8-7 in Syracuse. Worcester pitchers posted a 5.07 ERA with 29 HRA vs. Syracuse last year while Sox batters hit .250 with 27 HR. The WooSox out-scored the Mets, 133-122 in the 24 games.

All-Time vs. Syracuse - Pawtucket/Worcester leads the all-time series over Syracuse by a 486-466 count.

A Winning Tradition – The 2024 Worcester Red Sox went 79-71 to post a winning season for the fourth time in as many years of existence and for the third year in a row under manager Chad Tracy. Trace is only the second Red Sox Triple-A manager to ever post three consecutive winning seasons. Darrell Johnson did so from 1971-73 (the first two years when the Red Sox Triple-A club was in Louisville before moving to Pawtucket in 1973). Worcester finished 35-40 during the first half last year but then improved to 44-31 in the second half. Overall the 2024 WooSox went 40-34 at home and 39-37 on the road. The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, and the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark.

2024 WooSox Batters Led the Way – Worcester led all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories last season. The WooSox led the league with 869 runs scored (Scranton/Wilkes-Barre was next with 846 runs scored). The Sox also led the IL with 786 walks (Toledo was a distant 2nd with 676 walks). Worcester paced the league by a wide margin with an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox were the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .359 (Scranton/WB was 2nd at .358). Furthermore, Worcester had the 2nd best OPS in the league at .795 (Columbus was 1st at .804).

2024 Rankings – Worcester finished 5th in the IL in team batting with a .259 average. On the pitching side, the Sox were 10th in team ERA (4.84). Sox pitchers allowed the 2nd fewest HR in the league (141 HRA while Nashville had 139 HRA). Defensively, the WooSox were 11th with a .979 field pct. (107 errors in 5126 total chances).

Players Aplenty - The 2024 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records (previously set by the 2023 WooSox) as they made 281 player transactions during the 2024 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used 84 different players in 2024 (37 position players and 47 pitchers) to better the mark of 79 players in 2023. Ironically, the 2021 WooSox broke a long-standing Red Sox Triple-A record when they used 72 different players to beat the 1995 Pawtucket Red Sox (during a strike year when replacement players were used for the first month+ of that season) and the 2006 PawSox who each employed 70 different players. When Chad Tracy made his Worcester debut in 2022, the WooSox quickly set a new record using 75 different players (that was immediately topped first in 2023 and again in 2024).

WooSox to BoSox - The WooSox sent 28 different players to Boston during the 2024 season (not counting rehab players).

Sea Dog to Woofsters – A total of 22 different players were promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester last season.

PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) GAME RECAP – The Portland Sea Dogs (11-6) were postponed yesterday afternoon at home due to rain. The game will be made up when Reading returns to Maine later in May. The clubs will conclude their series this afternoon. On Friday night, Tyler Miller belted a walk-off HR (#4) in the bottom of the 9th-inning to give the Sea Dogs a 2-1 victory over the Reading Fightin' Phils. It was the Sea Dogs 4th win in a row. Miller, who went 3-for-4 on the night, also drove in the other Portland run with an RBI single. Reidis Sena (2-0) was the winner with two scoreless innings of relief.

WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES – The Red Sox today transferred righthanded relievers **Jonathan Brand** and **Gabriel Jackson** from Double-A Portland to Worcester. The Boston Red Sox yesterday recalled RHP **Cooper Criswell** from Worcester to be appointed as their 27th man for yesterday's doubleheader in Cleveland. Criswell will return to Worcester in the next day or two, but is not currently active. He is 1-0 with a 0.82 ERA in 3 games (2 starts) for the WooSox this season – 11 IP, 7 H, 4 R, 1 ER, 3 BB, 16 SO.

Jonathan Brand has made 4 relief appearances for Portland this season going 0-0, 0.00 with 2 saves – 4.1 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 10 SO. An 8th round selection of the Red Sox in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Miami University, OH, the Columbus, GA native spent the bulk of last season with Portland going 2-3 with a 4.67 ERA in 28 relief appearances. He had a fine season with Salem (A) in 2023 going 4-2 with a 2.58 ERA along with 8 saves in 29 relief outings.

Gabriel Jackson has made 3 relief appearances for the Sea Dogs this season going 1-0 with 0.00 ERA – 5.1 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 6 BB, 4 SO. The 23-year-old from Samana in the Dominican Republic was signed by the Red Sox as an international free agent in July of 2018. He spent most of last season with Greenville (A+) where he went 8-2 with 3 saves and a 4.89 ERA in 27 games (25 in relief). He did finish the year with Portland appearing in 3 games.

Since the start of the season (four+ weeks) the WooSox have sent RHP Hunter Dobbins (twice), RHP Robert Stock, C Blake Sabol, RHP Josh Winckowski, RHP Michael Fulmer, NF Nick Sogard, RHP Luis Guerrero, and RHP Cooper Criswell to Boston; although Stock, Sogard, Dobbins, and Winckowski are back with Worcester and Criswell will soon be. Fulmer elected to become a free agent and signed with the Cubs following his outright assignment. RHP Quinn Priester was traded. And OF Corey Rosier and C Enderso Lira were sent to Double-A Portland (although Rosier rejoined the WooSox on April 20). All players involved are from the WooSox 2025 Opening Day Roster.
