OKLAHOMA CITY BASEBALL CLUB (15-9) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (6-18)

Friday, April 26, 2024 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • RGCU Field at Isotopes Park • Albuquerque, NM Game #25, Home Game #13

RHP Elieser Hernandez (1-1, 3.46) vs. RHP Karl Kauffmann (1-3, 9.95)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes need to win the final three games of the set to avoid losing their fourth series in the fifth set of the season ... Albuquerque has lost four-straight, the club's second-longest skid of the year (longest: eight, April 5-13) ... Karl Kauffmann is scheduled to start for the Isotopes while Elieser Hernandez is slated to take the mound for Oklahoma City.

SWIPES: Albuquerque has a stolen base in seven-straight games, tied for the longest streak of the year (also: March 29 – April 5) and three off the franchise record set Sept. 8-19, 2024. They have stolen multiple bases four times during the stretch and 10 times on the year.

OUT THE GATE: With a 6-18 start, the Isotopes are tied for the third-worst record through 24 games for a Pacific Coast League team since 2008. Nashville (2008) and Las Vegas (2009) were also 6-18, while Tucson (2008) and Iowa (2018) began 5-19.

THREE-GAME STRETCH: Oklahoma City has scored 49 runs in the series, marking the most tallies ever given up by the Isotopes in a three-game stretch. The previous worst was 43 against the lowa Cubs from Aug. 30-Sept. 1, 2010 in the Duke City. Iowa won those contests by scores of 20-9, 8-6 and 15-13.

11-PLUS: This is the fifth time the opposition has plated 11 or more runs in three consecutive matchups against Albuquerque: June 30-July 2, 2003 (vs. Omaha), June 13-15, 2006 (vs. Round Rock), Sept. 16-18, 2022 (vs. Oklahoma City), and May 27-30, 2023 (vs. Round Rock; at Salt Lake).

20 TALLIES: Yesterday marked the 12th occurrence of the Isotopes surrendering at least 20 runs in a game. It has happened three times against Oklahoma. The Redhawks beat Albuquerque 24-4 on June 24, 2004, then 20-6 in a game that started Sept. 1, 2007, was suspended and completed the following day.

VS. OKC: Albuquerque has dropped six-straight games to Oklahoma City for the first time since losing six in-a-row over two three-game series sweeps between 2018 and 2019. They haven't lost more than seven in-a-row since dropping a serieslong 12-straight from July 2, 2013 - Aug. 23, 2015).

XBH: Albuquerque allowed 10 extra-base hits for the second consecutive game, tying a season high. Ryan Ward's two long balls are the second multi-homer contest against Albuquerque in 2024, joining Joey Loperfido who blasted three on April 12.

TAKE YOUR BASE: For the fourth time in 2024, the Isotopes issued double-digit walks in a contest. Relented 10 or more free passes in back-to-back games for the first time in club history.

STOVIE: Hunter Stovall went 5-for-5 in his season debut, setting a new career-high for hits in a contest. It was the 28th five-hit game for a player in Isotopes history and first since Jonathan Morales last Sept. 9, when he hit for the cycle against Reno.

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck tallied a pair of doubles yesterday, his eighth career contest registering multiple two-baggers. He is 8-for-15 in his last three games with three-straight mult-hit contests.

BECK'S BARRELS: Has a 15.5 percent barrel rate (11 barrels/71 BBE), 8th-highest in Triple-A (highest: Joey Loperfido 26.7, min 50 BBE) ... His 11 barrels are tied for 6th in Triple-A (most: 16, Loperfido).

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron extended his hitting streak to 12 games (every game he's played in 2024, tied for team lead) with an RBI bunt single yesterday. His 12-game streak is tied for the third-longest active streak in Triple-A (longest: 14, Jonathan Arauz, OKlahoma City). Has just one multi-hit game during the stretch (March 31 vs. El Paso, two hits, including a homer).

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk also extended his hitting streak to 12 games with a single yesterday. He is slashing .347/.411/.449 with five doubles and 11 RBI during the stretch.

TONY: Drew Romo extended his streak to 12 games (tied for team lead) with a double Wednesday. The 12-game streak is tied for the third-longest active streak in Triple-A (longest: 14, Jonathan Arauz, OKlahoma City.). During the stretch, he is slashing .367/.380/.490 with four doubles, a triple and seven RBI. He has five multi-hit games during streak.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes Has an RBI in four-straight contests, matching the longest streak of year (also, March 29-April 3).

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard also doubled twice for the ninth time as a pro, and first since April 11, 2023 vs. Cincinnati. He finished 3-for-5, his team-leading 10th multi-hit game of the season. He has a modest five-game hit streak (10x21) ... He is one homer shy of tying Jordan Patterson's Isotopes team record for homers.

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Jordan Beck is 2nd in XBH (16), T-4th in RBI (26) and doubles (9), 5th in runs (22) and T-5th in total bases (56) ... Julio Carreras is T-3rd in triples (3).

30-RACK: The two teams combined for 30 or more runs for the eighth time in Isotopes Park history yesterday, and second time in nights after Oklahoma City's 17-13 win on Tuesday.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
