GAME INFORMATION

LUIS ROBERT JR. REHAB ASSIGNMENT: New York Mets **CF Luis Robert Jr.** is scheduled to continue his rehab assignment (lumbar spine disc herniation) with Double-A Binghamton on Sunday afternoon. On Thursday, Robert Jr. demolished a solo home run and reached base three times (2-for-3, HR, RBI, R, HBP). In two games with Binghamton, the 28-year-old has gone 4-for-7, HR, RBI, 2 R, HBP and this would mark his sixth game overall on his rehab assignment (played three games with Triple-A Syracuse last series). Robert Jr. has been on the Mets' IL since April 30 and last played for New York on April 26.

MARCUS SEMIEN REHAB ASSIGNMENT: New York Mets **2B Marcus Semien** is scheduled to begin his rehab assignment (left hip flexor strain) on Sunday afternoon. Semien was placed on the Mets' IL on June 25 and last played on June 24. The 35-year-old has played in 80 games for the Mets this season, after he was acquired in a trade that sent OF Brandon Nimmo to the Texas Rangers in November.

LAST NIGHT - BINGHAMTON 9, HARTFORD 2: The Rumble Ponies tied the game in the 8th inning and then put up seven runs on five hits in the ninth inning to go ahead 9-2. It tied a season high for runs and hits in an inning. 2B Wyatt Young hit a game-tying RBI double in the 8th inning. C Kevin Parada's bunt single with an E1 gave the Ponies the lead and CF Jaylen Palmer hit a three-run double in the 9th inning. LHP Jonathan Santucci dazzled, recording 8 strikeouts and allowing 1 ER over 6.0 IP, while surpassing 100 strikeouts on the season. RHP Garrett Stratton (2.0 IP, 2 K) and RHP Brian Metoyer (1.0 IP, 3 K) combined for 3.0 scoreless innings in relief.

POWER SURGE: This year, the Rumble Ponies have been live or die by the home run, going 25-25 when they hit a homer and 7-29 when they do not. OF Matt Rudick and Mets OF Luis Robert Jr. (rehab) have both homered the last three games. Binghamton has had a multi-home run game in six of its last 20 games, after tallying one on Wednesday night at Hartford (Jose Ramos & Nick Lorusso). The Rumble Ponies hit 27 homers in June and 27 in May (8th in EL), after hitting 14 in April, which ranked last in the league.

LO KNOWS: INF Nick Lorusso extended his hit streak to six games and his on-base streak to 10 games with an RBI double and a walk last night. Over his last 20 games, Lorusso is slashing .308/.402/.641 (1.043 OPS) with 6 HR, 20 RBI, 8 2B, 16 R, and 13 BB. In that stretch (since June 10), Lorusso ranks among the Eastern League: SLG (3rd), OPS (6th), RBI (6th), XBH (T-5th), and 2B (T-8th). He has recorded at least one hit in 17 of his last 19 games. Lorusso has crushed a career-high 15 home runs this season, which ranks second among Mets minor league hitters behind Ryan Clifford (NYM No. 2 prospect). The Monroe, Connecticut, native is hitting .294 (5-for-17) with a HR, 3 RBI, 2 2B, and 3 BB in this series in Hartford, Connecticut.

JT'S JULY: 1B JT Schwartz reached base three times on Saturday night (two walks, one hit by pitch). In this series, Schwartz is hitting .429 (6-for-14) with a HR, 4 RBI, 2B, 3 BB, and 1 HBP. He recorded four runs batted in on Tuesday and had multi-hit games on Wednesday (three hits) and Friday (two hits). Schwartz has gotten off to a hot start in July, and in eight games, he has produced a .355 AVG (11-for-31), .432 OBP, .677 SLG, 1.109 OPS, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 5 R, 4 2B, 6 XBH. Schwartz has recorded at least one hit in six of his eight games in July and has two three-hit games this month. In his last 20 games (since June 13), Schwartz is hitting .275 with an .844 OPS, 3 HR, 12 RBI, 22 H, 9 2B, and 12 XBH. He ranks among the Eastern League T-1st with 9 2B, and T-8th with 12 XBH in that span. The 2021 4th-round pick out of UCLA is hitting .282 with a .908 OPS, 2 HR, 8 RBI, 12 H, 4 2B, and 6 XBH over his last 10 games.

VAMOS RAMOS: OF Jose Ramos recorded his team-leading 47th RBI on Thursday, with an RBI single in the 7th inning. On Wednesday, he swatted his 13th HR, which ranks second on the team. Ramos hit 18 home runs across Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Oklahoma City with the Los Angeles Dodgers last year. Over his last 20 games, Ramos is hitting .265 with 5 HR, 13 RBI and 4 2B.

LUCKY TO HAVE YOU: INF/OF Nick Lucky signed a minor league contract with the New York Mets on June 16, 2026, and was assigned to Double-A Binghamton out of the Atlantic League. Lucky hit an RBI single on Saturday and has 15 hits over his first 17 games (.278 AVG). Last series against Chesapeake, Lucky went 4-for-13 (.308 AVG) with 3 RBI, 2 SB, and had a 3 H/3 RBI on Friday. On June 25, Lucky had a 4-hit game against Erie being just the second player on Binghamton to do so this year. In 48 games this season with the Lancaster Stormers of the Atlantic League, he slashed .339/.441/.548.

STRATTON'S STRUT: RHP Garrett Stratton has a 1.54 ERA in eight appearances, spanning 11.2 IP with Binghamton. The 22-year-old, who was a 20th-round pick in 2025 out of Rice University, went 4-1 with a 2.73 ERA, 44 SO, and 15 BB to begin the season with High-A Brooklyn. He was promoted to Binghamton on June 16. Stratton has worked scoreless in 7 of his 8 APP with the Rumble Ponies, recording 12 SO without issuing a walk.

HOMETOWN: Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.
-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.
-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.
-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.
-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.
-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



25 MARIANO DUNCAN

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.
-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.
-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



32 MATT CARASITI

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.
-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.
-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.
-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.
-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.
-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.
-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.
-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.
-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.
-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.
-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).
-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.
-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.
-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.
-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.
-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

The Mets' club record for the most hits in consecutive official at-bats is nine, first set by José Vizcaíno in 1996 and then tied by John Olerud in 1998. Vizcaíno's streak began on April 23 with a double against the Reds at Shea. In José's next plate appearance, he sacrificed. After that, he hit two singles, a double, two more singles, another double, a single, a triple and then struck out in the ninth inning against Jeff Parrett to end the streak on April 25 at St. Louis.

In 1999, Olerud tied the club record with nine consecutive hits, from his final at-bat on September 16 at Houston to September 20 vs. Florida. The streak came to an end when he grounded to second in the third inning of the Mets' September 22 contest vs. Montreal.

Olerud tied a National League record with his first-inning walk on September 22 vs. Montreal, reaching base 15 straight times dating back to a single in his final at-bat on September 16th at Houston. Barry Bonds reached base 15 straight times from August 31-September 4, 2004 (9-9 with six walks).

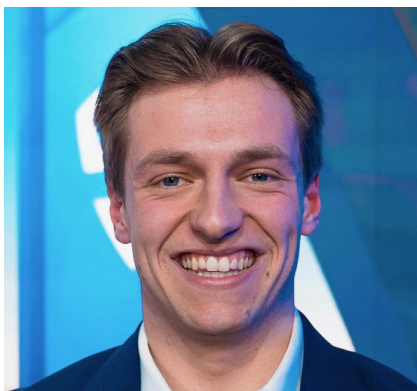
