**TEN... AGAIN!** : The Loons won 10 consecutive games from May 24 to June 3, matching a franchise record. It was the fourth time in franchise history Great Lakes has achieved a double-digit winning streak. The three other instances were all 10 straight. April 26-May 6, 2019, June 3-15, 2015 and June 11-20, 2009.

**MY BETTER HALF:** The Great Lakes Loons can potentially play their best half in franchise history. The 2010 Loons went 47-23 in the second half - a .671 winning percentage. If the 2023 Loons go 9-5 in their final 14 games of the first half, they would finish 45-21, a .681 winning percentage. Seven is the "magic number" for a first-half division title and postseason berth. It lowers with a Great Lakes win or West Michigan loss.

This year is the third season the Loons attained 30 wins through the first 50 games of the season (35). The other two, 2019 (31-19) and 2010 (30-20).

**SHATTERING RECORDS IN ROCK COUNTY:** Great Lakes made history on Tuesday, May 30 settling four franchise records in their 20-0 win over the Beloit Sky Carp. The most runs scored in a game, the largest margin of victory, the most doubles as a team in a single-game with 10 and the most extra-base hits notching 13. Seven Loons had multi-hit games and every player in the starting lineup had at least one hit.

**SERIES SUCCESSION:** The Loons were victorious in five of the six games in Beloit and have now secured six series wins in a row. It is the first time the Loons have done that since the six-game series schedule was instituted in 2021. May 1st to May 23rd, 2019 was the last time Great Lakes won six straight, four three-game sets and two four-game series. The first series of the six was versus Beloit.

**WINS TOP TO BOTTOM:** The Los Angeles Dodgers minor league affiliates have the best combined record in baseball. With a 147-73 record, the Dodgers Low-A, High-A, Double-A and Triple-A teams have a combined .668 winning percentage. The Loons have the best mark in High-A and are the first team to 30 wins. Great Lakes has a .692 winning percentage and a +91 run differential.

**Fever Pitch:** The Great Lakes Loons as a pitching unit have the lowest ERA (3.32) in all of High-A. They have given up the fewest hits (330) and the lowest OBA (.200).

**Oh What a RUSH:** Dalton Rushing posted the longest on-base streak this season in High-A. 29 consecutive games that lasted from April 7 - May 14. Rushing currently has seven home runs tied for fourth in the Midwest League. The 2022 2nd Round Pick has 30 RBI and a .431 on-base percentage currently ranks seventh and third respectively in the MWL.

Dalton Rushing was named the Midwest League Player of the Week for April 17-23. The Dodgers seventh prospect and 69th overall per MLB Pipeline, had three home runs, drove in 10 runs and walked eight times during those six days against South Bend.

**MAY THE LOONS WAY:** In May, the Loons won 20 games for the first time in a month since May 2019 when they went 22-7. Great Lakes played 14 games on the road, going 11-3, en route to being the first team in all of baseball to 20 road wins.

**LOON -> SHOW:** In 2023, four former Loons have made their MLB Debut. Michael Busch became the 100th Loon to reach the majors. Bobby Miller '21 (5/23, LAD): 5 IP, 1 ER, 5 K. Gavin Stone '21-'22 (5/3, LAD): 4 IP, 4 ER, 1 K. Michael Busch '19 (4/25, LAD): 1-3, RBI, R. Jose Hernandez '21-'22 (4/1, PIT): 1 IP, 1 H, 0 ER.

**49 HR in 52 Games:** The Loons are second in the MWL with 49 home runs. 30 on the road and 19 at Dow Diamond. Damon Keith is tied for third in the league with eight. Lake County has the fourth-fewest with 31.

**Loons not too late:** Great Lakes has scored nearly 48 percent of their 277 runs this season in the sixth inning and beyond. 26 in the sixth, 34 in the seventh and 36 in the eighth, while 25 have come in the ninth and 11 in the tenth.

**Every Day is K Day:** Through the first 52 games, the Great Lakes Loons are second in the Midwest League in pitcher strikeouts with 503, 53 behind Quad Cities. The Loons were the first team to reach 300.

## Loons Coaching Staff

### MANAGER

#### **Daniel Nava**

The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Daniel Nava as the Loons' tenth manager in the 16-year history of the franchise. Nava, 39, enters his third year coaching in the Dodgers organization after managing the ACL Dodgers in 2021 and serving as bench coach for Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022. The switch hitting outfielder played parts of seven seasons in the Major Leagues and won a World Series in 2013 as a key contributor for the Boston Red Sox. In that championship season for Boston, Nava finished eighth in the American League in batting average (.303). He famously powered a grand slam on the first pitch he saw in his Major League debut in June 12, 2010 for the Red Sox. Nava, a native of Redwood City, CA, also played in the big leagues for the Tampa Bay Rays (2015), Los Angeles Angels (2016), Kansas City Royals (2016) and Philadelphia Phillies (2017). He finished his Major League career with a .266 batting average, .357 on-base percentage, 29 home runs and 206 RBIs. His final professional season as a player was in 2019 with the independent Kansas City T-Bones. After playing baseball at St. Francis High School in Mountain View, California, Nava enrolled at Santa Clara University. He attempted to walk-on to the baseball team unsuccessfully and became the equipment manager. After two years, Nava enrolled at the College of San Mateo, a junior college, due to no longer being able to afford Santa Clara's tuition. Santa Clara would bring Nava back on a full scholarship after being an All-American at San Mateo. Despite a stellar senior season, Nava went undrafted, and signed with the Chico Outlaws of the now defunct Golden Baseball League in 2007. His 1.100 OPS there led to the Red Sox discovering and signing Nava to a minor-league deal, after Boston paid the one dollar rights fee.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **David Anderson**

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons for a second season. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team in the 2021 season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **Richard De Los Santos**

Richard De Los Santos returns for a second year as a member of the coaching staff after serving as Assistant Pitching Coach last season. This year, Anderson and De Los Santos will share the title of Pitching Coach. The 38-year-old De Los Santos had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. He played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1/3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native accumulated up over 400 strikeouts on the mound.

### HITTING COACH

#### **O'Koyea Dickson**

O'Koyea Dickson, 33, returns to Dow Diamond in a coaching role after spending the 2012 season as a player with the Loons. He was drafted in the 12th round of the 2011 draft by the Dodgers, and made his Major League debut with the club in 2017. 2023 marks Dickson's second year coaching in the Dodgers organization after he worked with Manager Nava with Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022 as the team's Hitting Coach. The 2022 Rancho Cucamonga team had the most hits and RBIs in the California League under Dickson's direction. The California native made his Major League debut in September of 2017 for the Dodgers, and appeared in a total of seven games after an injury cut his time in Los Angeles short. His lone hit in the big leagues came off Madison Bumgarner of the San Francisco Giants on September 23, 2017. He hit 24 home runs and drove in 76 runs in that 2017 season for Triple-A Oklahoma City. For the next two years, Dickson had stints in Nippon Professional Baseball, the Atlantic League, the Mexican League and the Pacific Association before entering coaching. Notably in 2007, as a fifteen year old sophomore at George Washington High School, Dickson became the first high-schooler to hit a home run at Oracle Park, then AT&T Park.

### BENCH COACH

#### **Elían Herrera**

Former Loon Elían Herrera is back for a third season as the bench coach for Great Lakes. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fifth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons, including the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. He also returned to the Loons for a portion of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs. Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Before joining the Loons staff in 2021, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.
