30-30 IN SIGHT: **OF Brewer Hicklen** is closing in on another milestone that is quite rare in minor league baseball. Hicklen needs just two more home runs to become the seventh player in affiliated Minor League Baseball since 2005 to hit 30 home runs and steal 30 bases in a single season. Hicklen would join Kyle Tucker (2019) and Joc Pederson (2014) as only players to accomplish the feat solely at the Triple-A level. Hicklen's 28 home runs lead the Storm Chasers this season, needing two more to become the third player in the Storm Chasers era to hit 30 homers in a single season. He would join **Ryan McBroom** (32, 2021) and **Carlos Peguero** (30, 2014) in the Storm Chasers' 30-HR club.

CATCH US IF YOU CAN: Between the two games yesterday, Omaha stole four bases (4-for-4), bringing their Triple-A-leading total to 169 steals this season. Tacoma has swiped the second most bases at the Triple-A level, taking 167. The Storm Chasers are also hold the best success rate in Triple-A at .841, besting St. Paul by 10 percentage points (.831). **OF Dairon Blanco** leads the International League with 36 steals this season while **OF Brewer Hicklen** is tied for third at 33. Hicklen's .943 (33-for-35) stolen base percentage is tops among the league's top 10 in stolen base totals.

A DOZEN GAMES: Omaha has hit a homer in each of their last 12 games, the longest home run streak by the Storm Chasers this season. Omaha is 8-4 in that span, with the streak starting on August 26. The Storm Chasers are looking to outright win a series for the first time since taking 4-of-7 against Toledo in early-July. **OF Brewer Hicklen** has hit five home runs during the streak to lead the team, one of two players to play in all 12 games. **C Freddy Fermin** has launched four home runs while **OF Dairon Blanco** has hit three during the streak.

SAVE MACHINE: After not earning a save in his first 45 appearances, **RHP Andrés Núñez** has recorded a save in each of his last three appearances. Overall, he is 3-for-4 in save opportunities this season while finishing the game 15 times. Núñez is leading the team with 48 appearances and his 56.2 innings are the most among Storm Chasers that have started less than 10 games. He has allowed five home runs this season and has kept opponents off the scoreboard in 37 of his appearances. He holds the longest scoreless streak for Omaha this season at 27.0 innings, lasting from May 19 to July 30.

QUIETLY BRILLIANT: Despite allowing an earned run for just the fourth time this season last night, **RHP Andrés Sotillet** still has an ERA below two at 1.91 and is leading the pitching staff among players that have appeared in at least 20 games for Omaha this season. Against Sotillet, opponents are hitting just .186 with a 1.02 WHIP. He has struck out 23 batters while walking 11 this season.

FOR OMAHA: **LHP Austin Cox** gets the ball to make his team-leading 23rd start and 26th overall appearance for the Storm Chasers. Cox earned the win in his last start, going 6.0 innings against St. Paul, allowing two earned runs on eight hits with four strikeouts and two walks. In his start prior, Cox tossed a seven-inning complete game, the only complete game by a Storm Chaser this season. The 25-year-old Macon, Ga. native has seen Indianapolis twice this season, putting up a quality start in the June 3 meeting, allowing one earned run in 6.0 innings of work. When pitching inside Werner Park this season, Cox is 4-1 with a 3.66 ERA, dropping his WHIP to 1.39 and his batting average against to .249 at home.

FOR INDIANAPOLIS: **RHP Luis Ortiz** gets the nod to make just his second start for the Indians this season. Ortiz, in his first career Triple-A start, went 4.0 innings against Louisville. He allowed six runs (four earned runs) on four hits with one walk and three strikeouts in the no decision. Ortiz has yet to allow a right-handed hitter to record a hit in 10 at bats while lefties are hitting .571 (4-for-7) against him. Ortiz started the season with Double-A Altoona, going 5-9 with a 4.64 ERA before getting transferred to Indianapolis on September 1. He has combined to make 24 starts and one relief appearance between the two levels this season. The 23-year-old signed as an international free agent with Pittsburgh in 2018 out of the Dominican Republic.

COX NOTES

- Tossed a seven-inning complete game in game one on 8/28 against SWB, just the second time this season that he has gone 7.0 innings.
- Earned three quality starts in first 12 starts of the season, all in June. Went 2-1 in five starts in June with a 2.45 ERA across 29.1 innings.
- Allowed five runs (four earned) in season debut on 4/7 (1) @ IND, striking out four and walking none across 4.0 innings
- Earned non-roster invite to 2022 Major League Spring Training, throwing 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts
- Enters 2022 as the No. 19 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline
- Spent most of 2021 season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas before finishing the year with Triple-A Omaha and making his Triple-A debut
- Made 2021 debut on 5/26 vs. San Antonio after dealing with arm soreness to start the season
- Posted a 5.06 ERA in five Double-A starts in June before recording a 1.80 ERA in five starts in July
- Earned Double-A Central Pitcher of the Week honors with a 7.0-inning complete game on 8/4 @ Arkansas
- Exited game on 8/11 vs. Frisco in the third inning and did not pitch again until 9/10 @ Wichita
- Made final Double-A start in Game 1 of Double-A Central Championship Series, when he allowed three runs on six hits in 4.0 innings
- Made Triple-A debut on 9/26 vs. Indianapolis in Omaha's home runale, recording his first Triple-A strikeout in a scoreless inning before allowing five runs on three homers in second inning of relief
- Allowed five runs on five hits while walking three, hitting two, and striking out two in 3.0 innings in first Triple-A start on 10/2 @ Iowa
- Earned South Atlantic League Midseason All-Star honors in 2019 with Low-A Lexington, earning a promotion to High-A Wilmington in the second half of the season
