CAPRA HOMERS TWICE, FISHER CATS WIN FOURTH STRAIGHT AT PORTLAND SUNDAY: Vinny Capra had a career day, hitting two home runs and driving in five, as the Fisher Cats took the series finale 9-2, winning the series in the process. Samad Taylor also homered, and Demi Orimoloye matched his career high with three hits, as the Fisher Cats delivered another complete performance.

MR. JUNE: Samad Taylor's bat continues to excel, as he currently owns a 11-game hit streak that spans the entire month of June. Over that streak, he is 19-44, batting .432, with 6HR, 10RBI, and a whopping 18 runs in that process. This streak has propelled him to the top 10 in the league in runs (2nd), total bases (t-2nd), hits (t-3rd), OPS (4th), slugging (4th), average (7th), and home runs (3rd), and he leads the league with 13 stolen bases.

THE MAINE EVENT: The Fisher Cats won the last four games of their series with Portland after losing the first two games by a combined two runs. The Fisher Cats found their rhythm on both sides, outscoring Portland 44-27 while connecting for 17 doubles and seven home runs. The highlight of the series was the eight-run tenth inning on Friday night, in a game in which the Fisher Cats tied their franchise record for strikeouts of opponents while also recording 20 hits.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: June 16, 2013- The Fisher Cats set a home franchise record in a 22-1 win over Erie on Father's Day. One day after losing to Erie 16-2, the Fisher Cats took a 17-0 lead after four innings, and finished with 23 hits. Brad Glenn and Adam Loewen homered in the first inning, and Loewen homered again in the third. Loewen and Kevin Nolan each finished with five RBI, and A.J. Jimenez went five-for-six. Marcus Stroman allowed one run in six innings to earn the win.

MANCHESTER BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays could not hold a 5-2 lead, falling 6-5 in the series opener with the Yankees in Buffalo. Bo Bichette's 14th homer in the third inning gave Toronto an early 2-1 lead. After Robbie Ray left the game, the Yankees rallied to tie in the seventh, and scored the game-winner on a Clint Frazier double off Jordan Romano to win it...Buffalo hammered Rochester 14-1. It was a good night for Fisher Cats alums as Richard Urena and Kevin Smith each homered twice, Cullen Large and Logan Warmoth also went deep...Everett over Vancouver 16-9, Clearwater defeated Dunedin 9-7.

COMING UP: The Fisher Cats host Hartford (Colorado) for the first time this season this week, before getting their first taste of interdivisional play when they travel to Bowie to face the division-leading Baysox (Baltimore).

STARTERS: Troy Miller, the University of Michigan product, looks to follow up his strong effort last Thursday in Portland. Miller allowed three runs in six innings to pick up his first Double-A win. He will take over in the top of the second in game one.

Curtis Taylor, the Coquitlam, B.C. native, will start game two in what is expected to be a bullpen game. Taylor has not started a game since May 22nd, 2019, with Montgomery.

David Hill was drafted in the fourth round of the 2015 draft (Univ. of San Diego). Hill made his first Double-A start for the Yard Goats last Thursday in Reading, and left in the second inning after allowing four hits and walking three. Hill will start game one, and Will Gaddis will start game two.

Gaddis, who was born in nearby Merrimack, NH, is 0-5 with a 7.62 ERA, and his last start was against Bowie where he gave up six runs, five earned, on eight hits over four innings. Since that start on June 4th, Gaddis has made two appearances in relief, going two innings in each game.
