YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 3-2. In the bottom of the second, Victor Bericoto led off with a double and scored on a single by Scott Bandura, who stole second and scored on a double by Carter Howell. Bo Davidson followed with a two-out, RBI single to open a 3-0 lead. Joe Whitman held Akron scoreless through his first five innings before Guy Lipscomb broke the shutout with an RBI single in the sixth. In the top of the eighth, Wuilfredo Antunez hit a solo homer to pull the RubberDucks within a run. Ryan Murphy made his first Richmond appearance of the season and allowed one run over 2.2 innings. Tyler Vogel entered with a runner on base in the ninth and recorded the final out to close his fourth Double-A save.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. Richmond is in fourth place in the Southwest Divisions second-half standings, 1.5 games behind Akron, 2.5 games behind Harrisburg and 3.5 games behind Altoona. The RubberDucks swept a three-game series at The Diamond to open the season in April. Richmond went 1-5 at Akron from April 22-27 and 5-1 at Canal Park from July 8-13.

CELEBRATING THE 80s: Tonight is 1980s Night in the Flying Squirrels' "Diamond Through the Decades" series, a celebration of The Diamond's 40th anniversary and final season. Former Richmond Braves pitcher **Steve Shields** is at the ballpark tonight. He was a member of the R-Braves from 1984-1986 and spent five seasons in the majors with the Braves, Yankees, Mariners, Twins and Royals. Shields' first season in Richmond was the final season of Parker Field in 1984, and he went 9-4 with a 4.75 ERA. On April 17, 1985, Shields started the first game at The Diamond against the Syracuse Chiefs and allowed one unearned run over eight innings with eight strikeouts. He was called up to the majors that June to make his debut with Atlanta. Shields returned to Richmond in 1986 and pitched several key games, including a win over Syracuse on Aug. 18 to move them into first place and the game that clinched the IL pennant on Aug. 28 at Rochester. He also started the decisive Game 5 of the 1986 Governors Cup championship series at The Diamond on Sept. 12, 1986, and threw a complete-game, five-hit shutout in a 4-0 Richmond win over Rochester to clinch to title. **Bruce Baldwin**, who was the R-Braves general manager from 1987-2008, will also be recognized pregame.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,539 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks eighth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in fourth place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 3.5 games behind first-place Altoona. They split last week's series in Bowie against the Baysox. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six-of-seven from July 22-30 before going 12-12 in their last 24 games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 72 losses this season, 40 of them have been by two runs or less (24 by one, 16 by two). Their 24 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading.

THE RUBBERDUCKS are in third place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, three games behind first-place Altoona. The RubberDucks split last week's series against the Fisher Cats after winning five-of-six the previous week at Reading. Akron's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects, including SS Angel Genao (No. 2), RHP Khal Stephen (No. 6), C Jacob Cozart (No. 18) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 27). MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list features five Akron players, including Genao (No. 3), Stephen (No. 7), OF Alfonsin Rosario (No. 13), Cozart (No. 18) and Hartle (No. 25).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Nick Zwack makes his seventh Double-A start of the year and the fourth appearance of his career against the RubberDucks. He last pitched on Friday against the Baysox on the road and allowed four runs, the most in a Double-A outing this year, over 4.2 innings with five strikeouts. Zwack missed all of last year and the beginning of this season with an elbow injury. He began rehab work with the ACL Giants on May 20 and pitched six scoreless starts, spanning 12.1 innings. He made four starts with High-A Eugene before being assigned to Richmond on July 19. Zwack was selected by the New York Mets in the 17th round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Xavier. He was traded to the Giants along with J.D. Davis, Carson Seymour and Thomas Szapucki for Darin Ruf on August 2, 2022. Zwack spent the 2023 season with the Flying Squirrels and went 5-7 with a 6.56 ERA in 24 outings, including 16 starts. For more on Zwack, see page two.

FOR AKRON: Left-hander Josh Hartle makes his second Double-A start. He made his debut for the RubberDucks last Friday against the Fisher Cats and allowed three runs over four innings in a no-decision. Hartle started the season with High-A Lake County and went 10-2 with a 2.35 ERA in 22 starts. At the time of his promotion, Hartle led the Midwest League in wins (10), ranked fourth in innings pitched (103.1) and sixth in strikeouts (100). He was selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the third round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of Wake Forest. Hartle was traded to Cleveland on December 10, 2024, along with pitchers Luis Ortiz and Michael Kennedy in exchange for first baseman Spencer Horwitz.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan, Onil Perez and Drew Cavanaugh have combined to catch 65 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 45 runners caught stealing, Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 58 runners caught stealing for his career is second-most in franchise history. He is one behind the Flying Squirrels career record of 59, set by Williams (2010-11, '15).

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto hit his 11th homer of the season last Friday night, which leads all Richmond players for the year. It was the 33rd homer of his Flying Squirrels career, which is tied for second-most in team history with **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) and four behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 130 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In 23 August games, Bericoto is batting .289 (22-for-76) with three homers, three doubles, 14 walks and 13 RBIs.

CROES CONTROL: Since joining the Flying Squirrels on August 5, Dayson Croes is batting .328 (19-for-58) with a homer, two doubles, a triple, nine RBIs and five walks in 16 games. He hit a two-run single in his Double-A debut on August 6 at Erie. On Thursday against the Curve, he picked up three hits, including his first Double-A homer. Croes is the first player in Flying Squirrels history born in Aruba. He played four seasons at NCAA DII Quincy before spending two seasons with the Winnipeg Goldeyes of the independent American Association, where he hit .347 in 187 games. Croes signed with the Giants on April and played nine games in the Arizona Complex League before spending 47 games with High-A Eugene.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 10 games since August 9, Sabin Ceballos is batting .353 (12-for-34) with two homers, four doubles and 10 RBIs. For the season, he is tied for the team lead with 39 RBIs. On August 13 against the Curve, Ceballos hit a two-run homer in the first inning and matched his season high with four RBIs. On Saturday night at Chesapeake, he had two hits, including a solo homer in the second inning. In his last 33 games since July 3, Ceballos is batting .281 (32-for-114) with four homers, eight doubles and 19 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: Diego Velasquez has worked 62 walks this year, which is tied for third-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, tied with Jarrett Parker and Mark Minicozzi's previous franchise records for the 2023 season. Jacob Heyward set a new record with 80 walks in 2019 and Hayden Cantrelle moved into second on the list with 66 walks in 2023. Velasquez is tied for fourth in the Eastern League in walks this season.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked tied for fourth in walks (62), fifth in hits (105) and 10th in OBP (.357). **Turner Hill** is tied for ninth in triples (5). **John Michael Bertrand** is second in innings pitched (119.2), third in ERA (2.93), ninth in BAA (.252) and ninth in WHIP (1.35). **Jack Choate** is tied for fifth in strikeouts (114). **Joe Whitman** is tied for fifth in strikeouts (114). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 248 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 3), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Joe Whitman (No. 11) and Jack Choate (No. 30). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1968: The Richmond Braves lost to the Columbus Jets, 5-1, at Parker Field. Down, 1-0, in the bottom of the ninth, Dave Nicholson hit his 30th homer of the season, setting a new Richmond International League record, passing the previous record of 29 by Don Lock in 1961 with the Virginians. Al Oliver hit a go-ahead single for Columbus in the top of the 13th inning to break the tie. Elvio Jimenez, Manny Sanguillen and Richie Hebner followed with consecutive RBI singles to extend the lead to 5-1. 1986: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 2-1, at Silver Stadium. Steve Shields started and threw a complete game, winning his sixth straight decision that month. He allowed one run on a solo homer by Nelson Simmons in the fifth inning. Shields allowed three hits, no walks and struck out eight. Richmond scored both of its runs in the second. Gerald Perry hit an RBI triple and came in to score on a sacrifice fly by John Rabb. **2017:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 2-1, at The Diamond. Brandon Bednar brought home the winning run with a walk-off single in the bottom of the 15th inning. Caleb Gindl made the first pitching appearance of his career and threw two scoreless innings. 2021: The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 15-3, at Peoples Natural Gas Field. Will Wilson hit a three-run homer in the fifth and drove in four in the game. David Villar had three hits and six RBIs, including a three-run homer in the eighth inning. It was his 18th home run of the season, tying Mario Lisson and Jarrett Parker for the most in a season in franchise history.
