**JUNE 23<sup>rd</sup> TOLEDO (0-0)/(34-40) at WORCESTER (0-0)/(36-35) 6:45 pm**

**Toledo Mud Hens RHP Jack Little (1-1, 3.38) vs. Worcester Red Sox LHP Patrick Sandoval (0-1, 6.48)**

***We Start Anew*** – The Worcester Red Sox – who finished the official first half of the season with a winning record at 36-35 and the Toledo Mud Hens (AAA-Detroit Tigers) who ended the first half with a 34-40 mark - begin the second half of the International League schedule tonight with undefeated records when they play the opener of a 6-game series at 6:45 pm at Polar Park in Worcester. All IL teams start anew with 0-0 records beginning this evening and will play the next 75 games (through September 20) to determine a 2<sup>nd</sup> half champ and the opponent to take on 1<sup>st</sup> half champ Memphis (AAA-St. Louis) in the International League Playoffs three months from now (September 22-24 in Memphis, TN). Tonight's series and second half opener at Polar Park is televised live on NESN+ and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM & The Pike 100.1 FM.

***Half Marathon*** - The WooSox finished the first half of the season with a 36-35 good for a tie for 4<sup>th</sup>-place in the International League East division (tied for 10<sup>th</sup> overall in the 20-team IL). The WooSox did have four games cancelled due to weather so they only played 71 of their scheduled 75 first half games. The Sox also played on 31 games at home in the 1<sup>st</sup> half (17-14) compared to 40 road games (19-21). Worcester's first half rankings among the 20 teams in the International League: Offensively 13<sup>th</sup> in **Batting** (.247), 17<sup>th</sup> in **Runs** (347), tied for 19<sup>th</sup> in **HR** (63), and 9<sup>th</sup> in **OBP** (.347). WooSox pitchers were 7<sup>th</sup> in the league in **ERA** (4.54) and had the 5<sup>th</sup> lowest **Batting Average Against** (.241). And the WooSox had a +2 scoring margin (scoring 347 runs while allowing 345).

***Second Half Adjustments*** – In 2023 for the first-time ever, the International League went to a split season schedule – playing 75 games in the first half with a first half champion (best overall record) and then starting fresh in the second half for the next 75 games (with a second half champ as well). The scenario was so well-received, the league has kept the same format since. Last year the Sox went 41-33 in the 1<sup>st</sup> half and 35-40 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half to finish with a 76-73 overall record (their 5<sup>th</sup> winning season in their five years).

***The Journey to Memphis*** – The Memphis Redbirds were the overall first half IL champions with their 47-28 record edging Rochester who finished 45-28 (the Red Wings had two games cancelled due to weather). Memphis thus captured the subsequent playoff berth that comes with being the best in the first half. The team with the best overall record in the second half will play Memphis in the IL Playoffs in a best 2 out of 3 series from September 22-24 with all three of those games in Tennessee. The International League Champion will take on the Pacific Coast League Champion in the winner-take-all Triple-A National Championship Game on September 26 in Las Vegas. The Las Vegas Aces (AAA-Athletics) won the PCL first half with their 44-29 record.

***Welcome Home*** – After 14 straight days on the road and 11 games from June 8-21, the WooSox enjoyed their usual Monday off-day at home yesterday and now begin the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of their schedule with this 6-game series against the Toledo Mud Hens beginning this evening at 6:45 pm at Polar Park. Note that weeknight home game times this week – with schools closed for the summer - will be 6:45 pm from now until the last week of August. So, the series vs. Toledo will feature four night games at 6:45 pm (tonight – Friday) and then usual Polar Park weekend start times of 4:05 pm on Saturday and 1:05 pm on Sunday.

***The Long and Winding Road*** – Two weeks ago, it appeared the WooSox were poised to begin their longest roadtrip (13-games) in their 5½ year history. However, thanks to a pair of cancelled games in Rochester (G2 of a make-up doubleheader on June 11 and then a single game on June 14), the trip was reduced to 11-games. Worcester went 4-7 on the trip...dropping 4 of 5 during their abbreviated series in Rochester and splitting their most recent set at Lehigh Valley this past week/weekend.

Has hit in 10 of his last 12 games (17-for-50, .340) with 3 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, 8 runs. Has a .308 batting average in 33 road games (37-for-120) with a team-high 18 RBI in away games.

**Allan Castro**

Last 18 games is 23-for-69, .333.

**Matt Thaiss**

Hit in 3 of his last 4 games (6-for-15) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 4 RBI.

**Braiden Ward**

Has reached base safely in 31 of his last 34 starts. Has 29 straight steals without being caught and leads the league with 32 SB. Has been hit by pitch 16 times in his 49 games played to lead the league. Those 16 HBP are already an all-time WooSox record. The Pawtucket Red Sox record for Most HBP in a season is 20 set by David Eckstein in 2000. Ward leads the WooSox with .319 batting average at home in 21 games (23-for-72) with 20 SB.

**Holy Toledo!** - Toledo and Worcester have played 30 times since first meeting on May 3, 2022 and the Mud Hens have won 19 of those 30 games including an 11-7 record here at Polar Park and an 8-4 record at Fifth Third Field in Ohio. The clubs met for one series last year with Toledo taking 4 of 6 from the WooSox here at Polar Park from April 29 – May 4, 2025.

**Trying to Turn the Beat Around** – Worcester has lost 3 of 4 and 7 of their last 10 games following a 4-game winning streak from June 4-9.

**Winners at Home But Not Away** - The WooSox are 17-14 at home at Polar Park compared to 19-21 on the road.

**Highs and Lows** – The WooSox (at 36-35 now) have been a season-high 6-games over .500 four different times this season...April 10 (9-3) & April 12 (10-4) and May 2 (18-12) & May 8 (21-15). Worcester dipped to a season-low 2-games under .500 from May 23-25 when they were 23-25 on the year during those three days. Their low point last season was 4-games below .500 on April 11 at 4-8.

**Getting in Tune in June** - The WooSox are 9-8 in June with a week to go in the month. Worcester pitchers have a 4.35 ERA in June (71-for-147) while batters are hitting .256 (146-for-571) with 17 HR. The Sox have been out-scored by their opponents, 78-77.

**Day Dream Believers** - The WooSox have fared pretty well in day games (morning or afternoon) this season going 19-14 compared to 17-21 at night.

**Homer Helpers** – Worcester has homered in 11 straight games since June 9 (all 11 games during their past roadtrip) for a total of 13 HR. They have hit 1 homer in ten of those games and 3 HR in one game (June 18 at Lehigh Valley). The good news is the WooSox are 27-13 when they homer in a game this season. The bad news is the fact the WooSox are tied with Gwinnett for the fewest HR in the International League with 63 HR.

**Series Matters** – The WooSox are 6-5-2 in their 13 series thus far...6 wins, 5 losses, and 2 splits. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

**Streaks of Five** – Worcester recently had a 4-game losing streak (June 10-13), but they avoided their third 5-game losing skid of the season with their 5-3 victory at Lehigh Valley on June 16. Also this month, the WooSox had a 5-game winning streak (June 4-9) to match their season-best 5-game winning streak from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota. Those are their longest winning streak since a club-record 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025. The WooSox had a 5-game losing streak (May 19-23 all at home vs. Rochester) to equal their season-high 5-game losing skid from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). Worcester's longest losing streak all of last year was also 5 games (April 25-30, 2025). They have still not lost 6 straight since a 6-game losing streak from May 22-28, 2024.

**Cancel Culture** - Worcester has had four games cancelled due to weather (all in the 1<sup>st</sup> half) – April 3 at St. Paul, May 9 at home vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Game 2 of a make-up doubleheader at Rochester on June 11, and June 14 also at Rochester.

**Weather or Not** – The WooSox have had four games cancelled due to inclement weather (one at home & three on the road) and three others postponed this season (one at home & two on the road). Last year the WooSox set a new club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season with nine (along with two other road games postponed).

**May We Skip the Month** – Worcester's 10-15 record in May was the second worst month they have ever had behind only a 10-16 month of July during their inaugural season of 2021. Worcester has been remarkably consistent in their history and more recently since August of 2024 they have had just three losing months in their last ten months. The WooSox went 15-10 this April.

**Monthly Team Stats for May** – Worcester hitters batted .235 this May (193-for-823) with 41 doubles, 4 triples, and 22 HR in 25 games while WooSox pitchers had a 4.85 ERA (118 ER in 219 IP) with 29 HRA. The Sox out-scored by their opponents, 126-110.

**Monthly Individual Leaders for May** – WooSox May leaders offensively included: Anthony Seigler at .344 in 18 games last month (22-for-64) with 3 HR & 14 RBI and Nate Eaton at .289 in 19 games (22-for-76) with 6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI. On the pitching side: Tommy Kahnle made 11 scoreless relief appearances in May covering 11 shutout innings; Alec Gamboa was 1-2, 1.89 in 5 G, 3 GS (4 ER in 19 IP); Eduardo Rivera was 3-0, 2.20 in 8 RA (4 ER in 16.1); and Noah Song was 1-0, 2.25 in 7 RA (3 ER in 12 IP).

**An Enjoyable April** – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1<sup>st</sup>-place in the International League East Division. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

**April Stats Leaders** – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. Vinny Capra led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. Matt Thaiss (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), Nate Eaton (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and Kristian Campbell (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were Payton Tolle (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and Jake Bennett (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) while Tayron Guerrero was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

**A Winning Tradition** – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

**How the WooSox Have Won** - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

**Fun Fact** – Of the 289 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5½-year history (up to today), a total of 213 of them have played in the Major Leagues (74%) including 147 with the Boston Red Sox (51%).

**Portland Sea Dogs Update** – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs finished the 1<sup>st</sup> half of their Eastern League schedule with a 35-33 record good for 3<sup>rd</sup>-place and 4-games behind division champ Hartford. They open the 2<sup>nd</sup> half tonight against those Yard Goats in Hartford.

**WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES** – The Red Sox today transferred the injury rehab assignments of LHP **Patrick Sandoval** and INF **Romy Gonzalez** from Double-A Portland to Worcester. Sandoval makes the start for the WooSox tonight while Gonzalez will bat 2<sup>nd</sup> and DH. In addition, the Red Sox today assigned catcher **Andrew Knizner** (KIZZ-ner) to Worcester after signing the veteran catcher as a free agent on Sunday. The WooSox placed catcher **Juan Montero** on the development list to create a spot for Knizner.

**Knizner**, 31, was released by Colorado on June 19. In 33 games for Albuquerque (AAA-Colorado) of the Pacific Coast League he was hitting .279 with 10 HR & 22 RBI. Signed by Seattle to a Major League deal prior to the 2026 season, Knizner did not make the Mariners Opening Day roster and subsequently signed a Minor League deal with the Rockies. A 7<sup>th</sup> round pick by St. Louis in the 2016 Draft out of North Carolina State, Andrew has played 323 games in the majors with St. Louis (2019-23), Texas (2024), and San Francisco (2025) and has a career average of .211 with 19 HR & 90 RBI. In 7 Minor League seasons he has hit .301 with 50 HR & 227 RBI in 399 games.

**Gonzalez**, 29, has been on Boston's 60-day injured list since March 12 as he recovered from a successful left shoulder arthroscopic debridement on March 12. He began an injury rehab assignment with Double-A Portland on June 16 and in three games (June 16, 17, and 19) he went 1-for-7 with 1 HR & 2 RBI while playing 2B, DH, and 1B in his three games. Romy (RO-me) did get hit by a pitch on June 17 and that caused some left hip flexor soreness keeping him out of the Sea Dogs lineup on June 20. Gonzalez had an excellent season for Boston last year batting .305 in 96 games with 9 HR & 53 RBI and was especially effective vs. left-handed pitching batting .331 with 7 of his 9 homers vs. lefties. He made 41 starts at 1B, 32 at 2B, 1 at 3B, and 2 as the DH. During his five-year Major League career with the White Sox (2021-23) and Red Sox (2024-25), Romy has played every position except for catcher.

Worcester has made at least one player move during 55 of the last 78 days (including today) between April 7 – June 23 for a total of 104 moves during that stretch. The WooSox went three consecutive days without a player transaction (May 30, May 31, and June 1 – although they did not play on June 1) for the first and only time since just after their season-opener when they did not make a move during four straight days from March 28-31.

The WooSox have used a total of 48 players already this season (32 pitchers and 16 position players). Gonzalez will be #49 and Knizner #50.

Furthermore, 14 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers). The lucky list: RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Tyler Uberstine, LHP Tyler Samaniego (three times), RHP Jack Anderson (twice), LHP Eduardo Rivera, LHP Payton Tolle, OF Nate Eaton (twice), LHP Jake Bennett (twice), LHP Alec Gamboa (twice), C/INF Mickey Gasper, INF Nick Sogard, RHP Tyron Guerrero, INF Anthony Seigler (twice), and RHP Tommy Kahnle. In addition, the WooSox had their manager, Chad Tracy and hitting coach, Collin Hetzler both promoted to Boston for those same roles with the Red Sox on April 26.
