## NEWS AND NOTES

**THE HARD WAY:** Brewers no. 17-rated prospect Tyson Hardin will make his third Triple-A start after a promotion from Double-A Biloxi on May 17. Hardin worked a quality start in his first appearance, going 7.0 IP with two runs (1 ER) and six strikeouts against the Iowa Cubs. He was an out shy of a second straight quality start to begin his Triple-A career last week in Durham working 5.2 IP with one run allowed and seven strikeouts to earn his first Triple-A win. He has made five career starts against Braves affiliates, going 1-2 with a 3.93 ERA (11 ER/25.2 IP) with 27 strikeouts and six walks. Two of his five starts were quality outings against Double-A Columbus.

**YO QUERO:** Jefferson Quero clubbed his sixth homer of the season with a two-run home run to left field, cutting into the Stripers lead 5-2 in the bottom of the seventh inning. That homer marked his third two-run blast of the year, his fifth off right-handed pitchers and his third at First Horizon Park this season. Quero has posted a hit in seven-of-his-last-10 games and his first homer since May 14 against the Iowa Cubs. He recorded his 11th multi-hit game of the season which is fifth on the team. The multi-RBI game marked his ninth of the year, which ties for the second-best on the team behind Eddys Leonard (10). Quero's 32 RBI are the fifth-best amongst qualified Brewers minor league players this season and second on Nashville's roster behind Leonard (33).

**PRATT ATTACK:** Cooper Pratt extended his on-base streak to 17 consecutive games on Wednesday night, finishing the night 1-for-4 with a run. The 17 consecutive games are currently leading the team for the longest-active on-base streak and ties for the third-longest overall on the team with Greg Jones. Pratt has posted a .269 batting average (18-for-67), three doubles, four homers and 17 RBI during his streak. He is currently tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the International League and tied for 14th in Triple-A level. The Brewers no. 4-rated prospect has recorded at least a hit in 11-of-his-last-15 games, posting a .295 batting average, 7 XBH and 16 RBI since May 8.

**WAGS TO PITCHES:** Jacob Waguespack has worked seven straight games without allowing an earned run since April 17th. Over the span, the right-hander has a save and has allowed just four hits with 18 strikeouts and eight walks over 10.0 IP. He's holding opponents to a .118 BAA (4-for-34). His streak includes a season-high six strikeout outing over 3.0 IP on May 1 vs. Norfolk which tied for the second-most strikeouts in any relief appearance of his professional career and his longest relief appearance since April 8, 2024, at the Los Angeles Angels. His seven games are tied for the third-longest active streak on the team along with Rob Zastryzny and tied for the 12th-longest streak in the International League.

**BIG JUNIOR:** Junior Fernández extended his streak without an earned run to six consecutive games on Wednesday night, tossing 1.1 innings of work and adding two strikeouts. The six consecutive games are tied for the fifth-highest active streak on the team with Drew Rom. He has posted 6.0 innings, allowed four hits and struck out four batters since May 12 when the streak began. Fernández's career-high streak without an earned run in the minors sits at 10 consecutive games with Triple-A Memphis in 2019 (1-0, 13.0 IP, 5 H, 13 K, 6 BB). He also tied his career-high 10 consecutive games between earned runs allowed with the St. Louis Cardinals in 2022 (13.0 IP, 9 H, 9 K, 5 BB).

**EIGHT IT GREAT:** Luis Matos extended his hitting streak to eight straight games with a two-RBI single in the bottom of the first. It's tied for the third-longest hitting streak for a Nashville player this season along with Cooper Pratt (4/24-5/1). The eight-game streak is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the International League. Matos has reached base in all 10 games he has played with Nashville this season and is hitting .353 (12-for-34) with a home run, double, and five RBI. Tuesday night was his second multi-RBI game of the year and first since also driving home a pair of May 7 on the road in Louisville. It's his longest hitting streak since posting a 10-game streak from August 15-26 of last year between Triple-A Sacramento and San Francisco. He also had an eight-game streak earlier in the 2025 season from June 1-13.
