SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Curve, 4-2, in the series finale at PNG Field. The loss eliminated Richmond from the second-half postseason chase. Altoona took a 1-0 lead in the third with a double-play groundout. In the third, P.J. Hilson hit an RBI single and Mitch Jebb plated a run with a sacrifice fly to extend the lead to 3-0. **Bo Davidson** hit a two-run double to center in the top of the seventh to pull the Flying Squirrels within a run. Termarr Johnson scored on a wild pitch in the bottom of the eighth to extend Altoona's lead to 4-2.

DIAMOND'S AREN'T FOREVER: This week, the Flying Squirrels play the final series at The Diamond before moving to neighboring CarMax Park for the 2026 season. The Diamond has been home to professional baseball in Richmond for 40 years. From 1985-2008, it served as the home ballpark for the Richmond Braves, Atlanta's Triple-A club. Since 2010, it has been the Flying Squirrels' home. Since the first game at The Diamond on April 17, 1985, the ballpark has hosted 16,622,467 fans.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the first of a six-game, season-ending series against the Hartford Yard Goats, Double-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies. This is the first series between these two teams since the Yard Goats came to The Diamond last August for a six-game series split. The Flying Squirrels have won five consecutive home games at The Diamond.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,578 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks eighth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS were eliminated from postseason contention with Sunday's loss in Altoona. After winning the final five games of their last home series against Akron, Richmond dropped five-of-six in last week's road series at Altoona. Of Richmond's 77 losses this season, 43 of them have been by two runs or less (25 by one, 18 by two). Their 25 one-run losses are second-most in the EL, one less than Reading.

THE YARD GOATS are in third place in the Northeast Division second-half standings. They are 3.5 games behind second-place Somerset for a spot in the postseason. They split last week's series at home against Reading, dropping the final two games on Saturday and Sunday. Hartford's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Rockies prospects list, including OF/3B Charlie Condon (No. 2), OF Jared Thomas (No. 3), OF Cole Carrigg (No. 4), LHP Welinton Herrera (No. 12), 2B Roc Riggio (No. 16) and LHP Sean Sullivan (No. 18). MLB.com's top-30 Rockies prospects list features nine Hartford players, including Condon (No. 2), Carrigg (No. 3), Thomas (No. 8), Riggio (No. 11), Sullivan (No. 13), Herrera (No. 20), LHP Konner Eaton (No. 22), LHP Michael Prosecky (No. 23) and LHP Ben Shields (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Ryan Murphy makes his second start of the season. He last pitched on Wednesday at Altoona and allowed three runs over three innings in a no-decision. It was his first start since June 1, 2024 after missing the second half of last year and most of this season while recovering from Tommy John surgery. Murphy is in his fourth season with the Flying Squirrels. He first reached Double-A for two starts in 2022 before a season-ending injury. After spending all of the 2023 season at Double-A, he made 11 starts last season, going 1-4 with a 3.35 ERA before an injury kept him out until August of this year. Murphy was selected by the Giants in the fifth round of the 2020 MLB Draft out of Le Moyne (N.Y.) College. For more on Murphy, see page two.

FOR HARTFORD: Left-hander Ben Shields makes his 10th Double-A start of the season and his fifth for Hartford. He last pitched last Tuesday against Reading and allowed one run over 3.1 innings, striking out five. Shields was signed by the New York Yankees in 2023. He was traded along with Roc Riggio to the Rockies on July 31 for Jake Bird. Since the trade, Shields is 1-0 with a 1.96 ERA (4 ER/18.1 IP) in four starts. Last year, he made 11 appearances (nine starts) for Somerset and went 2-2 with a 3.12 ERA. This year, he began the season on the injured list before joining Somerset in late-June. He went 1-2 with a 3.42 ERA (9 ER/23.2 IP) in five starts before the trade. Shields is ranked by MLB.com as the No. 30 Rockies prospect.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan, Onil Perez and Drew Cavanaugh have combined to catch 68 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 47 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 60 runners caught stealing for his career is the most in franchise history, passing Williams' (2010-11, '15) previous mark of 59.

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto has 12 homers this season, which leads all Richmond players for the year. On Saturday night, he hit the 34th homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him ahead **Jacob Heyward** (2019, '21-22) for second on the franchise's all-time homer list. He is three behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. Bericoto now has 139 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In his last 33 games since August 1, Bericoto is batting .350 (41-for-117) with four homers, four doubles, 17 walks and 22 RBIs.

IT'S BO TIME!: Bo Davidson is batting .305 (18-for-59) with four homers, two doubles and eight RBIs in his last 12 games dating back to August 23. His nine-game hit streak was snapped last Wednesday night. On August 29 against the RubberDucks, he had his second two-homer game at Double-A and drove in three runs. Davidson has reached base in 19 consecutive games dating back to August 15, which is the longest streak by a Flying SquirreIs player this season.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In his last 19 games since August 9, Sabin Ceballos is batting .382 (26-for-68) with three homers, seven doubles and 18 RBIs. For the season, he leads the team lead with 47 RBIs. He had four consecutive multi-hit and multi-RBI games to close last week's series against Akron. In his last 42 games since July 3, Ceballos is batting .311 (46-for-148) with six homers, 11 doubles and 29 RBIs.

TAKE A WALK: Diego Velasquez has worked 68 walks this year, which is the second-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, passing Hayden Cantrelle's 2023 mark (66). Jacob Heyward set a new record with 80 walks in 2019 Velasquez is second in the Eastern League in walks this season.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is second in walks (68), fourth in hits (115) and sixth in OBP (.360). Turner Hill is tied for ninth in triples (5). John Michael Bertrand is first in ERA (2.87), second in innings pitched (131.2), sixth in BAA (.249) and sixth in WHIP (1.31). Jack Choate is fifth in strikeouts (121). Joe Whitman is sixth in strikeouts (119) and eighth in innings pitched (110.1). Tyler Myrick is tied for first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 266 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Joe Whitman** (No. 11) and **Jack Choate** (No. 30). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1960: The Richmond Virginians beat the Miami Marlins, 3-2, at Parker Field. Deron Johnson hit a two-run homer to center field in the fourth inning to break a 1-1 tie. It was his 27th homer of the year, matching his own franchise record from 1958. 2004: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 2-1, in Game 1 of the International League semifinals. Adam Stern, who came into the game to replace ejected Ryan Langerhans, hit a go-ahead double in the top of the 13th to give Richmond a 2-1 lead. He had just been called up from Double-A Greenville the previous day. 2011: The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 6-0, in Game 1 of the Western Division Series. It was the first postseason game in franchise history. Daryl Maday threw seven scoreless innings and allowed four hits. Hector Correa pitched the final two innings. Chris Dominguez hit a solo homer in the second and finished with three hits and three RBIs. The game was supposed to be played in Harrisburg but was moved to The Diamond due to flooding on City Island. 2023: The Flying Squirrels beat the Akron RubberDucks, 5-4, at The Diamond. Ismael Munguia hit a solo homer and Andy Thomas added a two-run double for a 3-0 lead in the first. Akron cut the score to 3-1 in the third with a solo homer by Petey Halpin, the only run allowed in four innings by starter Hayden Birdsong. After an error scored a Richmond run in the fourth, Bryce Ball hit a two-run homer in the fifth and added a solo homer in the eighth to tie the game, 4-4. Thomas gave Richmond a 5-4 lead in the bottom of the eighth with an RBI single. Tyler Myrick threw a scoreless ninth to finish the game.
