TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Chihuahuas meet for game two after El Paso claimed the series opener, 12-4, last night ... Albuquerque has lost 11 of its last 13 contests ... Lefty Josh Rogers is expected to take the hill for Albuquerque while former Isotope Ryan Carpenter is slated to start for the Chihuahuas.

THREE-BAGGERS: Julio Carreras swatted his third triple on the year and the Isotopes Triple-A-leading 12th of 2024 last night. The club has a three-bagger in eight of 16 games.

MARGINS: Albuquerque's first six losses of the year were all by either one or two runs. Over their last seven defeats, the Isotopes have lost by eight-plus runs in five of those contests (other two losses were both by three runs).

VS. EL PASO: The Chihuahuas have won three of the first four games of the season series after taking two of three to begin the year. Albuquerque has lost two-straight to El Paso for the first time since losing 11-straight from Aug. 2- Sept. 10, 2022 (five in El Paso and six in Albuquerque).

RUNS IN A FRAME: Albuquerque relented eight runs in the third frame yesterday, the third time in 2024 the club has surrendered eight-plus runs in an inning and second time to El Paso (last: eight, March 31, series finale).

DOUBLE-DIGIT TALLIES: The Isotopes have conceded double-digit runs in seven contents this year and in six of their last eight games (95 runs during span).

TAKE YOUR BASE: Albuquerque issued 11 walks last night, the second-most allowed this year (most: franchise record 14, April 9 vs. Sugar Land).

DINGERS: The Isotopes pitching staff has allowed a dinger in six-straight contests (15 during span). It's the longest such streak since relenting a clout in nine-straight from Sept. 1-10, 2023 ... The club has relented 25 home runs on the year, the third-most in Triple-A (most: Charlotte, 38).

ERROR 404: Albuquerque committed two errors in last night's contest, the club's sixth game with multiple miscues in a contest. The Isotopes' 19 errors on the season are the most in all of Triple.A

BY WAY OF THE K: For the year, the club's 171 punchouts are tied for the fourth-most in Triple-A (most: Omaha, 165).

SWIPES: The Isotopes have allowed a stolen base in sevenstraight contests (13 during stretch). MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck drove in a run on a sac fly yesterday, his third-straight game with an RBI, a season-high streak ... However, his 34 game on-base streak (since Aug. 18, 2023, with Double-A Hartford) came to an end after going 0-for-3 with no walks.

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of Beck's 39 batted balls in play, 16 have left the bat over 100-MPH. Highest EV: 108.6 MPH, 1B (3/29 vs. ELP).

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman did not collect a hit in three at-bats last night, his sixth hitless contest of 2024 Reached base in 22 of the 29 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 20 ... Of Goodman's 40 batted balls hit into play this year, 16 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.

TONY: Drew Romo extended his hitting streak to seven games with a single yesterday. During the span, he is slashing .393/.393/.429 with a double and three RBI.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk extended his hitting streak to five games with an RBI single last night. Over the streak, he is slashing .300/.391/.400 with two doubles, five RBI and two walks.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron has a hit in all seven games played in 2024 ... Tallied a season-high three RBI Sunday, most since a career-high five Sept. 17, 2023. at ELP.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard drew a walk last night and has reached base in 12 of the 13 games he's played in 2024.

BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard belted his first home run of the season last night in the opening frame. It was also his first extra-base hit since a double on April 6 at Oklahoma City ... He also tallied multiple RBI for the second time in 2024.

EXIT VELO: Of the six batted balls registered at 100 MPH-plus last night, the Isotopes recorded four of them. Aaron Schunk connected on the second-hardest hit ball of the night: 104.2 MPH lineout. Greg Jones tallied two exit velocities over 100-MPH: 102.5 MPH (lineout) and 101.5 MPH (single).

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Hunter Goodman is 3rd in doubles (7) ... Sean Bouchard is 2nd in triples (4) ... Jordan Beck is 7th in XBH (10) ... Greg Jones is T-5th in stolen bases (8) Julio Carreras is T-3rd in triples (3).

LOB: The Isotopes left five men on-base last night. The club's 130 LOB is fourth-most in all of Triple-A (most: Nashville, 136).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Signed a Minor League contract with Miami on Aug. 10, 2022 and finished the campaign at Triple-A Jacksonville
- Played for the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod League in 2014 and 2015
- 2014 and 2015 NCAA Louisville Regional All-Tournament Team
