The Round Rock Express and Oklahoma City Comets (Los Angeles Dodgers) will play game five of their series on Saturday at Dell Diamond. The series is even at two games apiece so far. First pitch is slated for 7:15 p.m. CT.

COMETS TAKE GAME FOUR

The Express fell to the Comets by a final of 8-2 on Friday. Oklahoma City loaded the bases and LF Steward Berroa hit a sacrifice fly giving the Comets a 1-0 lead in the first. The Express put two on with a DH Chad Wallach single and a walk from LF Kellen Strahm. RF Marcus Smith smoked a double into right-center scoring two and Round Rock led 2-1 in the second. The Comets response came with six runs on four hits in the top of the third. DH Hunter Feduccia hit a bases-loaded single that scored one. 3B Nick Senzel then launched a grand slam onto the berm in left field. A pitch later, CF Justin Dean belted his third homer of the year extending the Oklahoma City lead to 7-2. In the fifth, Berroa drew a leadoff walk then stole second. He moved to third on a groundout and scored on Senzel's single. The Comets led 8-2 before the game was suspended in the middle of the fifth due to lightning in the area. Following the 45-minute delay, the Comets held Round Rock to just two hits in the final five innings ultimately tying the series with their 8-2 win.

CORY COMING UP

RHP Cory Abbott is set to make his Dell Diamond debut as Round Rock's starting pitcher on Saturday night. Abbott signed a minor league contract with Texas on May 10 and started for the E-Train the next day. The right-hander took the loss allowing six hits, five runs, three earned, with a walk and five strikeouts in 4.0 innings of work. Abbott has made 45 Major League appearances with Chicago-NL (2021) and Washington (2022-23) compiling a 1-7 record and a 6.02 ERA (70 ER/104.2 IP).

EXPLOSIVE COMETS

The Express have allowed five or more runs in an inning this year six times. Oklahoma City is responsible for four of the six innings. The Comets scored six in the third frame yesterday. They have scored 12 of their 21 runs this series in the third.

SMITH'S FIRST SIX

OF Marcus Smith recorded the E-Train's lone RBIs with his double in the second inning on Friday. In six games with the Express, Smith is batting .333 with a 1.298 OPS. Four of his six hits have gone for extra-bases and he has been on base all six games.

MAY FLOWERS FOR FREEMAN

INF Cody Freeman has been on base in 13 of 14 games in the month of May. Freeman is tied for second in the PCL with 56 at-bats this month and only has four strikeouts. His 11.6% whiff rate (min. 50 PA) is the second-best rate in the league in May. As a team, the Express have the fourth fewest strikeouts in the PCL (371).

LATE IN GAMES

The Express are 0-16 when trailing after the seventh inning. Their .223 (101-452) batting average in the seventh inning and later is the second-lowest in the PCL. They are batting .266 (263-987) in innings one through six.

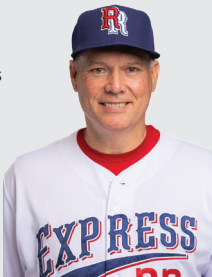

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
