Tonight: The Lugnuts play the third in a six-game series against the Dayton Dragons stretching through Sunday, July 4, with LAFCU Fireworks following the contests on July 2, July 3 and, naturally, Independence Day. Right-hander **Richard Guasch** makes his ninth Lugnuts appearance and his seventh start, opposed by Dayton right-hander **Carson Spiers** in his seventh appearances and third start. Lansing is 4-4 against Dayton this year, splitting a six-game set at Day Air Ballpark in mid May. Today is a **Labatt Blue Thirsty Thursday**, with \$2 domestics and \$4 craft drafts!

On the Air: Today's game is on MiLB.TV and streaming online at http://milb.streamguys1.com/lansing, with Jesse Goldberg-Strassler on the call.

Last Night: Lugnuts 8, Dragons 3. The Lugnuts scored eight runs for the second consecutive day, buoyed by a five-run sixth inning against relievers Jake Gilbert and Spencer Stockton, capped by a Lester Madden, Jr., two-run single. In the win, starter Seth Shuman allowed one run on five hits in five innings, striking out two.

What's New in 2021: Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ball-club accepted an invitation to affiliate with the Oakland A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Kansas City Royals (1996-98), Chicago Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

Meet the Boss: Scott Steinmann is the 16th manager in Lugnuts team history. Born in Dayton, Steinmann joins the Lugnuts after three straight seasons assigned to manage Double-A Midland (though the 2020 season was canceled). Steinmann previously managed against the Lugnuts with Wisconsin (2005), Clinton (2009, 2014-15) and Beloit (2017). More info about the skipper can be found on the next page of these notes.

Recent Roster Moves: On Tuesday, pitcher Stevie Emanuels was placed on the Injured List retroactive to June 26 and the Lugnuts received a pair of right-handed pitchers in Sam Romero, who came from Extended Spring Training and joined the bullpen, and Jack Cushing, who joined from Low-A Stockton and will start tomorrow night in his Lugnuts debut.

Lugnut in the News: Today 2015 Nuts standout Tim Locastro was traded by Arizona to the New York Yankees in exchange for Double-A pitcher Keegan Curtis.

Pre-2021 Alumni Report: 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.,** leads the Majors in OBP (.440), OPS (1.108) and total bases (191); and ranks 2nd in home runs (26), RBIs (66) and in runs scored (64), and 3rd in slugging percentage (.685) and batting average (.336). Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** leads the Majors in runs scored (66).

2021 Alumni Report: Three former Lugnuts contributed in last night's 9-8 Midland win at Frisco in the Double-A Central. **Jake Suddleson** batted cleanup and went 2-for-5 with two doubles and two runs scored, raising his OPS to .856. **Aiden McIntyre** allowed a run in 2/3 innings, striking out one, and **Jack Weisenburger** picked up the win with one inning of work, giving up two hits, one walk and two runs.

Man of Steal: Infielder Max Schuemann (Portage Northern H.S. / Eastern Michigan University) is tied for second in Minor League Baseball with 30 stolen bases, eight more than the Major League leader, Kansas City's Whit Merrifield. Schuemann is tied for second in the Minors with 13 HBPs and is tied for third in the High-A Central with 38 runs scored.

Hail to Arms: The Lugnuts' pitching staff ranks second in the High-A Central with a 3.76 earned run average, trailing Cedar Rapids, which has lowered its team ERA to 3.53 with four shutouts in its past eight games. Lansing has issued the second fewest walks in the league (159) and has the second best GO/AO ratio in the league at 1.15, trailing Cedar Rapids' ratio of 1.36.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2013: Chris Hawkins's two-out bases-loaded grounder up the middle in the bottom of the ninth seemingly lifted the Lugnuts to a walk-off victory over Great Lakes. But Santiago Nessy, the runner at first, did not run to second base, turning around and celebrating with his teammates. The Loons executed the force play at second base, erasing the game-winning run, and then defeated the Lugnuts in ten innings, 5-4.
2017: With two balls and two strikes on J.B. Woodman, the bases loaded, two outs, and the South Bend Cubs clinging to a 5-4 lead, Woodman injured an abdominal muscle hitting a foul ball against closer Wyatt Short and was forced to leave the game. He was replaced by pinch-hitter Bo Bichette who took Ball 3 high, fouled one off to the right, and then swung and missed a high fastball to end the game.

Major League Lugnuts: Three former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 157 all-time - pitcher Ty Tice '18, outfielder Josh Palacios '16-'17, and pitcher Tayler Saucedo '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: Carlos Febles and Carlos Beltrán for the Kansas City Royals. Saucedo most recently debuted, tossing a scoreless inning for the Blue Jays on June 17.

Record-Setting, for Better or Worse: On June 15, Max Schuemann broke Samad Taylor's franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons. On June 20, Stevie Emanuels broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

So Many Starters: The Lugnuts have used 13 different starting pitchers this season, namely Brady Basso, Reid Birlingmair, Jeff Criswell, David Leal, Stevie Emanuels, Richard Guasch, Rafael Kelly, Bryce Nightengale, Colin Peluse, Leudeny Pineda, Seth Shuman, Shohei Tomioka and Brock Whittlesey.

Familiar Settings: 10 of the 28 Lugnuts active players came through the Midwest League in Beloit on their way up the Athletics' ladder, and coaching staff members Scott Steinmann, Don Schulze and Anthony Phillips all have experience in the league.

A Pleasant Peninsula Surrounds You: Max Schuemann (Portage Northern H.S.) is the first Lugnut to hail from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. Earlier this season, the Nuts featured two Michigan Wolverines in Jeff Criswell (injured) and Jack Weisenburger (promoted).

Finally: Pitchers Jeff Criswell, Stevie Emanuels and Shohei Tomioka, catchers Jared McDonald, Drew Millas and William Simoneit, first baseman Patrick McColl, and outfielder Michael Guldberg have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts

Front Office Connections: Lugnuts pitching coach Don Schulze was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations Billy Beane was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman Patrick McColl set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

Clubhouse of Higher Learning: The Ivy League is well represented on the Lansing roster. First baseman Patrick McColl played for Harvard, reliever Michael Danielak was drafted from Dartmouth and catcher William Simoneit spent four years at Cornell before grad-transferring to Wake Forest.

Power Five Baseball: The Lugnuts also represent the ACC (Michael Guldberg, Georgia Tech); Big 12 (Brady Basso, Oklahoma State); Big Ten (Dalton Sawyer, Minnesota); and the SEC (Cobie Vance, Alabama, and Ryan Gridley, Mississippi State); and the Pac-12 (Stevie Emanuels, Washington).

International Appeal: In addition to 17 different states (Arizona, California, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada, North Carolina, Ohio, Texas, Virginia, Washington) represented by Lugnuts players and coaching staff, seven nations are represented: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa and Venezuela.

Representing His Country: 1B/3B Jordan Díaz played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

Teammates Then, Teammates Now: Several of the Nuts are more than a little familiar with one another. Reid Birlingmair and Charlie Cerny pitched together at the University of Illinois at Chicago. The Lugnuts also have a pair of Wake Forest Demon Deacons; though William Simoneit played only one year at Wake, 2020, thus missing Colin Peluse by a year, Peluse hosted Simoneit on his visit and convinced him to attend Wake. Coincidentally, Peluse was hosted on his own Wake Forest college visit by 2019 Lugnuts infielder Johnny Aiello.



Personal: The first letter of Richard's last name is pronounced with an "h" sound, as in "hwahsh"... rated Baseball America's No. 35 Oakland prospect, with his slider rated as the best in the organization.

Last Outing: Started June 24 at Cedar Rapids, suffering the loss after allowing four runs on four hits in five innings, walking three and striking out six... started the game with three perfect innings... began the 4th, however, in sudden catastrophic fashion: walked Spencer Steer and gave up a two-run homer to Seth Gray, then walked Wander Javier and gave up a two-run homer to Trey Cabbage... that was all the Kernels needed, handing the Lugnuts a 5-2 loss.

2021 in the High-A Central:

- Opened the season as the No. 3 starter in the Lugnuts' rotation, working 2 1/3 scoreless innings on May 6th vs. Lake County... struggled with command, working around a one-out walk in the 1st inning with a strikeout of top prospect George Valera... hit a batter and walked a batter in the 2nd inning but stranded runners at the corners... gave up a double and a walk in the 3rd inning, but responded by striking out Valera and cleanup hitter Jonathan Engelmann before he was relieved in favor of Bryce Nightengale, who escaped the jam... departed with the Lugnuts leading, 3-0, only to see bullpen relinquish the lead in a 7-6 loss.
- Relieved Shohei Tomioka in a piggyback assignment on Thursday, May 13th, at Dayton... struck out six Dragons in four innings, allowing two runs (one earned) on four hits and a walk in a no-decision... relieved Tomioka starting the 3rd inning, allowing a home run to Jose Tello, the second batter faced; Victor Ruiz followed with a single, but was erased on a strike 'im out, throw 'im out double play... pitched around singles by James Free and Jonathan Willems in a scoreless 4th... whiffed Quincy McAfee and Ruiz in a perfect 5th... in frustrating 6th, walked Quin Cotton on a 3-2 pitch, Cotton stole 2nd and then stole 3rd on a strikeout of James Free, coming home on a throwing error by catcher Jared McDonald, giving Dayton an enormous insurance run, on their way to a 4-2 win over the Lugnuts.
- Pitched brilliantly in a start Thursday, May 20, at Fort Wayne, tossing five scoreless innings while allowing two hits, two walks, and striking out seven... pitched around an Agustin Ruiz single in the 1st inning... allowed a leadoff double to Justin Lopez in the 2nd inning and wild-pitched him to third, then struck out the side to strand him... walked Adam Kerner and Reinaldo Ilarraza to open the 3rd and wild-pitched them to scoring position, but stranded them there... struck out two in a perfect 4th... struck out his seventh batter in a perfect 5th... Lugnuts went on to win, 12-1.
- Disaster on May 27: Richard relieved Seth Shuman with two outs in the 3rd inning, held the Great Lakes Loons scoreless in the 4th and 5th innings, and then was charged with eight unearned runs in the 6th on three walks, three errors behind him, an HBP, a fielder's choice, a dropped sacrifice fly, and zero hits... Charles Hall relieved him and gave up a pair of two-run singles in a nine-run inning, and the Loons went on to win, 10-1.
- Dominance on June 3: Richard mesmerized the South Bend Cubs, posting six scoreless three-hit innings, walking one and striking out eight... departed with the Lugnuts leading 4-0, only to see the Cubs rally for three runs in the 7th and two in the 9th for a 5-4 comeback win... eight strikeouts tied career high for most in an appearance.
- After allowing 1 ER in his first 20 1/3 innings, Richard gave up four runs on nine hits in four innings at West Michigan on June 10, jumping his ERA from 0.44 to 1.85... removed after facing three batters in the 5th and not recording an out; lefty Dalton Sawyer allowed a run on a sacrifice fly but stranded the other two runners... Guasch was charged with the loss as the Lugnuts fell, 10-0.
- Started June 17 vs. Great Lakes, receiving no-decision... whiffed eight batters in five innings, allowing two runs on four hits, three walks and three HBPs... Lugnuts won, 4-3, scoring four unearned runs thanks to four Loons errors... stranded bases loaded in the 1st, stranded two in the 2nd... stranded one in the 3rd... stranded two in the 4th... finished with a perfect 5th.

2019: Received one start with the Vermont Lake Monsters on June 19th, going four innings, allowing no runs, with five strikeouts and one walk, spending the rest of his 2019 season in Beloit, where he pitched in 18 games, 10 starts, and finished the year with a 4.53 ERA, 77 strikeouts / 37 walks, and just one home run allowed.

2018: Made his professional debut in DSL rookie league as a member of the A's starting rotation, pitching in seven games, starting five, with an ERA of 1.16 in 23.1 IP, walking four while striking out 27 in a stunningly impressive campaign.

The Road to MLB: First gained notice after reached the national championship game while pitching for Santiago de Cuba's 11- and 12-year-old team... pitched in 2013 at the U15 National Championship, where he went 8-0 with a 2.12 ERA and a team-leading 70 strikeouts... unfortunately, this experience damaged his elbow, preventing him from competing in 2014 at the U18 National Championship... appeared in the 2015 U18 National Championship, recording a 5-1 record with a 1.99 ERA in seven outings... went 8-2 with a 0.62 ERA in the 2016 U18 National Championship... member of Cuba's 2017 Pan-American team... also in 2017, Richard's father died, causing him to make the decision to leave Cuba and seek his fortune pitching professionally in MLB... he lived for three months in Mexico, wonths in Guatemala, was arrested for three days in El Salvador after attempting to cross the Guatemala border, went back to Guatemala and Mexico, and then formally moved to the Dominican Republic to pursue a pro career in the United States... originally signed with the Philadelphia Phillies, but only spent 30 days in the organization... (Source: https://swingcompleto.com/entrevista-prospecto-santiago-richard-quasch-oakland/)... at age 20, signed with the Oakland Athletics as an international free agent on July 13th, 2018... scout: Juan C. De La Cruz, who also signed teammate Rafael Kelly.

Santiago de Cuba: Richard hails from the second largest city in Cuba and the capital city of Santiago de Cuba Province... it lies in the southeastern area of the island 540 miles southeast of the Cuban capital of Havana... historically, Santiago de Cuba has been the second-most important city on the island after Havana, and remains the second-largest (Havana)... the city features a bay connected to the Caribbean Sea and is a major port... total population as of 2020: 1,253,838... also from Santiago de Cuba: Orestes Destrade, Adeiny Hechavarría and Barbaro Garbey.
