LAST NIGHT: The Skeeters fell 14-5 to the Oklahoma City Dodgers on Friday. Oklahoma City hit six home runs, including three from Keibert Ruiz. CJ Hinojosa paced the Skeeters offense, delivering two doubles and two RBIs. Austin Hansen received the loss for the Skeeters, allowing five runs and walking five through 3 2/3 innings.

TAKE ON JAKE: Skeeters outfielder Jake Meyers ranks sixth in all of Minor League Baseball with a .343 average and is 10th with a 1.007 OPS. He's one of three players in Minor League Baseball with at least 15 home runs, 50 RBIs and 10 stolen bases.

GAME OF JONES: Since being optioned to the Skeeters on July 15, Taylor Jones has gone 12-for-35 (.343) with five doubles and three RBIs through seven games.

LEÓN KING: IF Pedro León has gone 5-for-12 with two doubles an RBI and a stolen base in three games since being promoted to the Skeeters from Double A Corpus Christi. León is rated as the Astros' No. 2 overall prospect. He hit .249 (46x185) with nine home runs, 33 RBIs and 13 stolen bases while with Corpus Christi. León recently competed in the 2021 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game. The Astros signed him as a non-drafted free agent from Cuba in January. He was rated by MLB Pipeline as the No. 7 international prospect in this year's signing class.

VOTE FOR PEDRO: RHP Pedro Báez continued his MLB Rehab Assignment on Friday, tossing one inning, while striking out one and allowing a run. He totaled 19 pitches, matching the most so far in his rehab assignment. He made two scoreless relief appearances (2 IP) with Low-A Fayetteville before joining the Skeeters. Báez was signed by the Astros to a two-year contract in the offseason after spending the last seven seasons at the Major League level with Los Angeles (NL). He's yet to pitch for the Astros this season. Báez has been on the 60-Day IL through the regular season with right shoulder soreness.

HINO'HERO': CJ Hinojosa has homered four times over his last six games. Hinojosa hit two home runs on 7/18 at Albuquerque, which was the seventh multi-homer game for the Skeeters this year and the first that didn't belong to Jake Meyers or Bryan De La Cruz. Over his last six games, Hinojosa has hit .464 (13x28) with four homers and seven RBIs. He also leads the Skeeters and is second in Triple A West with 22 doubles. The 22 doubles are the most of Astros minor leaguers as well.

CRUZ CONTROL: Over his last 19 games, Bryan De La Cruz has hit .356 (26x73) with six home runs and 18 RBls. De La Cruz is seventh in Triple A West in average (.326), tied for sixth in RBls (49), second in hits (84) and tied for fifth in runs (47). De La Cruz's 12 homers this season give him a career-high, surpassing his eight home runs in '19 with Double A Corpus Christi and High-A Fayetteville.

SOUVENIR CITY: The Skeeters have homered in nine of their last 11 games. They had homered in nine straight games prior to Thursday night's win, which was their longest streak of the season. The Skeeters have hit a total of 15 home runs over the 11-game stretch.

JJ ALL DAY: JJ Matijevic homered in Monday's win and it was his 14th overall homer of the year, and his fourth since joining the Skeeters. The 14 home runs are tied for fourth-most of Astros minor leaguers.

DOUBLE: The Skeeters hit a season-high eight doubles on 7/18 at Albuquerque. The eight doubles are the most in a single game from any Triple A West team this season, two more than any other team. The Skeeters are second in Triple A and fifth of all Minor League Baseball teams with 146 doubles this season

10x10: Jake Meyers stole his 10th base in Tuesday's loss, joining Jose Siri as the only other player in Triple A West with at least 10 home runs and 10 stolen bases. Meyers leads the Skeeters with 16 homers. Siri has 11 home runs to go with a teamhigh 16 stolen bases this season.

TRIPLE A WEST, EAST LEADERS: The Skeeters are in first place in the East Division of Triple A West, ahead of Oklahoma City by 2.5 games. The Skeeters have remained in first place since their win on 6/18 at El Paso

LOCKDOWN: The Skeeters lead Triple A West with a 4.47 team ERA.

OH SO SWEET: The Skeeters are fourth of all full-season MiLB teams with a .277 average.

RISPY BUSINESS: CJ Hinojosa has hit .429 (24x56) with 33 RBIs while hitting with runners in scoring position this season. He leads all Skeeters players with at least 20 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

K-MART: Seth Martinez is third of Triple A West relievers with 47 strikeouts and is second with 33.2 IP.

BLANCO FUEGO: Ronel Blanco notched his 11th save of the season on Thursday, adding to his career high. He ranks third in Triple A West in saves and leads all Astros minor leaguers.

VS. OKC: The Skeeters are set to begin their third series against Oklahoma City this year, and their second at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark. The Skeeters have struggled against Oklahoma City this year, going 4-10 (.286), which is their worst winning percentage against any opponent this year. They're also the Skeeters' only opponent they don't own a winning record against this season.

ON THE ROAD: The Skeeters began their 12-game, two-series road trip by going 3-3 in Albuquerque. All six games were decided by three-runs-or-less vs. the Isotopes. The last three games were all decided by two-or-less runs, with two of them going into extras. This is the second 12-game road trip of the season for the Skeeters. They opened the season with six-game series at Albuquerque and Round Rock. They went 7-5 on that season-opening road trip.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: The Skeeters announced Friday that OF Jake Meyers was named the team's June Player of the Month. Meyers hit .337 (33x98) with 9 home runs, 17 RBIs and a 1.072 OPS in 24 games in June. He had a breakout series from June 17-22 in El Paso, hitting seven home runs with 11 RBIs over a five-day stretch.

RECORD NIGHT: The Skeeters set the following franchise records on in a 24-15 win on June 20 in El Paso, including their time from 2012-19 as an independent team in the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball:

- 24 runs scored was a single-game record ... Surpassed previous record of 18 runs (accomplished twice and last done on September 9, 2016 vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most from any MiLB team
- 7 home runs were a single-game record ... Surpassed previous high of six home runs from July 2, 2019
 vs. the Long Island Ducks ... Tied for the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most in all of MiLB
- 23 hits were a single-game record ... Surpassed the previous record of 22 hits on September 9, 2016, vs. the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs ... Second-most from a Triple A team this season
- Jake Meyers became the first player in Skeeters history to hit three home runs in a game
- 12 extra-base hits matched Skeeters single-game record set on September 9, 2016, and are the most from a Triple A team this season and tied for second-most of all MiLB teams
- 50 total bases is a franchise record ... Surpassed previous high of 37 from July 2, 2019 ... Most from a MiLB team this season

MiLB HONORS: RHP Brett Conine was named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Month for May by Minor League Baseball. Conine went 4-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 ER/19 IP) through four games (three starts) in May. He recorded the lowest ERA in Triple A West and led the league in wins, opponent batting average (.167) and WHIP (0.95) at the end of the month.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: Ronnie Dawson, **Alex De Goti** and **Peter Solomon** each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two. Since the Skeeters opened their season on May 6, three players have made their Major League debut with the Astros. **Tyler Ivey** recieved his first MLB promotion on May 21 and made his first Major League start that day, allowing four runs on sixt hits, while striking out three, over 4 2/3 innings to take a no-decision at Texas. **Ralph Garza Jr.** received his first promotion to the Major Leagues on May 26. He made his Major League debut on May 29 vs. San Diego and threw an inning of relief. **Ryan Hartman** was promoted on June 30 and made his MLB debut that night vs. Baltimore at Minute Maid Park. He allowed a run on three hits and struck out two through 2 1/3 innings of relief.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. Storey

REST OF THE CREW: Joining Mickey Storey on his staff are pitching coach **Erick Abreu**, hitting coach **Ben Rosenthal** and development coach **Sean Connole**. **John Gregorich** and **A.J. Smith** are the Skeeters' athletic trainers and **Hazael Wessin** is the team's strength and conditioning coach. Abreu is in his eighth season with the Astros organization and his first as the organization's Triple A pitching coach. Rosenthal is in his fifth season with the Astros and third as the htiting coach for their Triple A affiliate. Connole is in his second season with the Astros and his first as the development coach for the team's Triple A affiliate.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the post-season in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. Notable people to appear for the Skeeters include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino
