BULLPEN BRILLIANCE: Omaha's bullpen holds the best ERA in all of Triple-A at 3.29. The Storm Chaser relievers allow the second fewest walks per nine innings at 3.44 and have thrown the second fewest innings pitched (246.0). During the last home series, non-starters allowed just two earned runs across 19.2 innings, for a 0.92 ERA across the six-game series.

STREAKING: OF Nate Eaton is now the first first Storm Chaser to record a hit in 10 consecutive games after his 3-for-4 performance on Sunday in Iowa. That streak is the tied for the second longest active streak in the International League. Eaton has played in just 20 games for Triple-A Omaha after being promoted from Double-A Omaha on May 27. Eaton has five homers with the Storm Chasers this season and leads the team with a .592 slugging percentage. The Royals No. 29 prospect, according to MLB Pipeline, has failed to record a hit in just five games for Omaha, with 10 extra base hits. During June, Eaton is hitting .309, the second-best batting average on the team during the month.

SEASON SERIES: Omaha is facing off against Columbus for the second time this season. The Storm Chasers won the first series (May 3-8) 4-2 despite falling the first two games of the series. In the Thursday game, Omaha pitched the first shutout of the season in the 5-0 win. Omaha took game four 10-8 before winning the Saturday game on a walk-off grand slam from **INF Jimmy Govern**. The Chasers won the Sunday matchup on a strong bullpen performance. Omaha averaged 6.33 runs per game in the series and hit four home runs during the six-game set.

FOLLOW THE LEADER: The Royals No. 3 overall prospect according to MLB Pipeline, is leading (or tied for the lead) the International League in six offensive categories. **INF Vinnie Pasquantino** is tied for the league lead in homers with 17 and holds the outright lead in RBIs (63), slugging percentage (.586), OPS (.956), extra-base hits (34), and total bases (133). Pasquantino also has draw 34 walks and has struck out 35 times, the best walk to strikeout ratio among the league's best hitters. Pasquantino hits a homer every 13.4 at bats or 3.7 games.

DAYLIGHT DELIGHT: The Chasers are 5-0 in day games at home this season. Omaha is averaging 5.65 runs per games played during the day and are hitting .256 during day games. The Storm Chasers have 22 stolen bases and have only been caught twice.

FOR OMAHA: RHP Jackson Kowar heads to the mound to make his 12th start of the season for the Storm Chasers. In his last start, Kowar went 4.2 innings, allowing nine earned runs with five strikeouts. Kowar made a pair of starts against Columbus the first time the two teams met, going 0-1 in the two games. Kowar was the Storm Chasers' Opening Day starter in 2021, ultimately posting a 3.46 ERA in 80.2 innings across 17 outings (16 starts), striking out 115 and walking 34 to earn Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year honors. He was also named a Triple-A Postseason All-Star, the Royals' Paul Splittorff Pitcher of the Year, and Omaha Pitcher of the Year. At the time of his promotion to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021, Kowar led the league with 115 strikeouts. Among Triple-A East pitchers with a minimum of 80.0 innings, Kowar ranked first in strikeout percentage (34.0%) while ranking sixth in batting average against (.220) and eighth in ERA (3.46) among that subset. A former first-round pick (33rd overall) in 2018, Kowar pitched collegiately at the University of Florida, pitching on three College World Series teams and winning the College World Series with the Gators in 2017.

FOR COLUMBUS: RHP Peyton Battenfield is set to make his 14th start of the season for the Clippers. In his last start, Battenfield went 7.0 innings of one-run ball against St. Paul with three strikeouts and one walk, matching his longest start of the season. Battenfield has gone 6.0 innings or more during five of his 13 starts with four being quality starts. Battenfield made a start during the first series between the two teams, going 7.0 innings, allowing three earned runs (two unearned) with five strikeouts and one walk. In 2021, Battenfield split time between the High-A and Double-A levels, posting a 7-1 record with a 2.53 ERA. The Oklahoma State University product was drafted by the Houston Astro organization in the 2019 MLB Draft. He was traded to the Tampa Bay Rays in Jan. of 2020 before landing in the Cleveland Guardians organization on July 30, 2021.

KOWAR NOTES

- Began 2022 season with Kansas City, allowing seven runs on 11 hits in 3.1 innings in relief appearance on April 10 vs. Cleveland, a game the Royals eventually lost, 17-3
- Has made 10 career MLB appearances (eight starts), recording an 0-6 record with a 12.03 ERA in 33.2 innings with 33 strikeouts and 21 walks
- Named Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year in 2021 in addition to earning Triple-A Postseason All-Star honors as the top right-handed pitcher in the league, Paul Splittorff Pitcher of the Year in the Kansas City Royals organization, and Omaha Pitcher of the Year
- Led Triple-A East with 115 strikeouts at the time of his promotion to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021
- Led Triple-A East pitchers with a minimum of 80.0 innings in strikeout percentage (34.0%), while ranking sixth in batting average against (.220) and eighth in ERA (3.46) among that subset
- Made Triple-A debut as Omaha's Opening Day starter on May 4, 2021, vs. St. Paul, tying a career high with nine strikeouts across 5.1 shutout innings
- Finished May with a 1.01 ERA in 26.2 innings across five starts to earn Triple-A East Pitcher of the Month honors
- Lowered ERA to league-leading 0.85 following 5.0 innings of shutout ball on June 2, 2021, vs. Iowa
- Called up by Kansas City for Major League debut on June 7, 2021, at Los Angeles-AL, allowing four runs on three hits in 0.2 innings with two walks and zero strikeouts
