Syracuse Mets RHP Jonah Tong (1-1, 5.66) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Jack Anderson (1-0, 3.72)

Until We Met Again – The Worcester Red Sox and Syracuse Mets play their Sunday series finale this afternoon at 1:05 pm in what will be (amazingly) the final time the Mets play here at Polar Park this season. Worcester will make two separate visits to Syracuse and both will come in the second half of the season...6-games from June 30 – July 5 and 6-more games from August 18-23. The Mets took 2 of 3 from Worcester to begin this year from March 27-29, but the Sox lead this current 6-game set, 3 games to 2. Worcester is 2-2-0 in their first four series to begin the year...2 wins, 2 losses, and 0 splits.

The Iggy Era Begins - Iggy Suarez, 44, has been named today as the acting manager of the Worcester Red Sox. Suarez is in his second season as Worcester's defensive coach and has worked closely on a daily basis with former WooSox and now Boston Red Sox manager Chad Tracy. Iggy was the manager for the Red Sox Single-A affiliate the Greenville Drive for seven years and six seasons of play from 2018-2024 before joining the WooSox in 2025.

A former infielder in the Red Sox system between 2003-2009, Iggy reached Triple-A Pawtucket in 2009. He finished his playing career in the Independent Atlantic League from 2010-13 before transitioning to a coaching role.

Suarez was born and raised in New York and now spends his off-season in Houston. He was selected by the Red Sox in the 24th round of the 2003 Draft out of Texas State University. He spent most of four seasons with Double-A Portland from 2006-09 before finishing the 2009 season with the PawSox (20 games).

He began his coaching career as hitting coach for the former Lowell Spinners (Boston's short-A affiliate) in 2015 before becoming Lowell's manager in 2016-2017. Promoted to Greenville in 2018 he had been at the helm of the Drive until joining the WooSox in 2025.

Suarez led Greenville to the South Atlantic League Championship in 2023 behind a team that included Roman Anthony, Kristian Campbell, Blaze Jordan, Marcelo Mayer, Chase Meidroth, and Kyle Teel.

Play Dates – Today's game will finish the WooSox home schedule for the month of April. They are 8-6 at home - going 1-2 in March and 7-4 in April at Polar Park with one game remaining. While Worcester weather has been cold and often windy over these past 4½ weeks, it has been relatively rain (and snow) free. As a result, the WooSox have avoided any home postponements thus far. It marks only the second time in their six seasons at Polar Park that the WooSox will have been able to play all their March and April home games (15 total). In 2023 the WooSox played their first 16 scheduled Polar Park games until their first home postponement - a rainout on May 3, 2023 vs. Buffalo. The 2021 inaugural season of the WooSox did not begin until May 11 due to Covid-restrictions.

Broadcast News – With the Boston Red Sox and Boston Bruins both in action on NESN+ & NESN respectively this afternoon, the WooSox game will air on tape delay on NESN+ following the Red Sox post-game show later today. Worcester's game can be heard live on NASH 98.9 FM and the WooSox Radio Network.

NEXT ON TAP - The probable pitching match-ups for the upcoming series in Rochester are TBD at this point.

WooSox Promotions today at Polar Park

Back and Forth We Go – Worcester and Syracuse entered this series on Tuesday tied atop the International League East division. The WooSox are once again tied atop the division but now with Lehigh Valley both with 14-11 records. Syracuse is 13-12 and alone in 4th place in the division. Memphis and Gwinnett are tied for the overall league lead with their 17-9 records good for 1st-place in the IL West division.

The Mets are Back –Syracuse is the first repeat opponent for the WooSox this season. The Mets took 2 of 3 from the Sox at Polar Park to begin the 2026 season from March 27-29. Syracuse ruined Worcester’s home-opener for the second year in a row as they won on March 27, 3-1. The Sox evened matters with a 5-3 victory the next day, but the Mets won the series outright thanks to their 10-8 triumph in the finale on March 29. The Mets rolled to a 12-3 victory on Tuesday in the opener of this current 6-game set, the Sox took the series lead thanks to their 7-6 walk-off win on Wednesday and a 10-4 triumph on Thursday afternoon, Syracuse tied things again with a 3-0 shutout victory on Friday, and yesterday the WooSox went ahead 3 games to 2 by virtue of their 9-2 rout.

Stats vs. Syracuse – WooSox batters are hitting .250 vs. Mets pitching (65-for-260) with 1 HR (by Mikey Romero on March 28) while Sox pitchers are 4-4 with a 4.25 ERA vs. Syracuse (34 ER in 72 IP) with 9 HRA. Syracuse and Worcester both have scored 43 runs in the first 8 games.

Turning the Beat Around – Worcester has won 4 of their last 6 games following their season-high 5-game losing streak from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). On Sunday, April 12th they were 10-4 and atop the IL East division. The WooSox have been above .500 since April 1st.

Warm & Hot Sox –

Kristian Campbell	Had his 8-game hitting streak stopped on Friday after having his 9-game hitting streak snapped on April 11. Overall has hit safely in 18 of his last 20 games (22-for-78, .282) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 11 RBI.
Vinny Capra	Had his 13-game on-base streak end on April 17 (0-for-2, RBI SF). Has hit in 13 of his last 16 games (16-for-52, .308) with 5 2B, 2 HR, 12 RBI, 19 runs scored. Is tied for 2 nd in the league with 21 runs scored and 5 th in OBP (.450).
Nate Eaton	Is 10-for-25 (.400) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 5 RBI, and 4 runs scored in his last 6 games.
Mickey Gasper	Had his 9-game hitting streak snapped on April 11. Has hit in 17 of his 21 games played thus far (24-for-82, .292) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 21 RBI. Is 5 th in league in RBI (21) and 10 th in OBP (.431).
Nick Sogard	Has hit in 4 of his last 5 games (8-for-16) with 2 2B, 4 RBI, 9 BB, 7 runs scored. He has reached base safely 20 of his 23 games this season. Is tied for the league lead with 24 Walks and 6 th in Runs (18).
Braiden Ward	Has 8 HBP in his 15 games played. Is 7 th in league in Stolen Bases (9).
Jake Bennett	Is 2-1 with an 0.86 ERA in 5 GS (3 R, 2 ER in 21 IP). He is 2 nd in the league with his 0.86 ERA, has the 4 th Lowest Batting Average Against (.162), and is 2 nd in WHIP (0.71).
Tayron Guerrero	Is tied for 4 th in the International League with 3 Saves.

This Series Thus Far – The Worcester Red Sox had one of their most memorable days in franchise-history on Saturday afternoon/evening as the team beat the Syracuse Mets, 9-2 and then, after the game, their manager Chad Tracy was named interim manager of the Boston Red Sox following the announcement that the Red Sox had relieved Alex Cora of his duties. As far as Saturday’s game in front of a sell-out crowd of 8,079 fans at Polar Park, the WooSox received strong pitching from five different hurlers, took advantage of 13 walks from Syracuse pitchers, and got big games from SS Nick Sogard (2 hits, 3 walks, 2 RBI and 2 runs) and LF Nate Eaton (3 hits, 1 RBI) to roll past the Mets (13-12) and take a 3 games to 2 lead in the series.

Friday night, the WooSox were held hitless for 7 innings by four Syracuse pitchers until Anthony Seigler led-off the bottom of the 8th inning with a line drive single to centerfield, but the Sox would muster just one other hit (a single by Mikey Romero leading off the 9th inning) in a 3-0 loss to the Mets before a Polar Park sellout crowd of 7,836 on Friday night. Six Syracuse pitchers ultimately combined on the 2-hit shutout. Daniel Duarte started (2.1 innings, 1 hit) followed by winner Austin Warren (.2 IP), A.J. Minter (1 IP), Dakota Hawkins (3 IP, 1 BB), Dan Hammer (.2 IP, 1 hit), and the save to Anderson Severino (1.1 IP, 1 hit). Michael Sansone (1-1) allowed 3 runs in 4.1 innings to suffer the loss. Jihwan Bae had 3 hits, a walk, RBI and run scored for the Mets.

Thursday afternoon, Worcester scored 4 runs in the 5th inning to erase a 4-2 deficit and added 3 more runs in the 7th inning en route to a 10-4 victory over Syracuse. Worcester used a balanced offensive attack as all nine players in the lineup reached base safely and 8 of the 9 had at least one hit. CF Nate Eaton was on base four times with a single, triple, walk (with the bases loaded), and hit by a pitch. He was the only Sox player with a multi-hit game. RF Nick Sogard had a single, 2 walks, and 2 RBI while 3B Vinny Capra had a go-ahead 2-run double, 2 walks, 2 RBI, and scored 2 runs. Jacob Webb (1-0) came on in the 5th inning and tossed 1.2 scoreless with 3 strikeouts to get credit for the win. Tayron Guerrero (2 IP, 2 SO) and Tommy Kahnle (1 IP, 2 SO) kept the Mets off the board the rest of the way. Syracuse reliever Mike Baumann (0-1) was the loser allowing 2 runs on 4 hits in 1.2 innings of work.

Wednesday afternoon, Worcester rallied for two runs in the bottom of the 9th inning, capped by Kristian Campbell's 2-out RBI single, to earn their first walk-off win of the season, a 7-6 comeback victory. After a two out intentional walk to Mickey Gasper put runners on 1st and 2nd, Campbell stepped up and smacked a first pitch line single down the 3rd base line to score Nate Eaton with the winning run. Two batters earlier, Eaton ripped an RBI double that tied the game and nearly won it, but Syracuse leftfielder Ryan Clifford made a perfect throw home to cut down Nick Sogard with the potential winning run. The WooSox got another excellent outing from starter Jake Bennett, who now owns an 0.86 ERA after his first five starts to begin the year, but the Mets erased a 3-0 deficit with two runs in the 5th (one charged to Bennett) and three more in the 6th. The win went to new dad Wyatt Olds (3-1) who fired 1.1 hitless innings of relief with 2 strikeouts. The loss went to the Mets fifth pitcher of the game, Alex Carrillo (1-1) who was charged with 2 runs in the 9th. Sogard, Eaton, Campbell, and Romero all had 2 hits apiece for the WooSox. Christian Pache had 2 more hits for the Mets giving him 6 hits in the first two games of the series.

Tuesday night it was all Syracuse in the series-opener as the Mets belted 5 home runs including 3 from SS Ronny Mauricio off three different WooSox pitchers to win going away, 12-3. Mauricio, who returned from New York one week ago, had a solo HR in the 4th inning, a 2-run blast in the 5th inning, and another 2-run homer in the 8th inning. The Mets used the long ball to account for 9 of their 12 runs. CF Nick Morabito cracked a solo HR and Ryan Clifford crushed a grand slam. Syracuse starter and winner Jonah Tong (1-1) was impressive as the 22-year-old Canadian went 5.1 innings with 9 strikeouts. Nick Sogard led the WooSox with 3 hits and 2 runs scored while Mickey Gasper had a pair of RBI singles. The loss was the largest of the season for the Sox.

Low Five After a High Five – The WooSox had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). It was their first 5-game losing skid since April 25-30 of last year. Prior to coming to Nashville, the Sox had not dropped back-to-back games all season (they went their first 15 games before losing two in a row in Nashville on April 14 & 15). Worcester had a season-best 5-game winning streak from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota.

The Road Turned - The WooSox had been 5-0 on the road to begin their year but they are now 6-5 away compared to 8-6 at home here at Polar Park.

Series Matters - Worcester has a 2-2-0 series record thus far...2 wins, 2 losses, and no splits. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

Come out and Play – Including today, the WooSox will have played each of their first 15 scheduled home games to begin a season (March 27-29 and April 7-26) – their longest stretch to open a season since 2023 when the Sox were able to play their first 16 scheduled Polar Park games until a rainout on May 3, 2023 vs. Buffalo. In both 2024 & 2025 the WooSox had their second home games each year postponed due to inclement weather. During Worcester's inaugural season in 2021, which did not commence at home until May 11 due to Covid-restrictions, it took until their 28th home game before they finally had a home game postponed (July 2, 2021 vs. Scranton/WB).

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 281 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5+-year history (up to today), 202 of them have played in the Major Leagues (72%) including 138 with the Boston Red Sox (49%).

A Trace of History - The second manager in Worcester Red Sox history, Chad Tracy led the WooSox to winning seasons in each of his first four years at the helm of the WooSox to become the first Red Sox Triple-A manager to accomplish that feat dating back to at least the 1930's. Known affectionately as "Trace", he returned for his fifth season as WooSox manager in 2026 until being named Boston Red Sox interim manager on the evening of April 25. Tracy earned the 300th victory of his Worcester managerial career on August 31, 2025 in Durham. He had a 323-295 record as WooSox manager from 2022 – April 25, 2026. Chad became the sixth manager in modern Red Sox organizational history to reach the 300-win plateau with a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate. Joe Morgan is the all-time leader with 601 wins in his nine years as Pawtucket Red Sox manager (1974-82). "Trace" also had 176 wins in three years as a Minor League manager in the Los Angeles Angels' system from 2015-17 giving him a total of 499 career managerial wins including Worcester's 14 wins to start the 2026 season. Tracy, 40, has sent a number of Worcester players to Boston during his tenure including, most recently, OF Roman Anthony, INF Marcelo Mayer, and LHPs Connelly Early & Payton Tolle who all earned their first-ever promotions to Boston during the 2025 season. Other past or current Red Sox who have played for Tracy in Worcester include: OF Willyer Abreu, RHP Brayan Bello, INF/OF Kristian Campbell, 1B Triston Casas, RHP Kutter Crawford, OF Jarren Duran, INF Romy Gonzalez, RHP Tanner Houck, OF Cedanne Rafaela, INF Nick Sogard, and catcher Connor Wong among several others.

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (10-9) got a pinch hit walk-off 2-run HR from the red hot Franklin Arias to stun the Hartford Yard Goats yesterday, 4-3. Arias now has 7 homers on the season and all 7 have come in his last 9 games. Brooks Brannon belted a solo HR (#1) in the 6th inning that tied the game at 1-1. R.J. Labriola (1-0) was the winner with 1.1 scoreless innings of relief thanks to the heroics of Arias who is now hitting .420 on the season.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – The WooSox reinstated OF **Braiden Ward** from the suspended list today. Ward was suspended for on field behavior that occurred on April 17 in Nashville and has missed the last seven WooSox games. Worcester is also involved in three moves from the managerial and coaching ranks, so we will consider these roster moves. WooSox manager **Chad Tracy** and hitting coach **Collin Hetzler** have been promoted to those same roles with the Boston Red Sox while WooSox defensive coach **Iggy Suarez** will take over as acting WooSox manager.

Worcester has thus made at least one player move during 19 of the last 20 days between April 7-25 (34 moves total). The only day they have not been involved in a player transaction during this stretch was on their off-day on Monday, April 13.

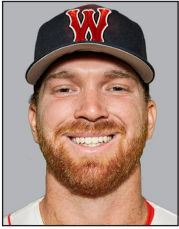
