TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST GAME'S RESULT - The St. Paul Saints got a game tying home run from Chris Williams in the eighth, but dropped the finale of the series to the Columbus Clippers 5-3 in 10 innings on Sunday afternoon at CHS Field. Mark Contreras went 2-5 with a home run and an RBI. Aaron Sanchez dazzled in his 5.0 shutout innings allowing three hits while walking one and striking out four.

CENTRAL PLANNING: The month of August will be easy on the travel for the St. Paul Saints. They will not leave the central time zone. Their road schedule takes them to their two closest opponents, Omaha and Iowa, and they have a two week homestand against Columbus and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

LOWERTOWN LOWDOWN: The St. Paul Saints are playing their second two-week homestand of the season and fourth in franchise history. Here is how their current homestand stacks up against those homestands with the first from May 11-23, 2021 vs. Iowa & Indianapolis, the second from June 8-20, 2021 vs. Omaha & Iowa and the third homestand from April 26-May 8, 2022 vs. Nashville & Iowa

EXTRA EXTRA: For the 17th time this season, the St. Paul Saints played an extra inning game, the most in all of baseball. They have now played on more game than the South Atlantic League's Wilmington Blue Rocks and two more than the Southern League's Montgomery Biscuits. The Sugar Land Skeeters have played the second most extra inning games in Triple-A with 14 and the Iowa Cubs the second most in the International League with 12. The Chicago Cubs and Tampa Bay Rays have each played 15 extra inning games in the Majors.

OFFENSE CLIPPED: The St. Paul Saints managed just 26 hits in their six-game series against the Columbus Clippers, the lowest total in any series in franchise history. That includes the three-game series against the Indianapolis Indians this season and the two, five-game series at the end of the 2021 season against the Iowa Cubs and Toledo Mud Hens. The 26 hits surpassed the low of 28 from June 2-6, 2021 @ Louisville.

SINK OR SWIM: The St. Paul Saints were 33-32 on June 20 before losing their next game to the Buffalo Bisons falling to .500. Since then, the Saints have had seven opportunities to get over the .500 mark, but have lost all seven games, including their last game on August 13 vs. Columbus. In those seven games they have been outscored by only 12 runs, losing four games by one run.

THAT 90'S THROW: Devin Smeltzer gutted through 4.1 innings throwing 95 pitches on Saturday night against Columbus. The 95 pitches were tied for the second most pitches thrown by a Saints pitcher this season, equalling the mark by Aaron Sanchez on June 25 @ Buffalo. It was only the sixth time a Saints pitcher has thrown 90 or more pitches in 108 completed games. The most pitches thrown this season was 103 by Mario Sanchez on June 2 @ Iowa. It was the first time a Saints pitcher has thrown 90 pitches at home this year. Among the 30 Triple-A teams only Toledo (1), Iowa (2), Indianapolis (4), and Syracuse (4) have thrown fewer 90 pitch games by their starters. The team the Saints play next, the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders also have only six games with a starter throwing 90 pitches or more.

FIRST PITCH FUN: Sometimes the first pitch is the best one you see and the Saints have taken advantage of that this year. The Saints have displayed power on the first pitch, sporting a .650 slugging percentage and 1.034 OPS good for fourth and fifth, respectively. They have also hit 25 first-pitch homers, ranking fifth. When runners are on base, the Saints have capitalized on that first pitch to drive in 119 runs, more than anyone else in the league (and tied for the second-most in all of full-season minor league baseball). Durham and St. Paul are the only clubs in the IL to rank in the top 5 of all those categories.

THE NINTH WAVE: The ninth inning has been a big inning for the Saints this season. They have hit 15 ninth inning home runs, tied four fourth in Minor League Baseball. Their .853 OPS in the ninth is fifth best.

LOCKED IN WHEN LOADED: Jermaine Palacios crushed a walk-off grand slam on July 31 vs. Iowa. It was the seventh grand slam hit by the Saints this season and the seventh of Palacios' career. The seven grand slams are tied with Columbus for the most in the International League and are tied for the fourth most in Minor League Baseball only behind Albuquerque (11), Eugene, and Reno (8), and tied with Lake County, Hickory and Great Lakes. With the bases loaded the Saints are second in full-season Minor League Baseball with an OPS of 1.158 and third with a .370 average.

RUN LIKE THE WIND: The Saints have been the one of the most efficient running teams in Minor League Baseball since July 1. They have swiped 30 bags in 32 opportunities, a 93.8% success rate trailing only the Beloit Sky Caps, 94.8%, and Modesto Nuts, 94.3%.

FIRST INNING FLOP: The St. Paul Saints have allowed at least one run in the first inning in 44 of 109 games (40.4%). They have allowed 89 runs in the first, second most in the International League and seventh most in all of Minor League Baseball behind Albuquerque (113), Stockton (111), Binghamton (96), Visalia (94), Rochester (93) and Northwest Arkansas (90). Their 25 home runs allowed are fifth most in Minor League Baseball. They have not allowed a run in the first in a season high 10 straight. Their previous high was five straight which they have done twice, the first five games of the season from April 5-9 @ Louisville and May 7-12.

TWINS UPDATE - The Minnesota Twins took down the Kansas City Royals 4-2 in the first game of the series on Monday night at Target Field. Joe Ryan worked 5.1 innings allowing two runs and striking out six. The bullpen did the rest with four relievers tossing 3.1 shutout innings allowing two hits and striking out four. Max Kepler went 3-4 with an RBI and Byron Buxton collected a pair of hits.

LAST APPEARANCE: 8/11 vs. COL...pitched 3.0 shutout innings allowing two hits while walking one and striking out two...did not receive a decision in a 2-0 Saints victory.

START PRIOR: 8/5 @ OMA...hurled 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits while striking out four...received the win in a 15-6 Saints victory.

A ROSE BY ANY OTHER NAME: Going by ones middle names is a common theme with this St. Paul Saints team. Dereck Rodriguez joins the middle name club. His given name is Ivan Dereck Rodriguez.

SON OF PUDGE: If you think the name Ivan Rodriguez sounds like a baseball players name, it should. Dereck's father is Hall of Fame catcher Ivan "Pudge" Rodriguez. Pudge played 21 seasons in the Major Leagues (1991-2002, 2009 with Texas, 2003 with Florida, 2004-08 with Detroit, 2008 with the Yankees, 2009 with Houston, and 2010-11 with Washington). He was a 14x All-Star, won 13 Gold Gloves, and won a World Series with the Marlins in 2003. On top of that he caught Kenny Rogers' perfect game with the Rangers in 1997. He was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 2017.

SHOULDN'T YOU BE A CATCHER: If your Dad is a Hall of Fame Catcher one would think you would grow up being a catcher too. For Dereck, he did start off his high school career at Monsignor Edward Pace (FL) HS as a catcher. Unfortunately, he didn't love the position and transitioned to the outfield. One of the other reasons he made the transition is he had a growth spurt in high school that vaulted him to 6'1 which made it uncomfortable to crouch.

I'M BATMAN: Dereck is a huge fan of Batman. He's such a big fan that he has a Batman tattoo on his right forearm. The tattoo's didn't stop there. He has since added a tattoo of The Joker, Catwoman, and Harley Quinn

IF YOU CAN'T BEAT THEM, JOIN THEM: From starting as a catcher in high school to being a converted outfielder, Dereck Rodriguez turned that into an 6th round selection out of high school. Unfortunately, hitting became an issue for Rodriguez. He hit just .216 with six homers and 37 RBI across 2017 games between the GCL and Rookie Elizabethton from 2011-13. The Twins then transitioned him into a pitcher and his career has since taken off.

SON OF PUDGE MEET KUNG FU PANDA: Once Rodriguez became a free agent, he decided to sign with the San Francisco Giants in 2018. The greatest influence was one Pablo Sandoval. The two were working out together during the offseason in Miami and Sandoval told him signing with the Giants would be a good fit.

DIDN'T YOU USED TO BE A HITTER: From high school position player, to 6th round draft pick, to transitioning into a pitcher after three professional seasons because he struggled at the plate to...collecting a base hit in your first Major League at bat. That's right. In his Major League debut on May 29, 2018 in Colorado he promptly doubled in his second at bat off Kyle Freeland. Since then, he's collected just seven more hits and is hitting .131 (8-61) in his career.

- Has been part of four different MLB organizations (Minnesota - 2011-17, San Francisco - 2018-20, Detroit - 2020 and Colorado - 2021)
- Made his first career Opening Day roster for San Francisco in 2019
- Named to the Baseball America Major League All-Rookie Team in 2018
- Made his major league debut May 29 at Colorado and finished the season second in ERA (2.81), third in opponent batting average (.223), sixth in innings pitched (118.1), eighth in starts (19) and ninth in strikeouts (89) among qualifying National League rookies
- His 2.81 ERA (118.1 IP, 37 ER) was the lowest by a Giants rookie pitcher (min. 100.0 IP) since Hall of Famer Hoyt Wilhelm (2.43) in 1952 and the seventh lowest among NL pitchers on the season (min. 100.0 IP)
- Became the first Giants pitcher since 1900 to pitch six-or-more innings and allow two-or-fewer runs in at least 13 of his first 16 career starts (June 3-Sept. 10, 2018)
- Made nine consecutive starts of six-or-more innings and two-or-fewer runs from June 14-Aug. 24, 2018...became the third rookie pitcher in major league history to make nine such starts consecutively since 1958 (also: Joe Blanton, 2005 and Mike Fiers, 2012)
- Was 2017 Florida State League Midseason All-Star with High-A Fort Myers
- Led the Appalachian League in innings pitched (66.1 IP), while ranking fourth in strikeouts (61) and sixth in ERA (2.85)
- Named 2015 Appalachian League Pitcher of the Year and was name a Postseason All-Star
- Converted to a relief pitcher in 2014 after spending three years as an outfielder (2011-13) and didn't allow a run over his first 11 appearances (17.0 IP). Finished the season 2-2, 1.05 ERA (25.2 IP, 3 ER) with five saves, eight walks and 19 strikeouts across 17 relief appearances
