**Aviators vs. Chihuahuas:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will face the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-Affiliate of the San Diego Padres, tonight in game two of the six-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Las Vegas Ballpark (8,196)...Las Vegas dropped the series opener, 7-5 in 10 innings, last night...the regular season ending six-game home stand against El Paso will conclude on Sunday, September 22...the PCL and International League Playoffs (best-of-three LCS) will then begin on Tuesday, September 24 through Thursday, September 26 (if necessary).

### El Paso defeats Las Vegas 7-5 in 10 innings in series opener:

The Margaritas defeated the Reyes de Plata 7-5 in 10 innings last night in the opener of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 6,926 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 5 hits and stranded seven runners on base. Las Vegas built a 5-2 lead after four innings. Left fielder **CJ Alexander** was 1-for-2, three walks, double, RBI, two runs scored. Center fielder **Logan Davidson** was 1-for-4, 2 RBI and designated hitter **Yohel Pozo** (1-for-4) hit a solo home run in the fourth inning.

**El Paso Offense:** The Chihuahuas recorded 9 hits and stranded 11 runners on base. El Paso rallied from a 5-5 deficit and scored two runs in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning. Right fielder **Cal Mitchell** was 1-for-3, two walks, solo home run, two runs scored. Catcher **Luis Campusano** was 2-for-4, walk, RBI, run scored and second baseman **Clay Dungan** was 2-for-4, double, RBI, run scored.

**Aviators Starting Pitching:** Right-hander **Austin Pruitt** pitched 3.0 innings in the no decision. He allowed 1 hit, two unearned runs, walked 3 and struck out 2 on 54 pitches.

**Las Vegas defeats Albuquerque 13-1 in series finale (Sunday, September 15):** The Aviators defeated the Isotopes 13-1 in the finale of the six-game road trip before a crowd of 8,979 at Rio Grande Credit Union Field at Isotopes Park. Las Vegas was 5-1 in the series.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 14 hits and stranded six runners on base. Las Vegas had five players record multiple-hit games: Second baseman **Brett Harris** was 3-for-4, walk, 2 RBI, three runs scored. Designated hitter **Logan Davidson** was 2-for-5, double, HR, 3 RBI, two runs scored; shortstop **Darell Hernaiz** was 2-for-6, HR, 2 RBI and first baseman **Yohel Pozo** was 2-for-5, double, RBI, run scored.

**Albuquerque Offense:** The Isotopes recorded 4 hits and stranded five runners on base. Albuquerque scored its lone run in the seventh inning on a home run by right fielder **Trevor Boone** (1-for-3). Center fielder **Greg Jones** was 2-for-4, double.

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS** – Las Vegas dropped the series opener, 7-5 in 10 innings, last night...the final homestand of the regular season against the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, will conclude on Sunday, September 22 ('24 season finale)...Las Vegas is 9-4 over its last 13 games...El Paso and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 18 times in 2024...**the Aviators lead all of Triple-A (30 teams) with 896 runs scored and 228 home runs**...the '24 campaign will feature 149 games (75-home; 74-away).

**NOTE:** The Triple-A season will be split in two halves, with the first half concluded on **Sunday, June 23**...the second half began on **Tuesday, June 25**...the first-half winners (PCL and International League) will serve as the hosts of the pair of best-of-three League Championship Series against the second-half winner from September 24-26...the **Triple-A National Championship Game**, which will follow the best-of-three LCS of the two leagues, will crown an overall winner of the highest level of the Minor Leagues...the winners of the IL and PCL will meet in a single-game format on Saturday, September 28 at Las Vegas Ballpark at 7 p.m. PT...**Sugar Land Space Cowboys** won the first half in the PCL (49-26, .653) and the **Omaha Storm Chasers**, won the first half in the IL (Triple-A best record of 49-24, .671).

**2024 PCL PITCHERS OF THE WEEK:** Right-hander **Oswaldo Bido** from April 29 – May 5 (defeated Reno on May 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark: season-high 7.0 shutout innings, two hits, one walk, eight strikeouts). Right-hander **Joe Boyle** from July 22-28 (5.0 shutout innings in a no decision at Reno on July 26, one hit, two walks, nine strikeouts) and from August 5-11 (defeated Salt Lake on August 6, 5.2 shutout innings, one hit, one walk, season-high 12 strikeouts)...left-hander **Brady Basso** was named PCL August Minor League Pitcher of the Month (5 starts/2-1/2.84 ERA/25.1 IP/27 SO).

**2024 PCL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** Outfielder **Daz Cameron** from April 29 – May 5...appeared in seven games vs. Reno and batted .591 (13-for-22) with five doubles, triple, home run, five walks, two stolen bases and 10 RBI...recorded four straight multiple-hit games...Outfielder **Seth Brown** from June 17-23...appeared in four games against Tacoma and batted .444 (8-for-18) with two doubles, three home runs, 7 RBI, seven runs scored...infielder **Jordan Díaz** from July 29 – August 4...appeared in five games against Albuquerque and batted .500 (12-for-24) with three doubles, four home runs and 13 RBI...infielder/outfielder **Ryan Noda** from August 12-18...appeared in six games and batted .455 (10-for-22) with five doubles, four home runs, five walks, 10 RBI and 27 total bases...infielder/outfielder **Logan Davidson** from August 26 – September 1...appeared in five games and batted .524 (11-for-21) with two doubles, triple, two home runs and 5 RBI and hit for the cycle on August 30 (5-for-5)...catcher **Carlos Pérez** from September 2-8...appeared in five games and batted .350 (7-for-20) with five walks, three home runs and 9 RBI...infielder/outfielder **Logan Davidson** from September 9-15...appeared in six games and batted .538 (14-for-26) with six doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI.

**THE "3 20's" HOME RUNS IN A SEASON:** C/INF **Carlos Pérez** (26), INF **Jordan Díaz** (22) and INF/OF **Ryan Noda** (22) have reached the 20-home run mark...the last time three players reached 20 plus home runs in a season was 2021: **Carlos Pérez** (31), C/INF **Francisco Peña** (23) and C **Austin Allen** (20).

**41<sup>st</sup> SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024)** – The Aviators are playing in their 41<sup>st</sup> season (42<sup>nd</sup> calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL is in its 121<sup>st</sup> season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers;

**East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Baseball Club, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

**2023 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2022 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51<sup>s</sup>) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record

of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

**AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:**

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!
