YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Rumble Ponies, 10-7. Richmond took a 4-0 lead in the first inning with an RBI double by **Maui Ahuna**, an RBI double by **Charlie Szykowny** and a two-run single by **Diego Velasquez**. Eli Serrano III hit a solo homer in the second. In the third, Szykowny hit a solo homer for a 5-1 Richmond lead. In the top of the fourth, D'Andre Smith and Nick Lorusso hit solo homers. In the fifth, Serrano hit an RBI single and a run scored on a wild pitch to tie the score, 5-5. The Flying Squirrels moved back ahead, 7-5, with a solo homer by **Jonah Cox** and an RBI triple by Szykowny, who finished a single shy of the cycle. JT Schwartz tied the score, 7-7, with a two-run homer in the sixth. Binghamton took a 9-7 lead with an RBI single and by Jose Ramos and an error in the seventh. Wyatt Young added a pinch-hit, RBI single in the top of the ninth.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game series against the Binghamton Rumble Ponies, Double-A affiliate of the New York Mets. This is the only series between these two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels are 16-3 at home this year and 9-3 against teams from the Northeast Division.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 28-11 start is the best in team history through 29 games, passing a 22-17 start in 2010 and 2022. Richmond has won five series and split two so far this year. Six-of-11 Richmond losses have been by one run.

RELENTLESS: In their 28 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 14 of them. In nine of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have the second-best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, behind only a 31-9 record for High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 120 full-season MiLB teams in batting average (.295). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, runs (271), hits (393), doubles (91), triples (15), RBIs (251), OBP (.374) and OPS (.861). In 20 road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .306 (220-for-718) and have scored 155 runs (7.8 runs per game). In 19 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .281 (173-for-616) and have scored 116 runs (6.1 runs per game).

THE RUMBLE PONIES have the Eastern League's worst record after going 90-46 and winning the EL title in 2025, becoming the first Eastern League team to win 90 games and the postseason championship since the 1993 Harrisburg Senators. Last week, Binghamton went 2-4 against the Patriots at home. The Binghamton roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Mets prospects list, including 3B Jacob Reimer (No. 6), LHP Jonathan Santucci (No. 8), C/1B Christopher Suero (No. 12), OF Eli Serrano (No. 15), SS/2B Marco Vargas (No. 17) and RHP R.J. Gordon (No. 22). MLB.com's top-30 Mets prospect list features six Binghamton players, including Reimer (No. 4), Santucci (No. 8), Serrano (No. 12), Gordon (No. 18), Vargas (No. 19) and RHP Brendan Girton (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Matt Wilkinson** makes first home start as a member of the Flying Squirrels. In his Giants organization debut last Wednesday, he threw five scoreless innings and allowed two hits with six strikeouts in a win at Erie. He was acquired by San Francisco on May 9 along with the 29th pick in this year's MLB Draft in exchange for former Flying Squirrels catcher Patrick Bailey. Among full-season MiLB pitchers this year, Wilkinson ranks third in ERA (1.35), seventh in WHIP (0.84) and tied for eighth in BAA (.165). He leads the Eastern League in ERA and WHIP and ranks tied for first in BAA and tied for sixth in strikeouts (42). Wilkinson is in his first Double-A season and began the year with Akron, going 1-2 with a 1.59 ERA in six starts before the trade. On April 19 against Binghamton, he threw five perfect innings with six strikeouts in a combined no-hitter. Wilkinson was selected by Cleveland in the 10th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Central Arizona College, where he was the NJCAA Division I Pitcher of the Year. This spring, he made two scoreless appearances for Canada in the World Baseball Classic. *For more on Wilkinson, see page two.*

FOR BINGHAMTON: Left-hander Jonathan Santucci makes his eighth start of the season and third first of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Thursday at Somerset and was charged with a loss after allowing four runs (two earned) over five innings. For the year, Santucci is tied for sixth in the Eastern League in strikeouts (42), seventh in BAA (.209) and ninth in WHIP (1.30). He also leads the EL in K/9 (11.34) and ranks third in strikeouts percentage (30.9). Santucci was selected by the Mets in the second round (46th overall) of the 2024 MLB Draft out of Duke. In his professional debut season in 2025, he made 15 starts with High-A Brooklyn and went 5-4 with a 3.46 ERA. He was promoted to Double-A in July and went 4-0 with a 2.52 ERA in 10 starts for Binghamton. Santucci is rated by Baseball America and MLB.com as the No. 8 Mets prospect.

COX ROCKS: **Jonah Cox** reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on May 5. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 33-of-35 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on May 5. He is currently riding an 11-game hit streak since May 6. On May 1 (G1) at Altoona, he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game. For the year, he leads MiLB in batting average (.419), is tied for first in triples (5) and ranks second in SLG (.718) and second in OPS (1.182). His 21 steals are third in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons. The 21 steals are also tied for 10th-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history.

PARKS HR-BER: **Parks Harber** has homered four times and picked up nine RBIs in his last six games since last Wednesday, starting the stretch going 3-for-4 with four RBIs at Erie. He homered again the following game on Thursday and drove in three runs. In the first game of Sunday's doubleheader, he hit two solo home runs, the second multi-homer game of his professional career.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 288 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Macherec** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,262).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.419), first in OBP (.464), first in SLG (.718), first in OPS (1.182), first in hits (52), first in triples (5), first in total bases (89), tied for second in RBIs (33) tied for third in extra-base hits (20) and third in stolen bases (21). **Scott Bandura** is tied for first in runs (33), second in OBP (.430), tied for third in hits (46), tied for fourth in RBIs (32), tied for seventh in walks (25) and sixth in batting average (.324). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for seventh in hits (41). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in ERA (1.35), first in WHIP (0.84), tied for first in BAA (.165) and tied for sixth in strikeouts (42). **Darien Smith** is fourth in ERA (2.84), third in BAA (.180), fifth in WHIP (1.11) and tied for fifth in wins (4). **Trystan Vrieling** is 10th in ERA (3.75) and 10th in BAA (.224). **Joe Whitman** is first in strikeouts (48), tied for first in wins (5), fourth in WHIP (1.02), tied for fourth in BAA (.201), tied for fifth in innings pitched (38.1) and tied for seventh in ERA (3.52). **Jack Choate** is tied for first in wins (5). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for second in saves (5). **Mitch White** is tied for fourth in saves (4).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 13), **Joe Whitman** (No. 18), **Jonah Cox** (No. 21), **Matt Wilkinson** (No. 25) and **Diego Velasquez** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and Cox is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1964: The Richmond Virginians beat the Columbus Jets, 6-3, at Parker Field. Elvio Jimenez drove in the go-ahead run for a 4-3 lead in the seventh. Ted Kazanski added a two-run homer in the eighth. Harry Bright had a double, a single, an RBI and a run scored in the win. **1966:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 6-0, at Parker Field. Larry Maxie threw a seven-hit shutout, aided by four double plays. Richmond scored three unearned runs in the fourth, including an RBI double by Tommie Aaron, before a two-run homer by Gil Garrido in the fifth opened a 5-0 lead. The game marked the return to Parker Field for the former Richmond Virginians, who moved to Toledo to become the Mud Hens for the 1965 season. The R-Braves management billed the game as a "second opening night." **1984:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 7-6, at Parker Field. Larry Whisenton drove in the game winning run with a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning.
