START YOUR ENGINES: The Omaha Storm Chasers begin the 2022 season with a six-game series against the Indianapolis Indians, the Triple-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, at Victory Field in Indianapolis, Ind. Omaha finished 2021 with a 73-56 (.66) record, which included a 12-5 record against Indianapolis. Omaha's .566 winning percentage in 2021 was the first season with a winning percentage over .500 since 2015 (.556), the best since 2012 (.576), and the eighth-best in franchise history.

FEELIN' 2022: 2022 marks the 11th season of Storm Chasers baseball (2011-pres.) and the 53rd season in franchise history (1969-pres.). Since 1969, 1,304 players have appeared in either an American Association, Pacific Coast League, or Triple-A East game. Of those 1,304 players, 978 (75%) have appeared in a Major League game. 309 players in franchise history (24%) made their debut with Omaha prior to their Major League debut, including six during the 2021 season: **C Sebastian Rivero** (2019, 2021), **RHP Jackson Kowar** (2021), **INF Emmanuel Rivera** (2021), **INF Jack López** (2017-2018), **RHP Dylan Coleman** (2021), and **LHP Angel Zerpa** (2021).

GOING INTERNATIONAL: The Storm Chasers played the 2021 season as part of a newly-created Triple-A East, which has been renamed the International League entering 2022. While Triple-A East had three division, the International League will have two. Omaha will play in the I.L. West Division with Columbus, Gwinnett, Indianapolis, Iowa, Louisville, Memphis, Nashville, St. Paul, and Toledo, while the I.L. East Division includes Buffalo, Charlotte, Durham, Jacksonville, Lehigh-Valley, Norfolk Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Syracuse, Rochester, and Worcester.

THE MIGHTY THOR: **Scott Thorman** embarks on his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for **Brian Poldberg**, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, becomes the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlanta on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager **Tommy Shields**, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

RETURN OF THE KING: Catcher **MJ Melendez**, who led all of Minor League Baseball with 41 total home runs in 2021, returns to the Storm Chasers to begin the 2022 season. Melendez split the 2021 season between Double-A Northwest Arkansas and Triple-A Omaha, batting .288/.386/.625. In addition to leading the minors in home runs, he ranked second in RBIs (103), fourth in extra-base hits (66), and fourth in OPS (1.011) to earn Top Offensive Player honors as part of MiLB Award voting. Melendez enters the 2022 season as the No. 3 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline and the No. 62 prospect in baseball.

PARTY WITH A CAPITAL P: First basemen **Nick Pratto** (No. 3) and **Vinnie Pasquantino** (No. 5) each rank among MLB Pipeline's Top 10 First Baseman prospects. Pratto, the Royals' No. 3 prospect and No. 62 prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, returns to the Storm Chasers after making his Triple-A debut in 2021. He finished the 2021 season second in Minor League Baseball in extra-base hits (71), tied for second in home runs (36), third in RBIs (98), tied for third in runs (98) and fifth in walks (83). Pasquantino, who ranks as the organization's No. 5 prospect per MLB Pipeline, tallied the same number of walks (64), strikeouts (64), and extra-base hits (64) across 116 games between High-A Quad Cities and Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021.

FOR OMAHA: After starting the final game of the 2021 season, **RHP Ronald Bolaños** takes the hill as the Storm Chasers' Opening Day starter in 2022. The right-hander made 10 starts for Omaha in 2021, posting a 6.34 ERA in 38.1 innings, striking out 34 and walking 27. After starting the year with Omaha, the 30-year-old from Santa Cruz del Norte, Cuba, joined the Kansas City bullpen before missing more than two months with a right forearm strain. He faced Indianapolis twice last season, both at Werner Park, striking out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings of one-run ball on 5/27 and allowing three runs on five hits in 4.2 innings with six strikeouts and two walks on 9/25.

FOR INDIANAPOLIS: RHP Cody Bolton makes his Triple-A debut as Indianapolis' Opening Day starter and is poised for his first outing since 2019. A sixth-round pick by Pittsburgh in 2017 out of Tracy HS (Calif.), Bolton suffered a torn right meniscus in April of 2021, forcing him to miss the season. The 23-year-old split 2019 between High-A Bradenton and Double-A Altoona, combining to post a 3.28 ERA in 101.2 innings with 102 strikeouts and 30 walks across 21 starts.
