SUGAR LAND SPACE COWBOYS (26-15) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (13-28)

Thursday, May 16, 2024 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • RGCU Field at Isotopes Park • Albuquerque, NM Game #42, Home Game #24

RHP AJ BLUBAUGH (2-0, 4.39) vs. LHP Josh Rogers (1-3, 5.14)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes evened the series at a game apiece last night with a 9-2 triumph ... Albuquerque looks to win its second-straight over Sugar Land for the first time since June 28-29, 2022 ... Josh Rogers is expected to start for the Isotopes while AJ Blubaugh is slated to start for the Space Cowboys.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Albuquerque's seven-run margin of victory last night is the largest since the club claimed a 22-4 win May 3, 2023, in the Duke City—the largest margin of victory for the Isotopes in the series.

KB: In his second rehab game of the stint, Kris Bryant tallied one hit, a single, in five at-bats. Over two games, he is 1-for-7 with a walk and two runs.

JONESY: Making his first rehab appearance last night, Nolan Jones went 0-for-3 with an RBI. He also tallied an outfield assist from the wall in left field, throwing out a runner at third base tagging on a fly ball from second.

HOLD A LEAD: Last night was the first home game of the season the Isotopes did not trail at any point during a game.

ASSIST: The outfield assist by Jones was just Albuquerque's third of the year and second at third base (also: Jimmy Herron and Greg Jones).

RUNS: The Isotopes pitching staff relented just two runs last night, tied for the fewest allowed on the year (also: April 18 at El Paso) ... Yielded just one earned run for third time in 2024, also a season-low (also: April 6 at OKC and May 4 vs. RR).

SWIPES: Albuquerque swiped three bases last night, ending a season-high three-game stretch without a stolen base. It's the 12th time this season the club has swiped three-plus bases in a contest. Their 65 swipes on the year are second-most in Triple-A (most: Tacoma, 87).

THREE-BAGGERS: The Isotopes tripled three times Tuesday, the 26th time the club has recorded three-plus triples in a game, second this season (also: March 31 vs. El Paso).

MILB LEADERS: The Isotopes have an MiLB-leading 22 threebaggers on the year. Tallied a triple in 15 of 41 games.

ERRORS: The Isotopes committed two errors last night, giving them a Triple-A high of 46 in 2024 (three teams tied for second-most: 38), It's their 14th game of the year with multiple miscues. Grant Lavigne made his 11th error of the year, tied for the most in Triple-A (Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes registered a season-high four hits (most since Sept. 9, 2023, vs. Reno, also four) and four RBI (most since Sept. 20, 2023 vs OKC), including a double and homer. It's his team-leading 18th multi-hit of the year and his third-straight. Over his last three contests, he is 8x13 with two doubles, a homer and six RBI.

TONY: Drew Romo belted his fourth homer of the year last night, a three-run shot, and collected a single for his 15th multi-hit contest of 2024. Has produced a .424/.433/.667 slashline with 10 doubles, one triple, four homers and 19 RBI over his last 24 games.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard registered a single and drew two walks, his third-straight game with a pair of free passes. He also has a hit in eight of his last nine games (12x35 with three doubles, one triple, three homers, five RBI and eight walks) ... Sits on the Pacific Coast leaderboard in 10 categories.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk extended his hit streak to seven games with a single. During the stretch, he is slashing .367/_424/.733 with three doubles, one triple, two homers and two RBI.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia struckout four times last night, the most punchouts in a game since April 5, 2023, at Round Rock,

BIG WILLIE STYLE: Willie MacIver tallied a triple and drew two walks last night and is 8-for-14 with a homer, triple and four RBI during his last four games with three mult-hit contests; Has also walked in three of his last four contests (four total).

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron registered a single Saturday and has a hit in 23 of 25 games played in 2024, including nine of his last 10 ... Since June 25, 2023, has reached base in 68 of his last 75 games.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 2nd in average (.366) and T-8th in doubles (11) and hits (45) ... Aaron Schunk is T-3rd in doubles (13) ... Coco Montes is 3rd in OBP (.445) and average (.353), 5th in hits (48) and T-6th in OPS (1.004) ... Sam Hilliard is 2nd in total bases (90), T-2nd in runs (34), 3rd in XBH (22), 4th in OPS (1.046) and slugging (.621), 5th in OBP (.425), T-5th in homers (9), 6th in hits (47), T-6th in triples (3), and 10th in average (.324) ... **Julio Carreras** is T-6th in triples (3).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Released by Baltimore on May 31, 2021; signed a Minor League deal with Washington on June 4
- Designated for assignment by Washington on Aug. 2, 2022, elected free agency
- Signed a Minor League contract with Miami on Aug. 10, 2022 and finished the campaign at Triple-A Jacksonville
- Played for the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod League in 2014 and 2015
- 2014 and 2015 NCAA Louisville Regional All-Tournament Team
- 2015 All-ACC Second Team
