SERIES SO FAR: The TinCaps shut out the Loons, 5-0, on Tuesday, before Great Lakes eked out a 3-2 win last night... Tonight is a win-or-go-home game for both teams.

POSTSEASON PAST: In the franchise's 30 seasons, Fort Wayne has now reached the Midwest League Playoffs 17 times. The 'Caps won it all in 2009, while finishing as runner-up in '12 and '17. More details on last page.

SEASON ACCOMPLISHMENTS: The TinCaps achieved an overall winning record for the first time since 2015... The 'Caps had a winning record in a half for the first time since the second half of 2017... Fort Wayne hit a franchise record 136 home runs, surpassing the club's previous high of 127 in 2017... From April 29-May 10, the TinCaps homered in a record 10 consecutive games (previous record streak was 8 games, which hadn't happened since 1998)... The 'Caps also matched a franchise record with 6 grand slams (last: 2006).

FORT WAYNE FAITHFUL: The TinCaps averaged 5,313 fans per game this year across 64 openings, including 16 sellouts (season high of 8,516 on the 4^{th} of July). Fort Wayne's average attendance, its highest since 2019, ranked 3^{rd} out of 60 Single-A and High-A clubs, and is greater than 25 Double-A teams and 10 in Triple-A.

POWER PERSPECTIVE: 20 different players homered for the 'Caps, led by Nathan Martorella and Graham Pauley with 16... Meanwhile, TinCaps pitchers allowed the 2nd fewest HR (86) out of 90 High-A, Double-A and Triple-A teams.

HOT CAPS: The TinCaps won 8 of their last 11 to close the regular season, including their first 5-game home winning streak since 2018... The 'Caps had a 6-game winning streak from July 2-7, their first 6-game winning streak since 2018 as well... After an 0-5 and 10-22 start, the TinCaps went 59-41 from May 14 on... From mid-May to mid-July, they were 6-0-2 over 8 series.

STARTING PITCHING: TinCaps starters had the 5th lowest ERA of 120 MiLB clubs (3.62).

TYLER ROBERTSON: Since debuting Aug. 22, led the team in H, R, 3B and TB.

NERWILIAN CEDEÑO: Since July 25 (42 G), slashed .247 / .328 / .446 (.774 OPS) with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 7 HR, 27 RBIs, and 5 SB... 4 HR in last 12 G.

LUCAS DUNN: 9th in the MWL in games played (119)... Started 44 games at 2B, 5 at 3B, 16 in LF, 3 in CF, 44 in RF, and 4 as the DH.

ALBERT FABIAN: Last Wednesday-Saturday @ Dayton, hit .313 with a double, 2 HR, and 3 RRIs

KERVIN PICHARDO: Since July 21 (34 G), slashed .362 / .456 / .581 (1.037 OPS) with 5 doubles, 6 homers, 21 RBIs, and 5 stolen bases... 6-game hitting streak... 9 consecutive games on base... 2 HR on Saturday night.

SAMMY ZAVALA: His home run Tuesday was retrieved by a young fan named Brennen, who gave the ball back to Sammy after the game. In exchange, Sammy signed another ball for Brennen and gifted him a pair of spikes. Brennen described it as the "best night ever."

FELICIDADES: Pitchers **Henry Baez** and **Francis Peña** were selected in the Dominican Professional Baseball League Draft on Wednesday night. Baez went in the 8th round to the Estrellas (managed by Fernando Tatis Sr.), while Peña was picked in the 9th round by Escogido (GM: Moisés Alou).

CLEMENTE DAY: Coinciding with the start of National Hispanic Heritage Month, baseball honors Hall of Famer Roberto Clemente today. The native of Puerto Rico was a 15-time All-Star, 12-time Gold Glove winner, had 4 batting titles, won an MVP, and finished with 3,000 hits before passing in a plane crash on New Year's Eve in 1972, at the age of 38, while delivering emergency aid to earthquake victims in Nicaragua.

More News, Notes & Season Storylines

ROSTER NOTES: The TinCaps had 26 different position players and 38 pitchers, for a total of 64 on the roster (a franchise record). Catcher Colton Bender and infielder Carlos Luis were the only position players who remained on the active roster all year. Relievers Ethan Routzahn, and Adam Smith were the only pitchers who remained active all season. The only remaining Opening Day starters are infielder Nerwilian Cedeño (2B) and Luis (DH). In total, there are currently 6 pitchers and 4 position players active who were on the Opening Day roster.

COMMUNITY PLAYERS OF THE YEAR: Catcher Colton Bender and reliever Keegan Collett were recognized pregame Tuesday and each gets to donate \$750 to a non-profit of their choice.

SAMMY ZAVALA: With Single-A Lake Elsinore, hit 14 homers, 22 doubles, and had 20 stolen bases. Since 2006, only 14 minor leaguers, as a teenager, have hit 15+ HR with 20+ 2B and 20+ SB. The list includes former TinCap Fernando Tatis Jr. in 2017, along with the likes of Ronald Acuña Jr. (2017), Bryce Harper (2011), Christian Yelich (2011), and Andrew McCutcheon (2006). Only one of those prospects (Adael Amador, last year with Single-A Fresno-Rockies) also drew 80+ walks, like Zavala... Ranks 10th in all of MiLB in walks (94).

**CAPS AGAINST CANCER: Relievers Keegan Collett, Carter Loewen, and Ethan Routzahn, along with mascot Johnny TinCap, visited patients at the Parkview Packnett Family Cancer Institute last Tuesday. Saturday was 'Caps Against Cancer Night. The team wore special jerseys that are up for auction through <u>TinCaps.Jersey.com</u>, with proceeds going to Parkview's Transformative Cancer Care Fund. The auction ends next Sunday (5pm). The jersey design was inspired by the "Floating Flowers" artwork of former Parkview patient Ric Trimble. Read more about his legacy on <u>TinCaps.com</u>. His family was at the game as special guests.

AWARDS: The TinCaps have had 3 players earn the Midwest League's Player of the Week Award, plus 2 pitchers win the Pitcher of the Week honor: RHP Jairo Iriarte (May 21)... INF Marcos Castañon (July 9)... INF Graham Pauley (Aug. 6)... OF Jakob Marsee (Aug. 13)... RHP Victor Lizarraga (Aug. 20)... Lizarraga (Sept. 4).

FARM SYSTEM RANKINGS: The latest Baseball America farm system rankings have the Padres at No. 7. MLB.com ranks them 9th and ESPN has San Diego at No. 10.

260 TO THE SHOW: Since Fort Wayne's franchise was established in 1993, there've been 216 alumni who've gone on to appear in the majors, including 57 so far this year (the record in a single season is 58 in 2021). The list is headlined by All-Stars like Fernando Tatis Jr. (2017). Trea Turner (2014), and David Bednar (2016-17).

HAYDEN'S HOMECOMING: Dayton catcher Hayden Jones grew up in Fort Wayne and graduated from Carroll High School in 2018. Playing under coach Dave Ginder, was a 4-year letterwinner, 3-time all-state selection, and 2-time team captain. The Chargers won a sectional title his senior season, as he was also MVP of Indiana's North/South All-Star Game. Went to Mississippi State for a season and then spent 2 years at Illinois State before signing with the Reds in August 20201... His dad (Ken) was drafted by the Padres in 1995 and that year played in the Midwest League with the Clinton LumberKings... 260 TO A PRO: Jones is 1 of 11 guys from the Fort Wayne area currently playing professional baseball. The list also includes Blue Jays outfielder Kevin Kiermaier (Bishop Luers, 2008) and Tigers infielder Zach McKinstry (North Side, 2014), who last played here in 2018. Andrew Saalfrank, a lefty reliever who graduated from Heritage HS in 2016, was called up by the D-backs last Monday.

NO-HITTER: On May 16 @ Dayton, Jairo Iriarte (6 innings), Alan Mundo (1.2 IP), and Adam Smith (1.1 IP) combined to no-hit the Dragons in a 6-0 victory. It was just the 3rd no-hitter in Fort Wayne's 30-year franchise history and the first in more than a decade... Center fielder Jakob Marsee, who made a spectacular diving catch as he sprinted in from center field for the first out in the bottom of the 9th inning, also caught the final out. While he had been aware of the no-hitter late in the game, in the moment, it evaded his mind and he tossed the ball to a teenage fan sitting in right-center field. After the game, the teen named Wyatt, offered to return the ball. The TinCaps invited Wyatt and his family and friends out to the game on May 21, as Marsee exchanged the momentous ball for one signed by Iriarte, Mundo, and Smith, plus a signed bat and an autographed copy of their historic lineup card.

CLASS OF 2023: Reliever José Geraldo, a native of the Dominican Republic who signed with the Padres at the age of 18 in 2018, earned his high school diploma Tuesday. The team held a special ceremony in the clubhouse. Kaittyn Simmons is San Diego's Learning, Education, and Life Skills Manager, while Vicente Cafaro is the club's International Player Development Coordinator... Fort Wayne big league alums LaTroy Hawkins ('93) and Esteury Ruiz ('18) were among those who sent a note of congrats on Instagram.

SIGNIFICANT ROSTER MOVES: On June 27, the Padres promoted 4 players up to Double-A San Antonio, including catching prospect Brandon Valenzuela, while 7 players were called up from Single-A Lake Elsinore, including left-handed starting pitcher Robby Snelling (San Diego's top lefty pitching prospect). On July 14, the Padres promoted their then-No. I ranked prospect, Jackson Merrill, to Double-A San Antonio, along with RHP Adam Mazur (No. 6), RHP Jairo Iriarte (No. 11), RHP Ryan Bergert (No. 24), and INF Marcos Castañon (FanGraphs No. 27)... On Aug. 21, the Padres promoted C Ethan Salas (No. 1), LHP Robby Snelling (No. 3), 18 Nathan Martorella (No. 10), INF Graham Pauley (No. 11), and OF Jakob Marsee (No. 12) to San Antonio... Through the first 69 games of the season, the TinCaps used a total of 40 players (16 position players and 24 pitchers).

DEPARTED FROM THE LINEUP: JACKSON MERRILL was MLB.com's highest-ranked prospect in the MWL (No. 9 on Top 100 list)... played in the Futures Game... Since May 5, was leading the league in average (313). For the year, 2nd in R (50), 5th in Th (1/24), and 9th in AVG (280)... 6th lowest K% (12%)... MARCOS CASTAÑON was the Midwest League Player of the Week... In the MWL, ranked 1th in SLG (.491) and TB (142), 2nd in HR (13), RBIs (58), H (83) and XBH (33), 3th in DPS (.843), 4th in 2B (20). 5th in AVG (287) and 7th in 6 (77)... 5th in VF (136).

PACE OF PLAY: The average time for a 9-inning game at Parkview Field was 2 hours and 36 minutes. The Midwest League average has been about 2:33... The average in Fort Wayne last year was 2:34... In 2021, it was 3:14... On July 6, the TinCaps and Whitecaps played a 9-inning game that was just 1 hour and 53 minutes, and on Sept. 3, Fort Wayne beat South Bend in 1 hour and 52 minutes.

MORE THAN BASEBALL: While the TinCaps were on their 12-game road trip in late June and early July, Parkview Field hosted "Bert Kreischer's Fully Loaded Comedy Festival" on June 23 and "Ripple: A Middle Waves Music Festival Hype Event" on June 24... the Fort Wayne Philharmonic Pops took place on July 1.

5,000,000 FANS: With a sellout crowd of 7,440 fans at Parkview Field on June 16, the TinCaps welcomed their 5 millionth fan since the ballpark opened in 2009. For perspective,

FIRST HALF REVIEW: The TinCaps (32-34) finished 4th in the 6-team Midwest League East Division, which was won by the Dodgers-affiliated Great Lakes Loons (45-20)... Out of the 12 teams in the league, the 'Caps actually tied for the 3th best run differential (+20)... Fort Wayne pitchers allowed the fewest home runs (34) out of all 90 High-A, Double, and Triple-A teams... The TinCaps began the season with an 0-5 record and were as many as 12 games below .500 through May 13 (10-22)... They ended the half going 22-12.

HOME RUN HISTORY: The TinCaps set a franchise record by homering in 10 consecutive games from April 29-May 10. Dating back to the franchise's founding in 1993, Fort Wayne had never before homered in more than 8 consecutive games (that happened 3 times, and not since 1998, according to club records)... On June 29 at Lake County, the TinCaps hit 5 home runs – their most in a game since 2005. (The franchise record for homers in a game is 6, which last occurred in 2002.)... The team has hit 6 grand slams on the season, tying a franchise record (also: 1996 & 2006).

SHUTOUT STREAK: TinCaps pitchers threw 27 consecutive scoreless innings during their series against Lansing in May. The TinCaps' record for consecutive scoreless innings is 35 – set in July 2009. Along the way then, Fort Wayne pitched 3 consecutive shutouts. That year's team went on to win the Midwest League title... The TinCaps had last pitched consecutive shutouts July 3-4, 2018, against the Great Lakes Loons. The latter of those games was started by MacKenzie Gore, who's now a starter with the Washington Nationals.

CAPS IN THE COMMUNITY: Last Thursday morning the entire team volunteered at Fort Wayne's Veterans National Memorial Shrine & Museum. They assisted with various manual labor tasks around the complex, like moving cinder blocks and wood, mulching, and cleaning the museum space. Players, coaches, and staff also had the chance to meet veterans at the facility. The TinCaps' parent club, the Padres, is known as the "Team of the Military" throughout professional sports. In 1995, the Padres became the first pro sports team to establish a Military Affairs department and have actively honored and supported those who serve our nation ever since... On June 14, players and coaches volunteered with The Rescue Mission, a local non-profit that provides restorative care to those experiencing a homelessness crisis. One group served lunch at Life House downtown, while others went to Charis House, a shelter for women and children, to help beautify their grounds and playground, and another group went to Treasure House, a thrift store.

CELEBRATION OF WOMEN IN SPORTS: On June 3, in partnership with Fort Wayne Parks, the TinCaps unveiled 2 new monuments at Memorial Park (about 2 miles east of Parkview Field) to honor the Fort Wayne Daisies of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League. The monuments feature the names of all 144 team members over the course of the squad's run from 1945-54. The Daisies won 3 regular season titles and reached the championship series 4 times. Former Daisies pitcher Dolly Vanderlip Ozburn was in attendance. She also pitched for the South Bend Blue Sox. Meanwhile, Jeneane DesCombes Lesko (pitcher/outfielder for Grand Rapids) and Mary Moore (second base for Springfield and Battle Creek) were also there. The women were honored on the field pregame. They also signed autographs and took photos with fans on the concourse during the night... Former Daisies bat girl Bobbie Snyder Hill said, "Play ball!" After the game, descendants of several formers Daisies were recognized before the fireworks... The TinCaps wore Daisies replica jerseys that were auctioned off, with proceeds supporting projects to honor the Daisies' legacy.

KIDS CLUB CLINIC: Also on June 3, 8 TinCaps players (Colton Bender, Marcos Castañon, Keegan Collett, Justin Farmer, Jared Kollar, Carlos Luis, Jakob Marsee, and Kervin Pichardo) conducted a clinic for 55 members of the team's Kids Club. They held stations for hitting, pitching, fielding, and baserunning. The TinCaps Kids Club is free for children 12 and under... The team hosted another Clinic on Aug. 19 with Collett, Pichardo, and Nerwilian Cedeño valunteering

LOU GEHRIG DAY: On June 2, 1925, Lou Gehrig became the starting first baseman for the Yankees. Exactly 16 years later, he passed away from complications of ALS disease, which then became known as "Lou Gehrig's disease."

Baseball raises awareness about this terrible disease and celebrates the fighting spirit that Gehrig continues to instill in ALS patients 82 years after his death. This cause hits close to home for the TinCaps. Kathy Winter, the wife of the team's longtime head groundskeeper, Keith Winter, was diagnosed with ALS in 2021. WANE 15, the local CBS affiliate, shared the Winters' story of faith, hope, and love in a feature in the spring... Lou Gehrig. The Lost Memoir was published by Fort Wayne native and resident Alan Gaff in 2020. The book includes Gerirg wrote for The Oakland Tribune in 1927... Gehrig played in Fort Wayne twice in 1927 (a year when he won the ALWP), leading the Yankees to a World Series title). On May 6 that year, the Yankees played an exhibition against the semi-pro Lincoln Lifers at League Park (present day Headwaters Park – approximately 1.5 miles northeast of Parkview Field). New York won, 5-3, in 10 innings as Babe Ruth broke a tie in the 10th with a two-run homer. Ruth and Gehrig returned in the fall as part of a barnstorming tour pitting the Bustin' Babes vs. the Larrupin' Lous.

YOUNG ARMS: The TinCaps have had the 2nd youngest pitching staff in the Midwest League. Fort Wayne's pitchers on average are 22 years old (the average age for a pitcher in the MWL is 23). Starting pitcher Victor Lizarraga, who's 19 and won't turn 20 until Nov. 30, was the youngest player in the league to start the year.

CHAMPION MINDSET: The core of this year's team won the Single-A California League title last year with the Lake Elsinore Storm after going 77-55 in the regular season... These current players appeared in the Cal League Playoffs last year: Griffin Doersching (2 HR)... Nerwilian Cedeño... Albert Fabian... Kai Murphy... Tyler Robertson... Sammy Zavala... Victor Lizarraga... and Will Geerdes.
