YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 8-4. **Tyler Fitzgerald** gave Richmond a 1-0 lead in the third with a sac fly. Jose Tena tied the game in the bottom of the third with an RBI single. Fitzgerald moved Richmond back in front in the sixth with an RBI double and **Sean Roby** followed with an RBI single to push the lead to 3-1. In the ninth, **Shane Matheny** hit a two-run double and **Brett Auerbach** added a three-run homer to open an 8-1 lead. Akron scored three runs in the ninth to close within four, but **Melvin Adon** finished the game for Richmond. Starter **Landen Roupp** picked up his first Double-A win after allowing one run with seven strikeouts over six innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. The two teams met for 12 games in the first half of the season, with the Flying Squirrels going 7-5 against the RubberDucks. The winning record served as a tiebreaker in the first-half standings, clinching a postseason spot for Richmond. At The Diamond from May 3-8, the Flying Squirrels won the first three games of the series before the RubberDucks won the last three for a split. At Canal Park from May 31-June 5, the Flying Squirrels won four-of-six. The series is the final set between these two teams this year.

TICKET PUNCHED: The Flying Squirrels clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division First-Half title with a win on May 26 paired with a loss by the Akron RubberDucks against the Harrisburg Senators. Richmond finished the first half tied with Akron, but held the tiebreaker with a 7-5 head-to-head record. The league adopted the split-season format in 2019. After playing a full-season system last year, they returned to the split-season format this year. The Flying Squirrels will play in the Eastern League playoffs for the third time in franchise history. In 2011, they swept the Senators in the division series before falling to the Fisher Cats in the ELCS, three games to one. In 2014, they eliminated the RubberDucks in four games before being swept in the championship series by the Binghamton Mets.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have gone 17-32 in the second half. They are 11-24 in the last 35 games, including a season-high six-game losing streak from July 14-23. The Flying Squirrels have won seven series, lost eight and split five this year. Richmond hitters lead the league with 1,283 strikeouts and rank third with 145 homers. The Flying Squirrels are 26-36 on the road this year. Richmond is 24-24 in games decided by two-or-less runs.

THE RUBBERDUCKS are in third place in the Southwest Division standings in the second half, four games behind first-place Bowie and Erie. They are 16-7 in their last 23 games since August 6, including winning five-of-seven in last week's series at Erie. The Akron offense has the fewest strikeouts in the Eastern League this season and their pitching staff has recorded the most strikeouts. Akron's roster includes nine of MLB.com's top-30 Cleveland prospects, including RHP Daniel Espino (No. 1 - on IL), RHP Gavin Williams (No. 3), RHP Tanner Bibee (No. 8), INF Angel Martinez (No. 12), INF/OF Jhonkensy Noel (No. 17), INF Jose Tena (No. 18), RHP Tanner Burns (No. 19), LHP Joey Cantillo (No. 25 - on IL) and C Bryan Lavastida (No. 26).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Kyle Harrison** makes his 15th Double-A start and his third against the RubberDucks. He started the series opener on Tuesday at Canal Park and allowed four runs over 4.2 innings and struck out seven in a no-decision. He also faced Akron on June 3 at Canal Park and allowed a Double-A-high six runs over 3.2 innings in a loss. He enters today's start leading all MiLB pitchers (min. 90 IP) in strikeout percentage (39.9%), K/9 IP (14.85) and he ranks tied for second in strikeouts (160). Since the start of the 2021 season and his professional debut, he has recorded 317 strikeouts, the second-most in the minors, trailing only 336 by Diamondbacks minor leaguer Brandon Pfaadt. Harrison was selected to represent the Giants in the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium on July 16. With his Flying Squirrels debut on May 27, he became the youngest pitcher in team history. He also picked up the second-most strikeouts in a debut in franchise history with nine. Harrison began the season with the High-A Eugene Emeralds, where he went 0-1 with a 1.55 ERA in seven starts. At the time of his promotion to Richmond, Harrison ranked third in the Northwest League in ERA (1.55), second in strikeouts (59), third in BAA (.179) and tied for fifth in WHIP (1.00). Harrison was selected in the third round (85th overall) of the 2020 MLB Draft by the Giants out of De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. He is currently rated by MLB.com as the Giants' No. 2 prospect, No. 22-overall prospect and the No. 1 LHP prospect. *Baseball America* ranks Harrison as the Giants' No. 2 prospect, the No. 21-overall prospect and the No. 1 LHP prospect. **For more on Harrison, see page two.**

FOR AKRON: Right-hander Thomas Ponticelli makes his fifth Double-A start of the 19th overall appearance in the Eastern League this year. He last pitched on Tuesday in the series opener and allowed two runs over five innings in a no-decision. After working most of the year as a reliever, Ponticelli has made four starts since August 6, going 0-1 with a 3.63 ERA (7 ER/17 IP). He was selected in the 12th round of the 2018 MLB Draft out of the University of San Francisco, where he was a teammate of former Richmond catcher **Robert Emery** for one season. He spent most of the 2021 season with Akron, going 7-5 with a 3.09 ERA in 12 starts and 15 relief outings.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season, the Richmond Flying Squirrels are leading all of Double-A in average attendance (6,224) and total attendance (336,084). Richmond is 14th of the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance. The 9,810 fans at The Diamond on Opening Night and again on July 4 are the largest crowds in all of Double-A this year. He is ranked by MLB.com as the Guardians' No. 3 prospect and their top pitching prospect.

POWER SURGE: The Richmond offense has hit 145 home runs this season, which is third in the Eastern League. On August 7 in the 101st game of the season, **Riley Mahan** hit a grand slam to give the Flying Squirrels their 128th homer of the season, breaking the previous franchise record. Last year, the Flying Squirrels broke the team record for homers with 127 in just 113 games, passing the previous record of 109 from 2013. This year, the Flying Squirrels are on pace to hit 168 home runs. **Sean Roby** is tied for fourth in the league with 23 homers on the season, with 19 coming at The Diamond.

BREAKING OUT: Outfielder **Vaun Brown** made his Double-A debut on Friday, going 0-for-2 before being replaced by **Jacob Heyward**. Brown was drafted by the Giants in 2021 out of D-II Florida Southern and is playing his first full professional season. On the year, Brown ranks first among all full-season hitters in MiLB in batting average (.346), fourth in OBP (.437), third in SLG (.623), first in OPS (1.060), tied for seventh in hits (134), sixth in total bases (241) and tied for second in runs scored (100). Brown was promoted to Double-A on Thursday. He started the year with Low-A San Jose, where he hit .346 with 14 homers in 59 games and stole 23 bases. In 43 games with High-A Eugene, he hit .350 with nine home runs and stole 21 bases.

CASEY AT THE BAT: Infielder **Casey Schmitt** was promoted to Double-A Richmond on August 9. After going 0-for-3 in his Double-A debut on August 10, Schmitt has hit .389 (21-for-54) with one homer, five doubles, a triple and six RBIs in his last 14 games since August 11. Last Friday night, he tied a career high with four hits against the Rumble Ponies. On Friday night in Akron, he collected three hits, including his first Double-A home run.

SMITH STREAKING: **Armani Smith** is currently riding a 21-game on-base streak since July 29, which is the second-longest active streak in the Eastern League. It is also the second-longest on-base streak for a Richmond player this year, trailing a 24-game streak by **Shane Matheny** in May and June. During the streak, Smith is batting .291 (23-for-79) with three doubles, a homer, seven RBIs and 13 walks. He posted a 12-game hitting streak from August 4-18, which was the longest active streak in the league at the time, but it was snapped with a 0-for-3 game with two walks last Friday night in Richmond. He hit .313 (21-for-67) in his first 18 Double-A games from May 15-June 16 before batting .168 (17-for-101) in his next 29 games through August 2.

FITZ ON FIRE: Over his last 34 games since July 10, **Tyler Fitzgerald** has homered 11 times. He now has 21 homers this season, which ranks as the second-most in a season in franchise history, one homer ahead of **David Villar**'s previous franchise record of 20 set last year and trailing 23 by **Sean Roby** this year. Over his last 24 games since July 28, Fitzgerald is batting .333 (31-for-93) with six homers, six doubles and 21 RBIs, which has raised his season batting average from .194 to .228. Last Saturday night in Richmond, Fitzgerald hit a solo homer in the first inning and added an inside-the-park homer in the seventh. Fitzgerald is the third player in franchise history to hit an inside-the-park homer, joining **Brandon Crawford** (2010) and **Tyler Graham** (2014). He was named Eastern League Player of the Week on Monday for his performance last week against the Rumble Ponies.

ROBUST: **Sean Roby** hit his 21st homer of the year on July 4 against the Fightin' Phils, moving him ahead of **David Villar** for the most home runs in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history. He added his 22nd homer on July 7 and his 23rd on July 9. Roby is tied for fourth in the EL in homers. He has hit 19 homers at The Diamond this season, which is a new record for the most at home for a Flying Squirrels player in franchise history, ahead of 10 by **Adam Duvall** in 2013. It is also a new franchise record for the most career homers at The Diamond. He has also set the franchise record for the most multi-homer games in a season and a career with four.

SAY HEY: **Jacob Heyward** is currently on a 17-game on-base streak since August 3. In that span, he is batting .250 (13-for-52) with 12 walks. He has extended his career franchise record to 153 walks. Heyward has homered four times in his last 14 games, giving him 30 for his Richmond career, which is tied for the second-most homers in franchise history with **Jarrett Parker** (2013-14), trailing only 37 by **Ricky Oropesa** (2013-16).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: **Sean Roby** is tied for fourth in homers (23). **Mike Gigliotti** is eighth in on-base percentage (.366), tied for 10th in walks (51) and tied for sixth in stolen bases (24). **Tyler Fitzgerald** is ninth in homers (21) and is tied for fifth in runs scored (64).

PROSPECT WATCH: The Flying Squirrels have six players ranked in *Baseball America's* Top-30 Giants prospects, including **Kyle Harrison** (2), **Casey Schmitt** (2), **Vaun Brown** (10), **Ryan Murphy** (15 - on IL), **Will Wilson** (22) and **Ricardo Genoves** (30). **Franklin Labour** is rated by *Baseball America* as having the "Best Outfield Arm." Harrison is rated by *Baseball America* as having the "Best Slider" in the organization. Schmitt is listed as the "Best Defensive Infielder" and "Best Infield Arm." MLB.com's Top-30 Giants prospect list includes Harrison (2), Schmitt (6), Murphy (15), **Tristan Peters** (21), Will Wilson (26) and **Landen Roupp** (28). Harrison is *Baseball America's* No. 20 overall prospect and MLB.com's No. 22 overall prospect.
