Amigos Take it in the Seventh

Top-ranked pitching prospects duelled at The Wolff as the Flying Chancas de San Antonio (8-22) lefty starter Jagger Haynes took on Midland Amigos (20-10) southpaw Wei-En Lin (20-10). Haynes, who completed 6 innings again, and Lin, who struck out 10, led to a tied standoff decided by bullpen performances. Two wall-hitting 2 RBI doubles to center field in the seventh by Brayan Buevas and Josh Kuroda-Grauer tallied 4 runs for Midland as the Flying Chancas were controlled in a 6-2 loss.

6 Innings Like Jagger

Jagger Haynes completed six innings again last night, as he has done so in 2 straight outings. Haynes remains the only Mission to complete 6 innings this year.

Twice as Nice

Carson Tucker doubled again last night, making it his team-best 8th double. He also walked, stole a bag and scored a run. Tucker now leads the Missions with his .339 batting average in his first season in affiliated baseball since 2023. The Cleveland Guardians drafted Tucker in the 1st round of the 2020 MLB Draft.

Another Day, Another Hit

Leandro Cedeño recorded a hit last night, so Cedeño has reached base in all 19 games he's played since joining the Missions in Midland. The 27-year-old last played in affiliated baseball in 2022, when he hit .308 with 20 doubles, 32 HRs and 103 RBIs in 2022 with 44 walks and 126 strikeouts with the Amarillo Sod Poodles and the Triple-A Reno Aces in the Arizona Diamondbacks organization. He played in Japan the last 3 years for the Orix Buffaloes and Saitama Seibu Lions.

Yearning for Scoring

San Antonio's 109 runs are the fewest in Double-A baseball, and their 21 home runs are the second fewest.

Out for a Walk

The Missions have walked 160 batters, the 3rd most in Double-A baseball.

Catch Em' If You Can

The RockHounds stole 16 bags while being caught just twice back in April against San Antonio, and this week they have stolen 10 more bags while being caught just twice.

Chipped by the 'Hounds

Johan Moreno has only given up earned runs in two games this year, and both have been against Midland. Yesterday he gave up a run and he gave up 2 on April 18.

That's More Like It

Andrew Thurman snapped a streak of 5 straight appearances giving up a run with his 2 scoreless frames last night. Yesterday was Thurman's 3rd scoreless outing.

Picking Their Spots

While San Antonio's 32 stolen bases are 4th fewest in Double-A baseball, they've only been caught 6 times, the fewest in the entire level. The Missions have three runners who have at least 5 stolen bases while not being caught this year in Kai Roberts (8), Ethan Salas (6) and Carson Tucker (5).

Opportunities Are There

While San Antonio's 109 runs are the fewest in Double-A baseball, they've left 229 runners on base, the 4th most. Just this week, the Missions have left 24 men on base. On the year, their .174 batting average with runners in scoring position ranks last in Double-A.

Looking for Better Luck

24-year-old Ian Koenig starts for the Missions today. Koenig dealt with bad luck last week, allowing 5 unearned runs in Tulsa in 3.2 innings with 4 hits, 0 walks and 2 strikeouts while hitting 2 batters. 2 errors really cost him, especially one ahead of Josue De Paula's 3-run homer. He is 0-3 with a 4.50 ERA with 5 walks and 16 strikeouts in 22.0 innings. 7 of his 22 hits allowed are home runs after allowing 17 last year. On April 17, Koenig allowed 6 runs on 7 hits in 5.2 innings with 2 walks and 2 strikeouts in Midland. Jared Dickey and Ryan Lasko both homered against him. The San Jose, California native went 5-8 with a 5.40 ERA, 34 walks and 71 strikeouts across 103.1 innings last season in 21 starts at High-A Fort Wayne. The righty went at least six innings in six of his last 7 starts in 2025. Koenig spent 2024 in Single-A Lake Elsinore and spent the previous two seasons at Lake Erie and the ACL. Koenig was signed by the San Diego Padres as an undrafted free agent in 2022 out of Cabrillo Junior College.

Their Top Pitcher

Lefty Jamie Arnold goes for Midland. The 22-year-old just allowed 9 runs (5 earned) on 9 hits with 1 walk and 1 strikeout on Sunday against Amarillo in 3.2 innings. He is 0-1 with a 4.32 ERA in 6 starts with 11 walks and 33 strikeouts in 25 innings. On April 17 in Midland, Arnold went 3.1 scoreless innings with 4 hits, 1 walk and 7 strikeouts against the Missions. The Athletics drafted Arnold just a few months ago at No. 11 overall in the 2025 MLB Draft out of Florida State. He signed for \$5.99 million. He is their No. 2 prospect and the No. 34 prospect in all of baseball according to MLB Pipeline.

Been Pretty Mid

The Missions were outscored by the RockHounds 41-13 from April 14-19 in Midland as they lost 5 of 6. This built on struggles from last year, as the Missions went 9-15 against the RockHounds. Midland outscored the Missions 130-91 in 24 games played.

San Antonio Missions Coaches

Manager - Chris Tremie

Chris Tremie begins his first season in the San Diego Padres organization and as manager of the San Antonio Missions. He spent 13 seasons as a manager in the Cleveland Guardians organization and the last seven seasons as the minor league field coordinator for the Cincinnati Reds.

“Fans should expect to come out and see a team that’s going to compete on a daily basis,” Tremie said. “It will be a good brand of baseball. We’re going to play the game the right way.”

Tremie debuted as a catcher for the Chicago White Sox in 1995. He later played for the Texas Rangers, Pittsburgh Pirates and Houston Astros across a total of 22 Major League Baseball games. Tremie retired in 2005 as a member of the Round Rock Express, the Astros’ Triple-A affiliate at the time, and began his managing career in 2006 with the Cleveland organization. His time with Cleveland included two years of managing Double-A Akron and six years leading Triple-A Columbus.

The Houston native attended the University of Houston, where he helped lead the Cougars to two 40-win seasons before being drafted by the White Sox in the 39th round of the 1992 MLB Draft. As a minor leaguer in the White Sox organization, Tremie played with NBA legend Michael Jordan on the Double-A Birmingham Barons as Jordan attempted to play professional baseball.

Hitting Coach Eric Del Prado

Eric Del Prado returns for his second season as hitting coach in San Antonio. He previously worked as a hitting coach at the Arizona Complex League (ACL) in 2023 before taking on the hitting coach role with Single-A Lake Elsinore during the 2024 season.

A native of El Segundo, California, Del Prado attended Willamette University and coached for four years at Lewis & Clark College in Oregon.

Pitching Coach Erick Abreu

Erick Abreu, a native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, pitched for nine years in the minor leagues with the New York Yankees and Houston Astros, even making a stop with the Texas League’s Corpus Christi Hooks. Abreu then became a pitching coach in the Astros’ system for nine seasons, spending time in six different levels.

Over the last two seasons, Abreu served as the major league bullpen coach for the Atlanta Braves.

Bench Coach Brian Burres

Brian Burres brings recent leadership acumen from within the Padres organization, working as the manager for Single-A Lake Elsinore in 2025, as a pitching coach at the Arizona Complex League in 2024 and as an assistant coach with High-A Fort Wayne in 2023.

Burres also boasts the most extensive major league playing career on the staff, pitching in over 100 games for the Baltimore Orioles, Toronto Blue Jays and Pittsburgh Pirates across six big-league seasons.

Strength Coach Chandler Craig

Chandler Craig continues for a second season with the Missions after two seasons as strength and conditioning coach with High-A Fort Wayne. This will be his fourth season in the Padres organization.

Craig previously spent two seasons with the Red Sox organization, including time with Single-A Salem. Craig is a native of Lubbock, Texas and graduated from Texas Tech University.

Athletic Trainer Juan Peña

Juan Peña embarks on his second season with the Missions and second with the Padres organization. In 2024, Peña won one of only 14 Minor League Baseball Athletic Trainer of the Year awards for his work with Single-A Lake Elsinore.

Peña worked in the Detroit Tigers organization from 2018-2023, with most of his time spent at the Florida Complex League. He is from Lakeland, Florida, and graduated from East Central University.
