May 30: RubberDucks 8, Patriots 7: Joe Lampe drove in three on two hits while Dayan Frias added two hits and two RBI as the RubberDucks hold off a late Somerset surge to win.

Today's starting pitchers: Trenton Denholm makes his ninth Double-A appearance and third start with the RubberDucks on Saturday. The right-hander is coming off five scoreless innings with seven strikeouts in game one of Sunday's doubleheader against Altoona at Canal Park. Denholm faced the Patriots twice during their visit to Akron earlier this season (both times in long relief). He combined to toss six innings allowing one run on three hits while striking out eight in those two outings.

I'm on fire: Cooper Ingle is red hot at the plate. Since his average dropped to a season low .179 on April 17, the RubberDucks catcher has picked up a hit in 25 of his 33 games played. Since the calendar turned to May, Ingle has gotten even hotter at the plate batting .338/.465/.613 with 13 doubles (most in the Eastern League), three home runs (tied most on the RubberDucks), 17 RBI (second most in EL and Ducks) and 20 walks (tied most on the Ducks). Ingle has now raised his average to .282 on the season, which is the highest by an active Akron batter. His 44 hits this year are the most by an Akron batter.

Better Days: Kahlil Watson is having a better second year in Akron. The now outfielder is batting .268 (second best on active team) with eight doubles, three triples (tied second most on team), three homers and 23 RBI. He has five multi-hit games in 30 games played this season including a career-high with four hits on May 27 in Somerset.

Good eye: The RubberDucks have walked 225 times through the first 49 games of the season, which is most in the Eastern League and second most in Double-A. Dayan Frias (31) and Cooper Ingle (31) are first on the RubberDucks and second in the Eastern League in free passes. The RubberDucks worked eight walks in their win on Saturday. 11 Akron batters have worked double digit walks so far this season, and four (Frias, Ingle, Jake Fox and Alex Mooney) have drawn 20+ walks.

Born to Run: The Akron RubberDucks are stealing bases at an impressive rate. Akron ranks seventh in Double-A and second in the Eastern League with 69 stolen bases. Of the 14 Double-A teams with 60+ steals, the RubberDucks have been caught stealing the fourth fewest (18 times). Alex Mooney is tied fifth in the EL with 15 steals. Mooney, Dayan Frias and Tyresse Turner have each stolen 11 or more bases this year. Six RubberDucks have stolen five or more bases this season.

RubberDucks travel to the Patriots: Akron and Somerset will face off for the second of two meetings between the two clubs and only meeting at TD Bank Ballpark in 2025. Akron took four of six from Somerset at Canal Park in the first meeting. Akron leads the all-time series between the two franchises 20-14. Top prospects in this series include:

All or Nothin' at All: The RubberDucks have tossed a MiLB best eight shutouts this season (tied with Erie and Quad Cities). Four of those eight have come against Somerset. In Akron's seven wins against the Somerset this season, the RubberDucks have allowed nine runs. In the Patriots three wins, they have scored a combined 24 runs.

Johnny Bye-Bye: Zach Jacobs, Jake Miller and Davis Sharpe have been excellent as closing the door on Akron's opponents this month. The three have combined to go a perfect six-for-six in save situations in May while allowing just eight earned runs over 38.2 innings pitched. Each of the three have pitched multiple innings out of the pen at least four times since the calendar changed to May. Sharpe and Zane Morehouse are tied for the team lead in saves this month with three each.

Can't start a fire without a spark: The RubberDucks are outscoring opponents 64-23 in the first two innings and 37-10 in the first inning this season. Akron is 27-7 when scoring first (most wins in the Eastern League when scoring first). The RubberDucks batters have 73 hits the first time through the order this year. New Akron leadoff man Cooper Ingle is batting .308 when leading off an inning this season.

Glory Days: The Akron RubberDucks are the first team in the Guardians organization to reach 30+ wins. Akron has reached this mark in large part thanks to the dominant pitching staff that has the best ERA in the organization (3.17), which is also the third best in the Eastern League and fourth in Double-A. Akron's starting pitchers are a big reason for this success. Akron starters are leading Double-A with a 2.44 ERA over 225.1 innings. Three of Akron's current five-man rotation have the lowest ERA in the Eastern League entering Friday: Austin Peterson (1.47) first, Rodney Boone (2.14) second and Tommy Mace (2.36) fifth.

2025 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#26 Manager Greg DiCenzo enters his fifth season with the Guardians organization. The 2024 season will be DiCenzo's second as RubberDucks manager, and fourth as a manager in the Guardians organization. He guided the RubberDucks to an 80-58 record and an Eastern League playoff appearance in 2024.

Prior to becoming Triple-A Columbus' bench coach in 2023, DiCenzo spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as the manager in High-A Lake County. He guided the Captains to a 141-108 record in his two seasons including a Midwest League finals appearance in 2022.

A native of Duxbury, MA, DiCenzo was the head baseball coach at Holy Cross for 12 seasons prior to joining the Cleveland organization. The Crusaders went 137-109 in Patriot League play during his tenure, including a 2017 Patriot League Championship, and posted 20-win seasons in 10 of those 12 years.

#55 Hitting Coach Jordan Becker enters his sixth season with the Guardians organization and second with the RubberDucks. In 2023, Becker served as the hitting coach for Lake County.

Becker joined the Cleveland organization in 2019 after a collegiate coaching career that saw stops at Riverside Community College and New Mexico State University.

#29 Hitting Coach Ian Forster enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Forster will also be a hitting coach for RubberDucks and returns to Akron after serving as the RubberDucks assistant hitting coach in 2023. He was the Arizona Complex Guardians hitting coach in 2024.

A graduate of North Olmsted High School, Forster played four years at Baldwin Wallace University in Berea.

#12 Pitching Coach Kevin Erminio enters his sixth season in the Guardians organization and first season with the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Erminio was the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains for the 2023 and 2024 seasons.

Erminio joined the Guardians organization after a collegiate coaching career that included stops as a pitching coach in Oxford at Miami University and 13 seasons at Kennesaw State.

#54 Pitching Coach Michael Poole enters his third season in the Guardians organization and second season with the RubberDucks. He will be a pitching coach in 2025 after spending 2024 as Akron's assistant pitching coach. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Poole was the pitching development coach on the Arizona Complex Academy staff.

A native of Akron, Poole played at Cuyahoga Community College and Lake Erie College before starting his coaching career at Inspiration Academy (FL) in 2019. Poole was an assistant coach at LSU-Eunice for the Bengals D2 JUCO World Series Championship season in 2021.

#49 Bench Coach Marc Mumper enters his third season in the Guardians organization and first season in Akron. He will also serve as the Guardians organization's assistant infield coordinator. Prior to coming to Akron, Mumper spent 2024 as the bench coach for Lake County.

A native of Highlands Ranch, CO, Mumper played 157 games from 2016-19 for Grand Canyon University. He then went on to coach at the college level in several different roles from 2019-22 before joining the Guardians organization.

#41 Development Coach Seth Caddell enters his second season as a coach in the Guardians organization and second season with the RubberDucks. Before joining the RubberDucks coaching staff in 2024, Caddell played in the Guardians organization for three seasons as a catcher.

Athletic Trainer Derrik Diaz enters his eighth season in the Guardians organization and second season with the RubberDucks. He also serves as the Guardians organization's assistant coordinator for Dominican Republic Medical Services. Diaz was the Eastern League Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2024. Prior to coming to Akron, Diaz served as the head athletic trainer for the Dominican Republic Complex in 2023.

Assistant Athletic Trainer Karina Gonzalez enters her third season in the Guardians organization and second season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Gonzalez spent the 2023 season at the Guardians complex in Goodyear.

Strength and Conditioning Coach Mo Cuevas enters his 10th season with the Guardians organization and third season in Akron. He was the Eastern League Strength Coach of the Year in 2024. Prior to joining the RubberDucks, Cuevas served as the Guardians rehab strength and conditioning coach in 2022.

Baseball Technology Fellow Kade Enders enters his first season in Akron. A native of Medina, Enders previously worked as an intern for USA baseball, video associate for the Los Angeles Dodgers and baseball performance science video intern for the Tampa Bay Rays before joining the Guardians organization.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** and general manager **Jim Pfander** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the 'Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
