### RHP TANNER GORDON (NR) vs. LHP KYLE HARRISON (NR)

**TODAY'S GAME:** Albuquerque dropped the Season Opener last night to Sacramento, 8-0 ... With the loss, the Isotopes fall to 12-10 all-time on Opening Day. Albuquerque has lost five of their last six Season Openers and nine of their last 11 ... Tanner Gordon is set to make his season debut on the hill while Kyle Harrison is slated to start for the River Cats.

**REHAB:** In his first rehab start last night, Rockies left-hander Austin Gomber tossed 4.0 frames and allowed two runs on three hits, two walks and one homer with five strikeouts. He threw 66 pitches, 39 strikes, and induced nine swings and misses.

**VEEN:** Outfielder Zac Veen collected two hits last night, including a double. It's Veen's fifth multi-hit game with the Isotopes over 22 contests dating back to 2024. His double in the first left the bat at 104.8 MPH, the second-hardest hit ball of the contest.

**AMADOR:** Infielder Adael Amador made his Triple-A debut last night and went 2-for-4 with a punchout. His single in his first Triple-A at bat to leadoff the game registered a 100.2 MPH exit velocity while his single in the fifth left the bat at 101.8 MPH.

**STERLIN:** Outfielder Sterlin Thompson also made his Triple-A debut yesterday and went 2-for-4 with a double. Both of Thompson's hits tallied an exit velocity of 104.1 MPH, tied for the fourth-hardest hits of the night.

**SHUTOUT:** Last night was the first time in franchise history the club was shutout on Opening Day ... The Isotopes were shutout for the first time since being blanked at Sugar Land August 24, 2024.

**SHUTOUT @ SAC:** The River Cats registered their 13th overall shutout against Albuquerque last night, 12th in Sacramento and first since June 9, 2024.

**MARGIN OF DEFEAT:** The eight-run loss yesterday was the second-largest margin of defeat on Opening Day in club history (largest: 11-1 loss at Tacoma, April 4, 2014).

**HITS:** Albuquerque tallied only six hits last night, tied for the second-fewest in a nine-inning game on Opening Night in team history (fewest: 2022, three).

**UNFRIENDLY CONFINES:** The Isotopes are 1-9 over their last 10 games in Sacramento.

**HITTING COACH:** Jordan Pacheco, entering his fourth season with the club, is the longest tenured Isotopes hitting coach, surpassing Steve Phillips (2007-09).

**RADIO WAVES:** Due to the NCAA Tournament, this weekend's Isotopes games will air on KTBL 94.5 FM/1050 AM.

**TRIPLE-A DEBUT:** Eight players on the Opening Day roster will be making their Triple-A debuts this year: Zach Agnos, Juan Mejia, Warming Bernabel, Adael Amador, Chase Dollander, Ryan Ritter, Sterlin Thompson and Ronaiker Palma.

**PROSPECTS:** Nine players on MLB.com's top 30 Rockies prospects list begin the year with Albuquerque: Chase Dollander, Yanquiel Fernandez, Adael Amador, Zac Veen, Carson Palmquist, Ryan Ritter, Sterlin Thompson, Jaden Hill, Zach Agnos.

**MLB EXPERIENCE:** The Opening Day roster features 13 players who have seen time in the Major Leagues. Diego Castillo has registered the most MLB service time (4 year, 169 days).

**WHAT'S MY AGE AGAIN?:** Catcher Austin Nola, 35, is the elder statesmen at the outset as he begins his 14th pro season.

**2024 ATTENDANCE:** Albuquerque led the Pacific Coast League in total attendance in 2024 (503,525) for the second time in club history (2023) while also pacing the circuit in average attendance (7,714) for the third time (2022 and 2023).

**PITCHING COACH:** Chris Michalak, entering his third season in the role, is the second-longest tenured Isotopes pitching in club history (longest: Glenn Dishman, 2010-14).

**2025 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE:** The Isotopes will face seven teams over the 75 games in the first half, which ends June 22 ... Sacramento is the lone club Albuquerque will play just once in the first half ... The Isotopes also won't play Round Rock or Las Vegas in the first half.

**CALI BOUND:** This marks the earliest in a calendar year the Isotopes will travel to California. Prior to this series, the only time the team played in the Golden State prior to the month of May was a four-game series in Fresno from April 24-27, 2014.

**VS. SACRAMENTO:** The Isotopes went 5-10 against the River Cats in 2024, including winning a six-game set, 4-2, in Albuquerque last August ... In the lone series in Sacramento, however, the Isotopes were swept in a three-game series in July.

**SUTTER HEALTH PARK:** In 22 trips to Sacramento dating back to 2003, Albuquerque has only won two series (one each in 2018 and 2019).

## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

**MICHAEL RYAN:** Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

**BALLS AND STRIKES:** The Challenge System, in its third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
