FOR STARTERS: The Rocket City Trash Pandas open a six-game series against the Birmingham Barons on Tuesday night at Regions Field. Rocket City enters the series with a 0.5-game lead over Knoxville for first place in the Southern League North Division second-half standings. The Trash Pandas also hold a 1.0-game advantage over Birmingham for the North's second playoff spot should they not win the division.

PANDAS TAKE FIVE OF SIX FROM BILOXI: Eybersson Polanco retired all 15 batters he faced over 5.0 perfect innings as Rocket City defeated Biloxi 8-1 on Sunday to take five of six from the Shuckers, marking its first 5-1 series of the season. The Pandas broke open a 2-1 game with four two-out runs in the sixth before Randy De Jesus added a two-run homer in the seventh, his first with Rocket City. Rocket City held Biloxi to a .174 batting average as a team, while recording 21 extra-base hits, and a .284 batting average, and .382 OBP.

POLANCO EARNS SL PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Eybersson Polanco was named Southern League Pitcher of the Week on Monday after his 5.0 perfect innings in Sunday's win. Polanco needed just 55 pitches while striking out two to earn his fifth victory. He joins Nate Sned as Rocket City pitchers to earn the weekly honor this season, while Nick Rodriguez has been named Southern League Player of the Week.

BULLPEN ON A ROLL: Rocket City's bullpen has been dominant over the last five games, allowing just two runs on 10 hits over 22.1 innings, while striking out 29 and walking seven. Over the last eight games since August 15, RCT relievers own a 1.14 ERA, a 34.5% K-rate, each the best in Minor League Baseball, allowing just four runs over 31.2 innings with 41 strikeouts and 11 walks.

STREAKING WITH JAKE: INF Jake Munroe has reached base in 36 consecutive games dating back to July 4, the longest streak by a Southern League player this season. Munroe is batting .333 with five home runs, 10 doubles, 22 RBIs, 18 walks and a .434 OBP during the streak. He has reached safely in 45 of 46 games since joining Rocket City on June 23, batting .320 with five homers, 12 doubles, 29 RBIs, 16 multi-hit games and a .416 OBP.

ELITE COMPANY: Munroe set a new franchise record on August 16 by reaching safely in his 30th-straight game surpassing Ryan Aguilar, Logan O'Hoppe and Kyren Paris, who each had 29-game on-base streaks.

GORDON DEALING: RHP Austin Gordon is 6-0 with a 2.20 ERA over his last seven starts since July 6, striking out 50 with just 11 walks. He earned his seventh win Tuesday with 6.0 innings of one-run ball and seven strikeouts for his eighth quality start and fourth in his last five outings. Gordon ranks third in the Southern League with a 4.39 ERA and 114 strikeouts, tied for first with 23 starts and second with 108.2 innings.

SOLID RELIEF: Since May 3, the Trash Pandas bullpen owns a 3.66 ERA, 2nd-best in Double-A and 5th among full-season MiLB, while its 29.7 percent strikeout rate, and 31 saves leads the minors. The relief corps has turned things around after posting a 5.38 ERA with six blown saves over the season's first 26 games. Rocket City relievers also own four of the five longest streaks without allowing an earned run in the league this season: Luke Murphy (25 appearances), Lucas Mahlstedt (14), Carlos Espinosa (12) and Camden Minacci (12).

PANDA PITCHING: The Trash Pandas rank 2nd in the Southern League, and 5th in Double-A with a 4.39 ERA. Over the previous 93 games since May 3, the Trash Pandas own a 4.02 ERA, ranking 3rd in Double-A and 5th-best among all full-season Minor League clubs. Through the first 26 games of the season, the pitching staff had a league-worst 5.76 ERA.

YOVAN SLAMS THE DOOR: RHP Kenyon Yovan has converted 12 straight save opportunities since May 2, posting 14 strikeouts and a .100 opponent average over 13.1 innings. His 13 saves rank second in the Southern League behind former Trash Pandas closer Luke Murphy (18 before his Angels promotion). Yovan is 5-2 with a 3.15 ERA and 13 saves in 41 appearances overall, striking out 55 in 45.2 innings with a .199 opponent average and 1.09 WHIP.

BADA BING, BADA ZERO: LHP Nicolo Pinazzi has gone 27 straight appearances without allowing an earned run since May 21, spanning 37.2 innings across three levels. He has struck out 68 while holding opponents to a .169 average and 1.06 WHIP during the streak, two games longer than the next-best run in the minors this season (Luke Murphy, 25). Since joining Rocket City on August 5, Pinazzi has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings over six outings, allowing three hits with 12 strikeouts, including 2.0 scoreless frames to earn his first Trash Pandas win Friday.

PLAYOFF PUSH: The Trash Pandas seek their second playoff appearance in franchise history. In 2022, Rocket City won both halves of the North Division and finished a franchise-best 81-57, before falling to the Smokies in three games in the North Division Series. The Trash Pandas can qualify by winning the second half or, if first-half champion Knoxville repeats, finishing with the North's next-best second-half record.

BIG SERIES WITH THE BARONS: The Trash Pandas and Barons wrap up their season series this week at Regions Field, with heavy playoff implications. Rocket City is 12-9 against the White Sox affiliate this season, going 7-5 at home this season, 5-4 on the road, and 83-75 all-time.

PROSPECT POWER: The roster moves were highlighted by the arrivals of Angels No. 1 prospect SS Arjun Nimmala R and No. 2 prospect HP Tyler Bremner. Ranked No. 38 and No. 46 overall by MLB Pipeline, respectively, they give the Trash Pandas two Top 50 prospects on the active roster for the first time in franchise history.

FLINT'S FRANCHISE: Tucker Flint (62 RBIs) is one RBI away from matching his single season club record with 63, which he did in 2023. He is the clubs all-time leader in games (373), home runs (42), RBIs (190), runs scored (202), doubles (64), and walks (216).

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THANK YOU, DAVID: OF David Calabrese was given his unconditional release by the Angels after spending parts of four seasons with the organization. A third-round pick in 2020, he ranks second in Trash Pandas history with 311 games played and third in franchise history in hits (211), home runs (29), and runs scored (133).

17 ROSTER MOVES IMPACT PANDAS: The Angels made sweeping changes to Rocket City's roster following the August 3 trade deadline, promoting RHP Ryan Costeiu, LHP Leonard Garcia, RHP Joel Hurtado, and OF Raudi Rodriguez to Triple-A Salt Lake while selecting the contract of LHP Blake Weiman. The Trash Pandas welcomed RHP Tyler Bremner, LHPs Dylan Phillips and Nicolo Pinazzi, along with OF Randy De Jesus from High-A Tri-City, along with trade acquisitions INF Arjun Nimmala (Toronto), C Jacob Cozart (Cleveland), OF Eddie Micheletti Jr., and RHP Kyle Robinson. Additionally, OFs David Calabrese, Elijah Dunham, and C Yereimi Villahermosa were released, while C J.J. D'Orazio was placed on the Development List.

LEVEQUE TO THE LEAGUE: Trash Pandas Pitching Coach Tim Leveque was named the Angels' Interim Pitching Coach on August 11 as part of changes to the Major League coaching staff. Former Rocket City Pitching Coach Michael Wuerz, who spent five seasons with the Trash Pandas, was named Interim Bullpen Coach. Assistant Pitching Coach Doug Henry has taken over Rocket City's pitching staff in his second season with the club and sixth in the Angels organization.

THE TAMPA TERROR: INF Nick Rodriguez was named Southern League Player of the Week for July 7-12, becoming the first Trash Pandas position player to earn the honor since Sam Brown in July 2025. He leads the Southern League with 25 doubles, the third-most in a single season in franchise history behind only Preston Palmeiro (31 in 2022) and David MacKinnon (30 in 2021).

SCULL TURNAROUND: After starting his time in Rocket City 1-for-17, Anthony Scull hit in seven-straight games from June 17 to July 24, batting .333 with a home run, and three RBIs.

TRASH PANDAS ON ABTV: Saturday's game will mark the fourth of six Trash Pandas broadcasts to air this season on Angels Broadcast Television (ABTV), the Los Angeles Angels' regional television network. Following Saturday, the remaining ABTV schedule features games on September 3 and 6 against Montgomery, with the Trash Pandas broadcast team of Josh Caray and Chris Harris.

PROMOTED: The Angels promoted four key contributors from Rocket City to Triple-A Salt Lake on August 3, including RHPs Joel Hurtado and Ryan Costeiu, LHP Leonard Garcia, and OF Raudi Rodriguez. The quartet combined to earn Southern League All-Star honors while helping the Trash Pandas to first place, with Hurtado ranking second in the league in ERA, Costeiu recording 96 strikeouts, Garcia leading the Southern League with 11 holds, and Rodriguez producing 12 home runs, 72 runs scored, and 27 stolen bases as one of Double-A's most complete offensive players.

LET'S GET RAUDI: OF Raudi Rodriguez earned his first promotion to Triple-A after batting .261 with 12 home runs, 42 RBIs, 72 runs scored, 27 stolen bases, and a .791 OPS in 95 games with Rocket City. The Angels' No. 17 prospect ranked among the Southern League

leaders in runs, walks, on-base percentage, and stolen bases, becoming the only Double-A player this season to record at least 85 hits, 10 home runs, 70 runs scored, 40 RBIs, 55 walks, and 25 stolen bases.

RECORD SETTING NIGHT: Rocket City set new Toyota Field single-game records with 16 runs and 16 hits in Thursday's win over Pensacola. The eight-run sixth inning was the first eight-run frame by the Trash Pandas at Toyota Field and their biggest inning since scoring eight runs at Chattanooga on June 28, 2024.

PIPELINE TO THE ANGELS: Rocket City has become a direct pipeline to Anaheim this season, with the Angels selecting or recalling four players straight from the Trash Pandas roster to the Major Leagues. OF Wade Meckler had his contract selected on May 22, RHP Ryan Johnson was recalled on June 18, RHP Luke Murphy had his contract selected on August 1, and LHP Blake Weiman was selected on August 4. The four promotions underscore Rocket City's role as the Angels' primary proving ground, with players earning Major League opportunities directly from Double-A.

KRUZEL REACHES 500 CAREER WINS: The June 6, 2-1 victory over Columbus at Toyota Field marked the 500th career managerial win for Joe Kruzel. In his first season with Rocket City, Kruzel reached the milestone in his ninth year as a manager across stops in the Reds, Cardinals, and Angels organizations.

RETURN OF THE MECK: Anaheim native Wade Meckler was promoted from Rocket City to Los Angeles on May 22, and homered off Jacob deGrom in his first MLB at-bat since 2023. Meckler added his first career grand slam on May 30. He's finished 13th in All-Star voting among AL outfielders with 306,875 votes.

MEANINGFUL MAY: After completing the May 31 suspended game on Tuesday, the Trash Pandas set a new club record for wins in May, going 16-11 (15-11 in '22), and posted a 3.50 ERA as a team, which was the tops in Double-A, and 4th in all of Minor League Baseball.

HIGH SCHOOL TEAMMATES REUNITE: RHP Camden Minacci, and INF Nick Rodriguez reunite in Rocket City after being teammates at Tampa Jesuit High School. Minacci was the Florida 6A Player of the Year in 2020, and Rodriguez, a year younger, graduating in 2021. Both played under head coach Miguel Menendez.

GLOBAL BASEBALL SERIES: The Trash Pandas picked up a 6-3 win over Japan's Toyota Red Cruisers on April 1 at Toyota Field. Tucker Flint led the way offensively, homering twice and reaching base four times. The victory capped the three-game Global Baseball Series in front of a crowd of 4,355. The Red Cruisers are the official industrial team for TOYOTA Japan.

SEASON TURNAROUND: The Trash Pandas went 45-92 in 2025, a 32.8% winning percentage, which was the worst in Southern League history. The club finished fourth in the Southern League's North Division, 35.5 games out of first place, and was 24-45 at Toyota Field and 21-47 on the road. The Trash Pandas have already won 37 games in 2026.

LAUNCHED TO THE LEAGUE: LHP Blake Weiman became the latest former Trash Panda to make his Major League debut, tossing a scoreless inning for the Angels on August 7 at Miami. Weiman allowed two hits without a walk, throwing 11 of his 15 pitches for strikes in the Angels' 4-3 victory. He joined RHP Luke Murphy (July 31), Brett Kerry (June 17), Samy Natera Jr. (June 6), Coleman Crow (April 17, Brewers), George Klassen (April 5), and Walbert Ureña (March 26) as former Trash Pandas to debut in the Majors this season. Murphy led all of Minor League Baseball with 18 saves and posted a 0.71 ERA in 34 appearances before his promotion, while Kerry remains Rocket City's all-time leader in wins (13), innings pitched (292.1), strikeouts (310), and starts (49). Natera became the franchise's 50th Major Leaguer after tossing 2.0 hitless innings with three strikeouts in his debut. Crow was part of Rocket City's combined no-hitter in 2023, and Klassen and Ureña both debuted with the Angels earlier this season.
