

OUR MISSION

The Mission of the Frisco RoughRiders Foundation is to enhance the community we serve through charitable contributions, grants, and programming initiatives. The RoughRiders Foundation supports programs and organizations in our community that motivate and reward children and families in the areas of education, good health, and community service activities.

GRANTS & IN-KIND DONATIONS

In 2019, the RoughRiders Foundation raised over \$700,000 in monetary, and in-kind donations and contributed over 1,000 volunteer hours.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The RoughRiders Foundation awarded 10 outstanding North Texas high school graduating high school seniors a \$1,000 scholarship to go towards their higher education. Each recipient was selected by the RoughRiders Foundation Board of Directors based on academic merit, financial need, and athletic accomplishments.

What happens in Frisco, stays in Frisco! This night was dedicated to saying thank you to all of our corporate partners and season ticket holders for their support throughout the 2019 season. Funds raised at Casino Night allow the RoughRiders Foundation to partner with community groups in Collin County. This year we raised thousands for our foundation through ticket sales, a silent auction, and extra casino chips purchased.

IN-GAME FUNDRAISERS

FOUNDATION OF THE NIGHT

Foundation of the Night is a fundraising opportunity for non-profit organizations to team up to sell tickets and earn back a portion of the ticket sales to benefit their organization. The RoughRiders hosted 32 different non-profits as the Foundation of the Night throughout the 2019 season raising over \$42,000.

50/50 RAFFLE

One lucky fan will win 50% of the total amount collected during each game. The remaining 50% will be used to benefit RoughRiders Foundation. The funds will be used to assisted local non-profits to carry out their mission. During the 2019 season, the 50/50 Raffle had \$133,000 in net revenue.

JERSEY AUCTIONS



The RoughRiders hosted 7 "Jersey Off My Back" auctions during the 2019 season to give fans the opportunity to meet RoughRiders players and receive their autographed game-worn jersey. All the proceeds from the auctions benefitted a local non-profit organization. The RoughRiders Foundation raised over \$25,000 for local non-profits by auctioning off players jerseys in 2019.

MIRACLE LEAGUE



COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

MVP PROGRAM





The MVP Program is designed for teachers to use the marketing power of RoughRiders baseball as an educational tool, helping create incentives and reward students for success both in and out of the classroom. Nearly 350 schools in the DFW metroplex participate in the MVP Program. In 2019, we expanded the MVP Program to include all elementary school grade levels at these schools. This season, all marketing materials were distributed digitally. North Texas Municipal Water District received logo inclusion on all materials, including posters, certificates, and parent/teacher letters.

We also promoted the John Bunker Sands Wetland Center as an education field trip destination for the schools. MVP Students were provided 3 game dates to select from for their MVP experience and were able to invite up to 3 guests to join them for a private, pre-game celebration as well as tickets to the RoughRiders game. North Texas Municipal Water District had a presence at all three (3) MVP dates, greeting the MVP students and their families as they entered the Ballpark. MVP students and their families enjoyed the Riders Playground presented by Water4Otter and NTMWD, our new inflatable Kids Zone, player autographs, and more prior to attending the RoughRiders game.
