Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Ben Lively** to the mound tonight, looking to extend the road winning streak to 4G (last: 6G from 5/27-6/9), while leveling the road record at 35-35. The Bats will counter with LHP **Ben Wereski**. Columbus is 18-22 (.450) versus left handers this year. Wereski has never pitched against the Clippers in his career, as tonight is his seventh game in Triple-A.

vs. the Bats

Columbus was 7-11 against Louisville last year, going 4-10 in the last 14G to lose the season series for the third straight year (4-0 from 2018-22). The Clippers have won each series so far this year (3-2 from 5/19-5/23, 4-2 from 6/30-7/5). **Kahlil Watson** has hit .324 (12x37) with 2HR and 5RBI in 10G against Louisville in his career (**Milan Tolentino** has hit 4HR with 18RBI in 27G).

Where it Stands

The final two weeks of the season begin with Columbus sitting 3.5 games out of 1st place, with six teams to leapfrog. The Clippers could capture the playoff spot with a very doable 8-4, so long as everyone else goes 5-7 or 6-6. At this point, the only teams the Clippers can tie with would be Scranton/WB and Worcester, and because they played neither team this half, the tiebreaker would be last 20G.

Start with a Bang

Over the last 34G, the Clippers have plated 245 runs (most in the IL, 7.2 per), with 157 (64%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including 54 in the 1st. Opponents have only 75 in the first four innings of the last 34G, but are outscoring the Clippers 113-88 thereafter. Taking a lead into the 8th inning, Columbus has won 64 straight (last loss: 8/22/25) and 78 straight when leading into the 9th (8/7/25).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 27 points on his batting average over his last 23G (.213, 17x80) and 69 points from his slugging, with only 3XBH (HR on Saturday snapped streak of 66AB without), but his OBP has dipped only three points in that time, as he has 29BB in 109PA. He ranks 2nd in the IL in walks (81; **Christian Cairo** is 1st with 86BB), having accumulated them in only 423PA (19%, Cairo has 495PA).

Big Time Production

Kyle Manzardo has hit safely in each of 19G since 8/15 (.347, 26x75, 3HR), while collecting 23RBI (RBI in 14G of streak). The streak is the longest active streak in the IL, and just a game off the league high (Rochester's **Trey Lipscomb**, 8/2-8/25). In his Columbus career, Manzardo has played only 130G (571PA), but he has still managed 69XBH (.557SLG), including 31HR, against just 60 singles.

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (18, +5), RBI (42, +8) and SLG (.787, +111) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .328/.413/.662 since 6/18 (21HR, 56RBI). Though Sunday's homer was his first in over a week, Velazquez has 9BB in his last 35PA (9BB in prior 28G, 122PA) and 12RBI in his last 13G (2HR in 46AB, had 16HR and 30RBI in previous 20G, 76AB).

Twenty Town

Kody Huff is one of three Clippers on the verge of 20HR, but has not gone deep in the last 12G (**Kahlil Watson** hit 19th on Sunday, **Cooper Ingle** hit 19th on Saturday), marking the second time in history (2019) the Clippers have had five players with at least 19HR (never had five players with at least 20HR). Despite the power outage, Huff is hitting .366 (15x41) since 8/23, with a .537SLG (6XBH).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino popped his 20th homer Saturday night (3HR in last 7G) and picked up his 18th steal on Friday, as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history. He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is 2nd in the IL with 41HR (t-25th with 38SB). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 19HR (career high, had 11HR through 5/29) and 22SB (three off career best).

Busting Out

Dayan Frias was 1x25 (.040) with an RBI triple from 8/20-8/28, but has gone 7x24 with 4HR and 7RBI in 5G since (also has 3BB). He tied a career high with his 20th steal Saturday night (had 20SB between Akron and Columbus last year). **Blake Perkins** was 3x25 with a HR and 3RBI in 7G from 8/19-8/29, but has hit safely and driven in a run in each of 5G since (6x18, .333, with a HR and 5RBI).

This Date in Clipper History

9/8/2010

Luke Carlin capped the first ever playoff game in Huntington Park history with a walk-off, 2-run homer in the 10th inning against Scranton/WB. Carlin, a late season addition from Indianapolis, went 3x4 with 3RBI in the game. The 6-4 win was the first of seven post season triumphs for the Clippers, as they went on to win their 8th Governors' Cup and 1st National Championship.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,496 to 1,450).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 187-148 (.558) in pitch reviews, with batters going 94-87 (.519) and pitchers/catchers going 93-61 (.604). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 850, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 165 through 135G (on pace for 180SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 47CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 189 runs while crafting a .891OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 125 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +64 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 306-199 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,003RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through 135G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 201HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 73G this season (43-30, .583), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (15, three off the lead) while playing in the 13th most games decided in the last at bat (28, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 102G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 49-53 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 460-467 (.496), 430-421 with Columbus (.505).
