## Syracuse Mets News and Notes

**Pitch Perfect:** Since May 10th, the Syracuse Mets pitching staff is second in the International League with a 3.06 ERA in 12 games: 4-8, 3.06 ERA, 100 IP, 85 H, 48 R, 34 ER, 39 BB, 89 K.

From the beginning of the season to May 8th, the Mets had a league-worst 5.91 ERA and a 10-19 record.

Despite the stellar pitching since May 10th, Mets hitters have been cold with a league-worst .175 batting average in 12 games with a league-fewest 37 runs scored and league-fewest 23 walks.

**Power Surge:** Mark Vientos has six extra-base hits (including four home runs) in his last 11 games. The 22-year-old has two doubles so far in this series at Buffalo. From the beginning of the season to May 1st, Vientos was hitting .164 (9-for-55) with seven RBIs, a home run, four doubles, a triple, nine walks, 22 strikeouts, and a .288 on-base percentage in 18 games.

Since then, Vientos is hitting .289 (13 for-45), with seven RBIs, four home runs, two doubles, five walks, 16 strikeouts, and a .360 on-base percentage in 12 games. He leads the Mets in batting average during that time.

Additionally, Vientos walked just four times in 15 games from the beginning of the season to April 24th, but in his last 16 games, Vientos has walked nine times.

**Streaking:** Travis Blankenhorn is on a six-game on-base streak. During this streak, Blankenhorn is hitting .273 (6-for-22) with two doubles, a walk, and six strikeouts.

**Prospects Promotion:** Outfielder Jake Mangum has been promoted from Double-A Binghamton to Triple-A Syracuse. The 26-year-old hit .283 with nine extra-base hits in 31 games in Double-A but was particularly hot in May, hitting .367 with three doubles, two triples, and a .433 on-base percentage in 16 games played this month. Mangum entered the 2022 season ranked as the 22nd-best prospect in the New York Mets organization by MLB Pipeline. *Baseball America* lauded Mangum as the best defensive outfielder in New York's minor league system.

Mangum was born in Flowood, Mississippi and played four seasons at Mississippi State University before he was selected by the New York Mets in the fourth round of the 2019 amateur entry draft. Jake's father, John Mangum, was a defensive back for the University of Alabama and the Chicago Bears. Jake's uncle Kris Mangum won the 1992 College Football National Championship with Alabama, finished his career at Ole Miss, and was a tight end for ten years for the Carolina Panthers, playing in Super Bowl XXXVIII. Jake's grandfather John "Big John" Mangum Sr. played college football at Ole Miss and Southern Mississippi before playing for the Boston Patriots of the American Football League.

**The All-Star Returns (Again):** Khalil Lee has rejoined Syracuse from Low-A St. Lucie. Lee, the seventh-ranked prospect in the Mets organization according to MLB Pipeline, began the season with Syracuse but hit just .149 in 22 games before he was sent to St. Lucie. In eight games with the St. Lucie Mets, Lee hit .241 (7-for-29) with three doubles, a triple, and a .371 on-base percentage. In 2021, Lee was named a 2021 Triple-A East League Post-Season All-Star and set Syracuse's single season franchise record with a .451 on-base percentage, which also led the league. That .451 mark beat out Otto Velez, who previously held Syracuse's franchise record with a .450 on-base percentage in 1973.

**Untimely Hitting:** The Syracuse Mets are hitting a league-worst .196 with runners in scoring position. This week, Syracuse is 2-for-6 (.333). Last week, Syracuse went 5-for-30 (.167) with runners in scoring position.

- In 2017, Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week ending on September 4th with Low-A Kane County after he **pitched a perfect game on September 1, 2017**, which was the first perfect game in Kane County franchise history, throwing 100 pitches, including 70 strikes
- In 2017, Northwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week ending on July 2nd with Short-Season-A Hillsboro
- 2016 Pioneer League Mid-Season All-Star with Rookie- Level Missoula
- Played four seasons at St. Bonaventure University...Set the single-season program record with 95 strikeouts as a senior in 2016 in 92 innings pitched
- Attended Frewsburg High School in Frewsburg, NY (About 60 miles south of Buffalo and near Jamestown, NY)...Led his high school to five sectional championships

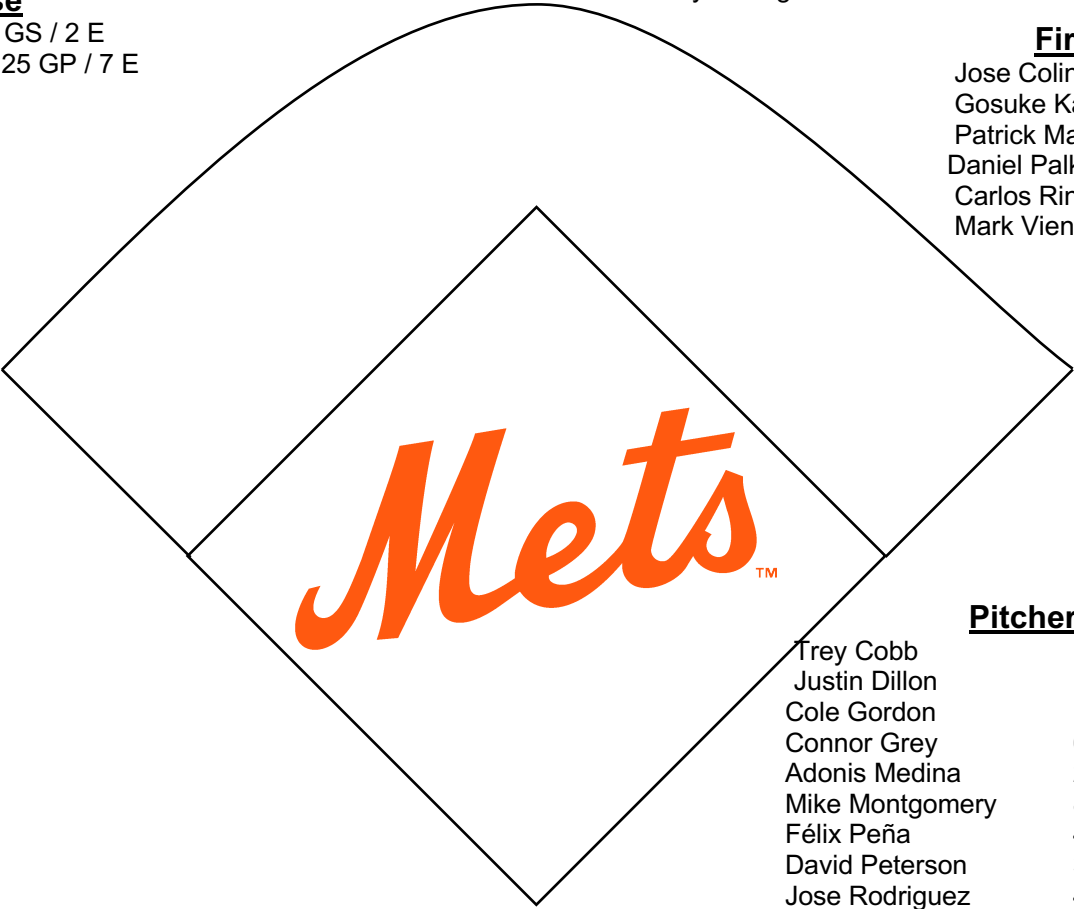
