## "FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

**SAINTS START OUT STRONG, BUT COME UP SHORT THURSDAY IN COLUMBUS:** The St. Paul Saints jumped out to a 2-0 lead before the Clippers came to bat, but couldn't hang on as they fell 5-2 in 7 innings of the doubleheader opener. St. Paul wasted no time taking an early lead. Ryan Fitzgerald served a leadoff base hit into center field and advanced to third when Jefferson Morales notched a hit and centerfielder Will Brennan had trouble getting the ball in for an error. Back-to-back RBI knocks from Carson McCusker and Mike Ford gave the Saints the advantage, extending their hitting streaks to six games and five games, respectively. Columbus would grab the lead in the Bot 1st as they jumped on Saints starter Cory Lewis, who walked two of the first four he faced before uncorking a wild pitch that opened the scoring for the Guardians affiliate. Kody Huff collected a two-out, 2 RBI knock to give the Clippers a 3-2 lead.

**THE POWER OF (THE SAINTS) COMPELS YOU!:** St. Paul seemingly exorcised their demons by notching back-to-back victories at Huntington Park in the same season for the first time in franchise history on Wednesday. Now 28 of the Saints 50 games (56%) in Columbus since 2021 have been "close late" by MLB.com's definition, meaning that in the seventh inning or later, the game is either within a run or the trailing team brings the potential tying run on base, at bat, or on deck. After Wednesday's comeback win, the Saints are now 8-20 in "late/close" situations in Columbus in franchise history. The Saints had lost six straight "late/close" contests before stealing Wednesday night's game in extras. The Saints entered the week with a measeley .277 win% (13-34) at Huntington Park all-time, which ranked as one of the worst five winning percentages for any Triple-A team in a single park the past five seasons, but have nudged themselves outside the top-5 of that dubious leaderboard with their consecutive wins in the Ohio capital.

**SAVE SOME FOR TOMORROW:** The ups and downs of the St. Paul offense have continued in the past couple weeks with the Saints scoring as many as 16 runs in last Tuesday's homestand opener, while also being shutout for the fourth time this season in game one of last Friday's doubleheader. The Saints now rank 15th out of 20 International League teams in runs-per-game, averaging 4.5/ game entering play on Friday. The Saints' low run-scoring rate is despite the team ranking 5th in team batting average (.258) and 7th in OPS (.760). In their 13 wins, the Saints have scored 82 runs (an average of 6.3/game) while in their 14 losses, they've scored just 31 (2.2/game). One of the Saints inconsistencies in run-scoring has been due to hitting with runners in scoring position. They now rank 7th in the International League with a .275 average (69-251) w/ RISP. In their 13 wins, St. Paul are hitting .344 (53-154) situationally and just .165 (16-97) in their 14 losses.

**MCCUSKER MASHING HIS WAY INTO RECORD BOOKS:** Saints outfielder Carson McCusker is crushing the ball to open the season and currently ranks 2nd in Triple-A in average exit velocity to start the year (see below). McCusker has two of the top-5 hardest hit balls by a St. Paul hitter this season and four of the top-10, including a 114.2 mph single on April 2 in Columbus that ranks t-9th in exit velocity among the hardest-hit balls in Saints history. The 6-8 slugger is one of 14 hitters in the minors with at least 7 homers this year and has the most home runs by a St. Paul batter by the end of April in franchise history (no other batter the past five years for the Saints has had more than four by the close of the month). At the end of April, the Sparks, NV native had already collected 23 RBI, the most in Saints history for March/April (see below), 27 total hits, which tied a Saints record for by the end of April, and accrued a 1.049 OPS & .651 SLG%, both the highest in Saints history by that point in the season (min 40 PA).

**STRAIGHT GAS:** The Saints pitching staff rank as the third-hardest throwing staff in Triple-A to start the season with an average velocity of 89.5 mph that ranks as a harder throwing staff than 21 Major League teams. Despite the extra few ticks, the Saints rank just 9th in K-rate (25.2%) and 8th in whiff-rate (29.1%). By average velocity on fastballs only, St. Paul ranks t-8th in Triple-A (92.6) and t-4th in the IL. Ryan Jensen (96.8, 17th) and Alex Speas (96.5, 21st) are both top-25 in the Triple-A circuit in average fastball velo among arms with at least 100 pitches thrown.

**SWING AND A MISS:** The Saints bullpen has had two of the better swing-and-miss arms in the league to start the season with relievers Kyle Bischoff (47.4%, 4th) and Ryan Jensen (46.5%, 6th) both ranking among the top-5 pitchers in the International League in whiff-rate to start the season (min 100 pitches thrown). The St. Paul staff rank 8th out of 20 teams in whiff-rate (29.1%) overall.

**THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY:** The Saints' current roster features eight of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and nine according to Baseball America while also touting four of Minnesota's top-10 prospects on the MLB Pipeline list. The Twins prospects in the rankings include OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No. 2, MLB.com, No. 2 BA), RHP Zebby Matthews (-/4), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Elees (23/17-currently on 7-day IL), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Rodriguez checks in at the No. 19 on the MLB Pipeline's top-100 prospects and No. 37 on Baseball America's Top-100 list.

**TWINS REPORT:** Following a pair of rain delays in Cleveland that totaled over 2 hours, the Minnesota Twins (13-19) tied the game up on three consecutive singles in the 7th, only to fall 4-3 to the Guardians in 10 innings, their third straight loss since taking the series opener. The defeat mark the Twins' 12th consecutive loss in a one-run game at Progressive Field. Griffin Jax continued to right the ship, striking out two in a 1-2-3 eighth inning, his fifth straight scoreless appearance after allowing 10 ER in his first nine outings. Down on the farm, Double-A Wichita (15-9) have won 9 of their last 11 games. Outfielder Tyler Fedko, a 12th round pick out of UConn by the Twins, has reached base in 19 consecutive games to start the year and is hitting .313 with 5 HR and a 1.052 OPS that leads all qualified Minnesota farmhands. High-A Cedar Rapids (15-8) have won four straight. Twins No. 14 prospect Billy Amick ranks third in the Midwest League in hitting (.342) and 7th in OPS (.922) to start the year. Low-A Fort Myers (13-11) are 1-2 so far this week against Jupiter. Kernels RHP Charlee Soto, the Twins' No. 8 prospect was placed on the 7-Day IL with a right triceps strain on Tuesday. He is the third top-10 prospect in the org to be placed on the IL (also #1-Walker Jenkins, #3 Luke Keaschall).

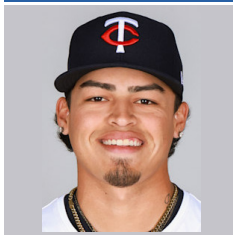

**LAST APPEARANCE:** Started Friday in game one of a doubleheader and allowed the first two batters of the game to reach (walk, single) to give up a pair of runs in the first. In the second, retired just five of the first six that he faced (a sac bunt) and was lifted after walking Jack Suwinski to load the bases. The seven runs allowed was one shy of a career-high. Threw 17 four-seamers, 15 cutters, 9 curveballs, 7 sinkers, 6 sweepers, and 1 changeup. Generated six whiffs and his lone strikeout came on a four-seam fastball.

**YOUNG GUNS:** After making St. Paul's Opening Day roster following one appearance with the Saints to end last season, Raya is one of just six pitchers aged 22-years or younger to begin the 2025 season on a Triple-A roster. At 22 years, 7 months, and 21 days as of Opening Day, Raya is more than five years younger than the average pitcher at the Triple-A level this season. **A LONG WAIT:** A fourth-round pick in 2020, Raya had to wait a while to make his professional debut. After entering the year as a 1st Team Preseason All-American, his senior season at United South High School in Laredo, Texas was limited to just 18.0 innings in which he struck out 36 batters. His final high school outing was a complete-game, one-hit shutout. However due to the COVID-19 shutdown, followed by a right rotator cuff strain, Raya threw his first professional pitch on April 12, 2022, 670 days after hearing the Twins call his name in the Draft.

**THAT'S MARK, WITH A K:** Raya, who's full legal name is Marco Antonio Raya, goes by Mark, despite not having a "K" in his legal name. He said you'd have to ask his dad as to why --- he's listed as "Marco" everywhere on Major League Baseball's websites.

**GOOD GENES:** Athletes run in the Raya family. Mark's mother played college tennis, his father played baseball at Nixon, while his sister made it to regionals as a junior and senior at United South HS in hurdles. Raya's brother also holds the Texas A&M International career strikeout record (127) despite only pitching two years for the Dustdevils in Division 2.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** Started game two of Friday's doubleheader against Indianapolis and fought through a shaky first inning to settle in for a dominant outing the rest of the way. Gave up a leadoff single and walked the next batter, Nick Solak, while also walking DJ Stewart with two down to load the bases, but wriggled out of the jam with a strikeout of Billy Cook. After plunking Abraham Gutierrez to lead off the second, retired 12 straight to end his night. Threw 26 four-seamers, 22 sinkers, 15 changeups, and 9 sweepers while generating 12 swings-and-misses, led by five on the 4-seam and four on the change. Struck out at least a batter in each of the first four innings and had four of his seven strikeouts come looking. Struck out three batters with his sinker and two each with the four-seam and sweeper.

**I'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE, MAN:** Last season was a tumultuous year for the veteran right-hander, McCaughan. After spending the first seven years of his professional career with the Mariners, he was traded for cash after being designated for assignment in February 2024, and spent the season on the Triple-A/Major League shuttle. He was optioned to Triple-A on five separate occasions, and also recalled to the Majors five different times, splitting the season between the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and Miami Marlins, as well as the Columbus Clippers and Cleveland Guardians. After he was DFA'd by Miami and traded to Cleveland on May 9, the Guardians DFA'd him on June 30 and he was claimed off waivers on July by the Marlins, the same organization that had designated him for assignment less than two months earlier (he was optioned to Jacksonville and finished out the year appearing for both the Jumbo Shrimp an the Marlins). After signing with the Twins as a Minor League free agent in December, the Saints will mark the 10th different team that McCaughan has suited up for between the Majors and Minor Leagues.

**A MEMORABLE FIRST GAME IN THE BIGS:** Making his Major League debut as a 25-year-old, McCaughan realized a dream, making his Major League debut. The right-hander came on in extended relief for the Mariners on July 21, 2021 at Coors Field vs the Rockies. McCaughan managed to give up a run despite throwing five hitless innings; he worked around three walks without recording a strikeout, becoming only the third pitcher since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893 to throw five hitless innings in his MLB debut, and the first in 54 years to do so (per the Elias Sports Bureau). The others to accomplish the feat were Bill Dillman on April 14, 1967 for the Orioles against the Kansas City A's, and Hank Borowy on April 18, 1942 for the Yankees vs the Red Sox. McCaughan retired Raimel Tapia for a lineout in the Bot 2 for his first Big League out, and faced the minimum through his first two innings of work with the help of a double-play. He took a no-decision as the M's lost 3-6.

**THIS GUY'S A REAL DIRTBAG, AND WE MEAN THAT AS A COMPLIMENT:** Before being drafted in the 12th round of the 2017 Draft by the Mariners, McCaughan had a remarkable career for Long Beach State, where he pitched three seasons from 2015-17, accruing a 23-5 record and a sparkling 2.31 ERA with 234 strikeouts in 280.2 innings. McCaughan appeared on the Golden Spikes Award mid-season watch list as a sophomore in 2016 and earned 2nd-team All-American honors in both 2016 & 2017 from multiple outlets, becoming the first Long Beach State pitcher since Jared Weaver (2003-04) to do so in consecutive seasons. Long Beach's program compete in the Big West and are nicknamed "The Dirtbags," a moniker that dates back to 1989, when the then-head coach Dave Snow inherited a program in the doldrums. He put an emphasis on finding "hard-nosed players with something to prove" and drove his players to take a tough and gritty approach that included making diving plays, sliding hard into second, and generally dirtying the uniform. The nickname has stuck to this day. McCaughan is one of more than 60 former "Dirtbags" that have appeared in a Major League game, a list that includes Jason Giambi, Evan Longoria, Troy Tulowitzki, Jeff McNeil, and Jered Weaver.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** Relieved Aaron Rozek following his four-inning start (3 ER, 4 BB, 3 SO) on Saturday at CHS Field. Entered with the Saints up 4-3 before allowing three straight to reach after retiring the leadoff batter in the fifth. Allowed the tying run to score on an RBI double by Billy Cook and let up the go-ahead run on a sac bunt by Alika Williams. Retired the last seven batters he faced after allowing three runs in the fifth. Threw 19 four-seamers, 17 sliders, 14 sinkers, 10 cutters, and two changeups. Recorded a pair of punchouts on his four-seam fastball and the other on the slider.

**PITCHING LAB PAYING DIVIDENDS:** Adams credits his success to a relationship built on trust with the Twins player development staff, who helped him add a cutter as well as convert his sweeper into a true slider with big swing-and-miss numbers (a 40.6% whiff-rate in four Triple-A appearances last season), helping him round out his six-pitch arsenal in 2024.

**NOT ALL HEROES WEAR CAPES:** Travis helped save the life of a stranger from a burning house in Fort Myers in March of 2024 during Spring Training. He heard a loud bang from the house across the street from where he was staying. He and another man ran out, and saw that the house was on fire. They started to bang on the door to see if anyone was inside. Three other people came out who knew the man inside and started yelling, "Howard, your house is on fire, get out!" Gaining entrance to the house was difficult because of so many objects around the outside of the house, but Travis went around the side of the house, tearing up a part of the fence down to get back to the area where another door was. He ended up opening the door, and safely escorting the man out of the burning building.

**SIGHT-SEERS:** Adams traveled through Kyoto, Osaka and the outskirts of Japan with fellow Twins minor leaguer Jaylen Nowlin following the 2024 season. It was a leisure trip, but the duo took time away from their vacation to travel two hours from Shibuya (on the outskirts of Tokyo) to meet their old coach in the Twins organization, Takashi Miyoshi (now a Minor League instructor with the Reds) at his youth clinic. Adams and Nowlin spoke to a group of 8-16 year olds about their journey through American baseball and the mental side of the game.

**HORNET PRIDE:** Adams played his college baseball at Cal-State Sacramento in the Western Athletic Conference. He was a three-year starter for the Hornets, regularly pitching as their Saturday night guy as a junior and forming a dynamic 1-2 punch atop the rotation with Scott Randall, who went nine picks after Adams in that summer's June 2021 Amateur Draft to the Pirates (the two have yet to face each other in a professional game entering the season). While at Cal-State Sacramento, Adams was known for his pinpoint control, issuing just 25 walks in 151.0 career innings, the lowest BB/9 rate in program history (min. 100 IP). The program has produced nine Major Leaguers entering the 2025 season, headlined by Rhys Hoskins and James Outman.
