Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Ben Lively** to the mound tonight, looking for his first win of the season (reached 80 pitches last time out). The Cubs will counter with LHP **Justin Steele** on MLB rehab. Columbus is 15-21 (.417) versus left handers this year. Steele has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, on 7/23/21 in Huntington Park (ND, 4.0IP, 2H, 2R, 1ER, 3BB, 4K).

vs. the Cubs

Since a 5G win streak against Iowa from 5/12-6/14/24, the Clippers are 20-19 opposing the I-Cubs (35-26 in the last 61G). Individually, **Milan Tolentino** has hit the Cubs at a .347 clip (34x98) with 10HR and 26RBI in his career (28G). **Cooper Ingle** has batted .314 (11x35) with 3HR and 9RBI in 11G, while **Kahlil Watson** has 3HR and 11RBI in 15G, while **Kody Huff** owns 17RBI in 20G.

Start with a Bang

Over the last 29G, the Clippers have plated 214 runs (most in the IL, 7.4 per), with 144 (67%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including 52 in the 1st (11 multi-run 1sts). The opposition has only 69 in the first four innings of the last 29G, but is outscoring the Clippers 104-70 thereafter. Columbus is the only undefeated team in the IL when leading after the 7th (50-0, 60 straight since 8/22/25).

Out Front

Each of the last 11G (6-5) have seen the Clippers grab a multi-run lead, tied for the longest stretch in the IL this season. Last night saw them face a pair of deficits, as they garnered their IL-best 30th win when allowing the first run of the game and IL-best 40th comeback win (tied with Charlotte). Additionally, last night was the 40th win when allowing at least four runs (five more than 2nd place, Charlotte).

Back to the Launch Pad

Last week saw the Clippers hit 6HR, while giving up the same (went into series averaging 2.6 and allowing 2.1 in prior 22G), but they still lead all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (65, accounting for 50% of runs: 107 of 214) and have allowed the 6th most (53, leads IL; accounts for 46%: 79 of 173). Huntington Park has been breached 76 times in the last 17G (park record 39HR last series, vs. St. Paul).

700 Club

The lineup drew 10BB last night (11th game with 10+), as Columbus enters tonight with an IL-high 691BB (+57 on 2nd place; Iowa leads with 655BB issued). The Clippers are pacing for 781BB (in 147G), a total that would obliterate the club record set in 1983 (741 in 140G). Since 2023, 11 teams in the IL have reached at least 700BB, including nine teams in 2023 (zero seasons of 700BB from 1985-2022).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino got to the doorstep of 20HR last night, while also embiggening his steal total to 17, as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history. He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is tied for 1st in the IL with 40HR and tied for 25th with 37SB. After poking a grand slam on 8/18, he went 3x37 in his next 10G (8/19-8/29; 4x6, 2HR in 2G since).

Big Time Production

Kyle Manzardo has hit safely in each of 14G since 8/15 (.351, 20x57, 2HR), while collecting 19RBI (RBI in 11G of streak). In his Columbus career, Manzardo has played only 125G (551PA), but he has still managed 68XBH (.559SLG), including 30HR, against just 55 singles. Additionally, he has scored 98 times with 89RBI, while keeping his strikeout rate under 20% (104K, 19%; 85BB, 15%).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (17, +6), RBI (41, +9) and SLG (.858, +122) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .346/.423/.691 since 6/18 (20HR, 55RBI). Though Velazquez has not homered in the last 3G (9AB, 1HR in last 8G, 30AB; 16HR in previous 20G, 76AB), he has drawn 5BB (6BB in prior 17G) and has an RBI in each of his last 5G (8RBI total).

Another High

Kody Huff set a career high with his 20th double last night, having already set personal bests in games (104, +3), runs (74, +29), hits (95, +13), triples (6, +4), HR (19, +12), RBI (72, +25), walks (64, +20) and steals (12, +5). His current 20G on base streak (.382OBP since 8/2) has tied his career high, set earlier this year (6/2-6/30; also set career high with 12G hit streak: 5/1-5/12, currently at 7G).

This Date in Clipper History

9/2/2010

David Huff pitched the Clippers past Toledo in an 8-0 win. The win was the 8th of the year for the lefty (7.0IP, 5H, 1BB, 5K) and clinched a playoff berth for the Clippers, ending the longest playoff drought in team history (five years). Huff went on to start both opening games in the IL playoffs (won first game in the GC Finals) and the Triple-A National Championship (earned the win in that game as well).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,494 to 1,441).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 181-145 (.555) in pitch reviews, with batters going 92-87 (.514) and pitchers/catchers going 89-58 (.605). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 848, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 155 through 130G (on pace for 175SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 44CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (50; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 183 runs while crafting a .886OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 120 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +63 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 302-187 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 80 grand slams and 1,995RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.48 through 130G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 207HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 70G this season (41-29, .586), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (15, three off the lead) while playing in the 13th most games decided in the last at bat (28, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 102G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 49-53 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 456-466 (.495), 426-420 with Columbus (.504).
