TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints got 6.0 strong innings from Randy Dobnak paired with eight runs on 12 hits to close out the two-week roadtrip with an 8-1 victory over Rochester. Dobnak escaped the first inning with only one run scoring after walking three batters. The Saints got on the board in the fourth inning on a two-run double from Alex Isola, later followed by a two-run single from Diego A. Castillo. In the seventh inning, Matt Wallner clubbed his ninth home run of the season, matching the team-high and making it a 7-1 ballgame. Nick Wittgren, Ryan Jensen and Kody Funderburk faced one over the minimum over the final 3.0 innings. Wallner added to the lead again in the eighth with an RBI double, driving in three runs on the day.

BROOKS IS BACK: Brooks Lee was reinstated from the 7-Day Injured List on Tuesday, completing his minor league rehab assignment in Fort Myers. In his 10-game rehab assignment between the FCL Twins and Fort Myers, Lee hit .395 (15-for-38) with three doubles, five RBI and four walks to five strikeouts. Lee was played on the IL on March 29 with low back pain. In 2023, he hit .237/.304/.428 in 37 games with the Saints.

BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE: As Royce Lewis returned to the Minnesota Twins on Tuesday, Edouard Julien was optioned to St. Paul. Julien hit .207/.309/.367 with seven home runs in 58 games with the Twins. To make room for Lee and Julien, the Saints placed Austin Schuller and Yoynier Fajardo on the Development List.

NEW OPPONENT, WHO DIS?: The Saints will face off against the Syracuse Mets for the first time in the club's franchise history. Syracuse is the fourth team from the IL-East to visit CHS Field, joining Rochester, Durham and Scranton W/B. The Saints are 33-23 all-time against the East Division, including going 17-9 at CHS Field.

WALLNER WARMING UP: Over the last seven games since May 28, Matt Wallner has started to swing the bat better, hitting .292 (7-for-24), with all seven hits going for extra bases (three doubles and four home runs). The seven extra base hits are tied for the second-most in Triple-A in that span. Over the seven-game stretch, Wallner is slugging .917 with a ISO of .625.

BOUSHLEY UNDER CONTROL: When Caleb Boushley has allowed runners to reach base, he has minimized the damage. Boushley has not walked a batter his season with runners on base. The right-hander has completed 20.0 innings worth of baseball with runners on base, facing 74 batters with runners on, the second-most in all of baseball (Majors or minors). The only player to have made it further is Lake County's Austin Peterson has thrown 20.2 innings, facing 76 batters with runners on base without issuing a walk while there are runners on.

JUST NOT ENOUGH: The offensive output the Saints got on Saturday usually is enough to get it done, but not on Saturday in their 11-8 loss to Rochester. The eight runs tie the most they've scored in a loss this year (May 16 vs Omaha, L 9-8 in 11 innings) and the 13 hits are the most in a loss this year as well. It marks the 10th time in franchise history the Saints have put up eight runs and 13 hits and did not get the win, eight of which have come on the road.

CHECKING ON THE COMPLEX: Jair Camargo continues his minor league rehab assignment, going 3-for-11 with a double, RBI and a walk in two games with the FCL Twins and Fort Myers. Camargo was placed on the 7-Day Injured List on May 1 with a right forearm strain.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE: On Saturday, Michael Helman became just the fifth Saints player (and second this season) to record three doubles in a game. Anthony Prato also accomplished the feat on April 24. Helman is the first player to do so in a four-hit game. The Saints are the only Triple-A club, and one of three among full-season teams (Portland and San Jose) to have multiple players record a three-double game this season.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: The two-week roadtrip has benefitted a pair of Saints' batters: Yunior Severino and Michael Helman swung the bats well on the two-week trip.

§ In Severino's eight games since May 21, he has hit .333 (13-for-39), with three home runs and a .986 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 93.0 mph, up from his season average of 89.2 mph.

§ Michael Helman has turned it on again, hitting .348 (16-for-43) on the roadtrip. He's struck out just seven times over his last 50 plate appearances.

MARTIN MASHING: In his 14 games with the Saints, Austin Martin is hitting .326/.507/.457. His 14 walks since being optioned back on May 21 are the second-most in the league in that span and his .491 OBP since re-joining the Saints lineup is the third-best in the IL.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins dropped the series opener to the Yankees last night, falling 5-1. Royce Lewis homered in his first game back from the Injured List, providing Minnesota's only run in the seventh inning.

LAST APPEARANCE: 5/28 (2) @ ROC...made ninth start of the season and first since being optioned back by the Minnesota Twins...threw 5.0 innings, allowing one run on three hits, walking two and striking out five in second game of the doubleheader...allowed lone run in first inning on two singles and a fielder's choice...did not allow another hit until the fifth inning, a Brady Lindsly double...retired six of final seven batters...received fifth win in 4-1 Saints victory in seven innings.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 5/20 @ WSH...made 2024 MLB and Twins debut, throwing 2.0 innings of relief in the seventh and eighth innings...allowed two runs on three hits, walking one and striking one out...retired the side in order in the seventh...allowed three hits with two outs in the eighth, including a pair of doubles...did not factor into the decision in a 12-3 Twins loss.

WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP: Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

SOMETHINGS BREWING: One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

GIVE BACK: Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
