TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints and Mud Hens went back-and-forth on Wednesday, but the Saints dealt the final blow in an 8-7 victory. Toledo took the lead, going up 2-0 after the top of the third, but the Saints rallied for a five-run response, their second straight game with a five-run inning. Brooks Lee hit the second of his three doubles, driving in a pair. Later in the inning, Jair Camargo hit a three-run home run to right field, giving the Saints a 5-2 lead. The Mud Hens promptly scored four more in the fourth inning, taking back the lead at 6-5. After the Mud Hens tacked on another to make it 7-5, the Saints scored three in the eighth inning, getting a bases-loaded walk from Yunior Severino, an RBI single from Diego Castillo and a wild pitch to score Matt Wallner, giving the Saints an 8-7 lead. From there Hobie Harris and Kody Funderburk put up a pair of zeroes to lock down the Saints eighth consecutive victory.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE: Brooks Lee delivered just the sixth three-double game in franchise history and the third this season with his effort on Wednesday. He joins Anthony Prato and Michael Helman as the other Saints to accomplish the feat this year. The Saints are the only Triple-A club to have multiple players with a three-double game and the only full-season minor league team to have a three players record three-double games.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The Saints have pushed their run differential to +28 this year, compared to a month ago, where it was at -12. The +28 difference is the best for any team in all of baseball with a record of .500 or worse.

A STRIKEOUT FESTA-VAL: David Festa tied the Saints single-game franchise strikeout record for the third time this season, punching out 10 Louisville Bats last Friday night. Festa is only Triple-A pitcher and one of seven in minor league baseball to record three games with at least 10 strikeouts and one of eight Triple-A pitchers to record a game with 10 strikeouts and no walks.

LOVING THE LONG BALL: The Saints have found their knack for hitting home runs over the last three weeks, hitting 34 of their 89 (38%) of their home runs since May 29, a span of 19 games. In that stretch, 53 of the 108 (49%) runs the clubs has scored have come as a result of a home run. The 34 home runs the Saints have hit in that time are the second-most in Triple-A, trailing Lehigh Valley's 39.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING! The Saints have won their last eight games, tying the franchise record, from June 5-14, 2022. Over the eight-game streak, the Saints are hitting a league-best .325/.415/.570, working out to a Triple-A-best .985 OPS. They have hit 16 home runs over the eight games, the most in the IL in that span.

WALLNER WARMING UP: In his 14 June games, Matt Wallner has hit .365/.437/.857 sporting a 1.294 OPS. He's hit a league-high nine home runs in his this month, averaging a 94.2 mph exit velocity and owns a .492 ISO in that span. He's also the league leader in June in RBI (19), total bases (54) and extra-base hits (13).

NO WALKS FOR YOU! Over the last 11 games, the Saints have walked just 19 batters. The 227 walks issued by the Saints are the fewest in Triple-A, in addition to their 2.92 strikeouts per walk which also leads the circuit. The next closest is Durham at 2.73. Over the last 11 games, the Saints have struck out 107 batters to their 19 walks, a 5.63 K/BB ratio, the best in all of baseball.

GO, DIEGO, GO! Diego A. Castillo has surged again over his last 15 games, hitting .383 (18-47) with three doubles and two home runs with a 1.096 OPS. Over that 15-game span, Castillo has walked 11 times and struck out only five times.

KEMP KRUSHING: Tony Kemp has turned it on over his last 20 games since May 22, hitting .351 (27-for-77). In that stretch he has hits in 14 of those 20 games, nine multi-hit games and four three-hit nights. In his last 81 plate appearances, Kemp has drawn three walks and struck out nine times, sporting a .370 on-base percentage and a .519 slugging percentage.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yunior Severino's 23 games since May 21, he has hit .385 (30-for-78), with seven home runs, drawing 22 walks to 23 strikeouts, owning a 1.192 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 93.1 mph, up from his season average of 89.7 mph. In June, Severino leads the IL in on-base percentage, sporting a .607 clip OPS at 1.351. His 17 June walks are also the fourth-most in the league.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins and Rays were locked in a pitcher's duel last night that they dropped in 10 innings, 3-2. Joe Ryan threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball, striking out five. Royce Lewis went 3-for-4, hitting his eighth homer in the loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: 6/14 @LOU...made 13th start of the season, logging second quality start of the season, throwing 6.0 innings, allowing two runs on four hits, one home run, walking none and tying the franchise record by striking out 10 for the third time this season...both runs allowed came in the first inning on an Edwin Rios home run...six of first seven outs were recorded by strikeout, the other via pickoff...did not allow another runner past first base after the home run...is one of eight Triple-A pitchers to strike out 10 without issuing a walk this season...received second win of the season in 9-5 Saints victory.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 6/7 v SYR...made 12th start of the season, allowing two runs on five hits, walking one and striking out six over 5.0 innings...allowed leadoff triple to Luisangel Acuña, striking out the next three batters to get out of the inning...leadoff man reached in each of the first four innings, three of which were on hits, the fourth on error...both runs scored came in the third inning, starting with a Hayden Senger doubled, driven in by Acuña...Acuña advanced to second on a groundout, stole third, the scored on a groundout...did not factor into the decision in a 3-2 Saints loss in 10 innings.

MOWING THEM DOWN: In his start on May 22, 2024 in Buffalo, Festa retired the first 10 batters that he faced. After getting a flyout to center field to start the game, he then struck out the following seven batters, setting a new franchise record. With two outs in the third, Steward Berroa slapped a ball to second base to snap the streak. His seven consecutive punchouts surpassed Joe Ryan (8/20/21 vs Iowa) and Ronny Henriquez (5/28/22 v Indianapolis).

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!: On July 24, 2022, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.

He said it's sort of tough for him to do certain exercises given his height and narrowness. Last season he was listed at 185 pounds and came into Spring Training in 2024 10 pounds heavier at 195.
