YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Fightin Phils, 6-3. Reading scored a run in the second and got a two-run homer by Felix Reyes in the third to open a 3-0 lead. In the fifth, Diego Velasquez hit an RBI single and scored on a triple by Carter Howell, who came home on a throwing error to tie the score. Richmond relievers Will Bednar (2.0 IP), Helcris Olivarez (1.0 IP) and Evan Gates (2.0 IP) covered five scoreless innings. With two outs in the bottom of the ninth, Thomas Gavello and Justin Wishkoski both singled to put runners on first and third. Pinch-hitter Jairo Pomares belted a three-run, walk-off homer to end the game

WALK IT OFF: On Friday, Jairo Pomares hit the first walk-off homer for the Flying Squirrels since a grand slam by Will Wilson against the Altoona Curve on April 17, 2022. It was also the third pinch-hit walk-off homer in franchise history. The others were both pinch-hit grand slams, the first by Ryder Jones to beat the Curve on Sept. 3, 2016 and the other was by Jacob Heyward in the 10th inning to top Erie on August 19, 2019. Overall, the homer by Pomares was the 11th walk-off home run in Flying Squirrels franchise history.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play fifth of a six-game series against the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies. This is the only series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels are 15-4 against the Fightin Phils since the start of the 2023 season, including an 10-3 record at The Diamond. In 2023, the Flying Squirrels swept Reading in three games to open the season and won five-of-six in a series at FirstEnergy Stadium. Last year, they went 5-1 in a six-game series in their only series against Reading, with the Fightin Phils avoiding a sweep with a win in the fifth game.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,614 fans per home game, which ranks fifth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won their first series of the season last week, taking three-of-five against Altoona on the road. In that series, both teams were held to two-or-less runs in four-of-five games. Of Richmond's 48 losses this season, 26 of them have been by two runs or less (18 by one, eight by two). Their 18 one-run losses are the most in the EL, two ahead of Reading (16). The Richmond offense is last in the Eastern League in runs scored (232). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.60 ERA.

THE FIGHTIN PHILS: went 2-4 in last week's home series against the Yard Goats and finished the first half 25-42, last in the Northeast Division. Reading's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects list, including SS Aidan Miller (No. 2), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 13), SS Carson DeMartini (No. 16), RHP Daniel Harper (No. 23), OF Hendry Mendez (No. 27) and RHP Griff McGarry (No. 29). There are also five players featured in MLB.com's top-30 Phillies prospects list, including Miller (No. 2), Cabrera (No. 11), DeMartini (No. 15), Mendez (No. 25) and C Caleb Ricketts (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 16, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.76 ERA (23 ER/75.0 IP) in nine games. The Richmond bull-pen has posted a 0.73 ERA (3 ER/37.0 IP) in that stretch. Richmond's 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) in last week's road set at Altoona was their lowest of the season for a series and the best in the Eastern League for the week. The previous low was a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) in their six-game series from April 15-20 against Chesapeake at The Diamond.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his 15th start of the season and the second of his career against the Fightin Phils. He last pitched on Sunday at Altoona and threw six scoreless innings, holding the Curve to two hits, to pick up his second win of the season. In his last 10 starts since May 4, Bertrand has gone 2-2 with a 2.49 ERA (14 ER/50.2 IP). He faced the Fightin Phils on May 17, 2024 at The Diamond and allowed one run in 5.2 innings, but Jose Rodriguez is the only player from that outing who is still active with Reading. Bertrand started on Opening Day for the Flying Squirrels on April 4 against Akron, becoming the first pitcher to start back-to-back season openers for the Flying Squirrels on April 4 against Akron, becoming the first pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Tiple-A Sacramento to close the season. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. He was selected by the Giants in the 10th round of the 2022 MLB Draft. For more on Bertrand, see page two.

FOR READING: Right-hander Estibenzon Jimenez makes his second Double-A start. In his debut with Reading on Sunday, he allowed six runs over five innings in a loss. He allowed four runs in the first inning, including a three-run homer by Zach Kokoska, and a solo homer to GJ Hill in the second before holding the Yard Goats to one run over his last three frames. Jimenez began the season with High-A Jersey Shore and went 5-2 with a 5.09 ERA in 14 games (six starts). He signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2019.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 40 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 27 runners caught stealing. Morgan, who was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on June 10, is seventh in the Eastern League with 12. Perez threw out his first base-stealing attempt on Wednesday.

GO, DIEGO, GO!: Diego Velasquez is batting .344 (22-for-64) in his last 17 games since June 6 with two doubles, three RBIs, 11 walks and eight runs scored. In that span, he has at least one hit in 14-of-17 games and multiple hits in seven games. He is currently riding a team-leading 14-game on-base streak since June 10, which is the longest by a Richmond player this season. His 13-game on-base streak from April 18-May 5 is tied for the second-longest on the team in 2025. In the Eastern League this season, Velasquez is fifth in hits (70), sixth in OBP (.387), tied for seventh in walks (38) and ninth in batting average (.286). Since his Double-A debut on July 24, 2024, Velasquez is ranked second in the Eastern League in batting average (.296), second in OBP (.388), second in hits (116), fifth in walks (54), tied for seventh in total bases (139) and ninth in OBP (.743).

BERI BOMBS: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** returned to the Richmond roster on June 3. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels. Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. He hit his fifth Double-A homer of the year on Wednesday afternoon. In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Bericoto has homered 27 times, which is locked in a five-way tie for fourth place in franchise history (**Devin Harris, Sean Roby, Shane Matheny** and **Will Wilson**).

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever Braxton Roxby closed his third save of the season on Sunday in Richmond's 2-1 win at Altoona. In that outing, he allowed an earned run for the first time since April 29 after throwing 13 consecutive games without surrendering an earned run, spanning 18 innings. In that stretch, the only two runs he surrendered were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27 against the Senators. In his last 15 outings since April 29, Roxby is 3-0 with a 0.43 ERA (1 ER/21.0) with 24 strikeouts and six walks. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 20 IP) this season, Roxby's 1.24 ERA is ranked fourth.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked fifth in hits (70), sixth in OBP (.387), tied for seventh in walks (38) and ninth in batting average (.286). Seth Lonsway is sixth in innings pitched (70.1) and seventh in ERA (3.45). John Michael Bertrand is fourth in innings pitched (72.0) and ninth in ERA (3.50). Jack Choate is tied for seventh in strikeouts (67). Joe Whitman is tied for ninth in strikeouts (65)

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 227 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 5), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Sabin Ceballos (No. 21) and Jack Choate (No. 26). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 5-2, at Parker Field. Jim Beachamp hit a pair of two-run homers for the R-Braves. A solo homer by Bobby Cox drove in the other run. It was the team's ninth consecutive win, tying the 1959 Virginians for the longest win streak by a Richmond team in the International League. 1973: The Richmond Braves beat the Peninsula Whips, 4-3, at Parker Field. The start of the game was delayed 35 minutes because the Whips' bus broke down on the way to the ballpark. Richmond starter Rich Kester lasted six pitches, giving up two singles and a four-pitch walk before being replaced by Pedro Torrealba, who allowed two sacrifice flies and an RBI single for a 3-0 Whips lead. Clint Courtney then brought in Wenty Ford, who allowed three hits in the first of his outing, spanning 9.1 innings. Jack Pierce broke the shutout with a solo homer in the seventh. Larvell Blanks tied the game with a two-run homer in the eighth. In the bottom of the 10th inning, John Fuller hit a single to center and Larry Jaster beat a throw home from Pepe Mangual to score the winning run. 1982: The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 2-1, at Parker Field. Craig McMurtry started for the Braves and allowed one run and six hits in a complete game, outdueling Tides starter Ron Darling. Tidewater took a 1-0 lead in the third with a sacrifice fly by Marvel Wynne. In the bottom of the inning, Jerry Keller tied the score with a two-out single. In the bottom of the eighth, Brook Jacoby singled home Chico Ruiz to give Richmond a 2-1 lead. In the top of the ninth with two on base, Bruce Bochy hit a fly ball to left and Bob Porter made a leaping catch at the wall to record the final out. 2019: The Flying Squirrels beat the Hartford Yard Goats, 3-2, at The Diamond. Johneshwy Fargas went 4-for-4, adding RBI hits in the third and sixth innings. Bryce Johnson added two hits and scored twice. Alfred Gutierrez struck out six over six innings. Melvin Adon closed his 10th save of
