SPLITTING THE DOUBLEHEADER

Round Rock fell in Game 1 of the doubleheader, 6-1, but came back for an 8-2 win in Game 2. The Space Cowboys opened the scoring when 2B Brice Matthews grounded into a double play but Bastidas scored from third, giving Sugar Land a 1-0 lead. With two on in the fourth, LF Tommy Sacco Jr. cleared the bases with a double. Later, Sacco Jr. scored from third on a groundout from RF Kenedy Corona and the Space Cowboys led 4-0 after four. 3B Cody Freeman scored SS Ezequiel Duran on a double and the Express trailed 4-1. Back-to-back homers from DH Luis Guillorme and Sacco Jr. extended it to 6-1 where the score stood final. In Game 2, a throwing error in the first inning gave Round Rock a 1-0 lead. In the fourth, another throwing error made it 2-0 Express. In the fifth, 2B Justin Foscue hit a solo shot and extended the Round Rock lead to 3-0. In the fifth, Sugar Land 1B Collin Price doubled and Bastidas cleared the bags with a homer, cutting the Sugar Land deficit to 3-2. Round Rock added to the lead with five runs in the seventh highlighted by a pinch-hit, two-run homer for LF Evan Carter and the E-Train rumbled to an 8-2 victory.

PLASSMEYER SET TO OPEN

Express LHP Michael Plassmeyer is set as the opener for the second time this year. In five appearances this season, he is 1-0 with a 6.52 ERA (7 ER/9.2 IP). He has had at least three strikeouts in three of his five outings. The southpaw signed a minor league contract with the Texas Rangers in December. He has appeared in the Major Leagues over two seasons (2022-2023) making three appearances and one start for Philadelphia.

STEADY SUPAK

Express RHP Trey Supak made his first appearance for the Express and earned a win in Game 2 of yesterday's doubleheader. Supak threw 5.0 innings, allowing three hits and two runs with one walk and four strikeouts. He is the first Round Rock starter to make it more than 4.0 innings since RHP Dane Dunning on Thursday, April 24.

HERE COMES EVAN

Round Rock OF Evan Carter belted a pinch-hit home run in Game 2 of the doubleheader. In his last 14 games, Carter is slashing .288/.351/.577 with two doubles, two triples, three home runs, eight RBI, nine runs scored and five walks. This comes after he went 2-for-25 in his first seven games to open the season. He has a 14.4% walk rate this year.

DON'T FORGET ABOUT FOSS

Express INF Justin Foscue went 2-for-6 with a homer, RBI, two runs scored, two walks and a strikeout in between the two games yesterday. He was 2-for-20 in his prior six games.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Round Rock continues their 12-game road trip on Tuesday at Southwest University Park against the El Paso Chihuahuas (San Diego Padres). El Paso has dropped five of their last seven games and they are looking for a series split today with Oklahoma City.

BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

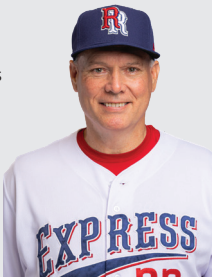

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
