TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints scored five runs in the first inning, courtesy of a bases-loaded walk to Tony Kemp and Patrick Winkel's first career grand slam. David Festa was excellent in his start, striking out 10 over 5.0 innings, tying the franchise record for single-game strikeouts by a pitcher. However, the Louisville Bats would score seven unanswered runs to take the game 7-5. The Saints committed three errors for the second time in four games, allowing unearned runs in the sixth and seventh innings.

FEELING GRAND: Patrick Winkel clubbed his first career grand slam on Tuesday. It marks the first grand slam of the season for the Saints, who tied the modern-era minor league record (since 2005) with 14 grand slams in 2023. The Saints' 27 grand slams since 2021 are the second-most in Triple-A, trailing only the 29 hit by Albuquerque in that span.

BULLPEN BACKFIRE: In the last 13 games since April 14, the Saints bullpen has gone 2-5 with a 7.17 ERA. They rank 18th in ERA, having thrown the fourth-fewest innings in that span (47.2), but have allowed the sixth-most hits in the IL (63). They have the fifth-best strikeout-to-walk ratio at 2.19, but have the second-highest WHIP (1.87) and second-highest opponent batting average (.315) in that stretch.

A STRIKEOUT FESTA-VAL: In his start on Tuesday, David Festa struck out 10 batters, tying the franchise record for single game strikeouts by a starter which was set by Griffin Jax on May 28, 2021. Festa is the 13th Triple-A pitcher to put up a 10-strikeout performance this season and only the sixth to do so in only 5.0 innings. The Lehigh Valley Ironpigs are the only team remaining in the IL to have one game of 10-or-more strikeouts since 2021.

ERROR 404: Over the last six games, the Saints have committed nine errors, including an error in six straight games. Their six-game skid with an error is tied for the longest streak in the International League. It's their longest streak since committing an error in 18 straight games from May 10-28, 2022. The Saints did not commit an error in their first five games this year and were the last team in Triple-A to commit an error. Their 24 errors since April 3 are the most in the International League and their .970 fielding percentage in that stretch is also the lowest in the IL.

DOUBLE PLAYS, FOR FOUR: In game two of the doubleheader on Saturday, the Saints grounded into four double plays, matching the franchise record set on June 28, 2022 against Omaha. It's the first time the club has hit into four double plays in a seven inning contest. It also marks just the ninth time in the Statcast Era (2015) that a team has grounded into four double plays in a seven inning game.

DIEGO SAVES THE DAY: Diego Castillo picked up his first save of the season on Thursday in the Saints 3-0 victory. The owner of 35 Major League saves, Castillo picked up his first minor league save since June 1, 2018 against the Pawtucket Red Sox. His six-out save that day was his final minor league appearance before making his Major League debut with Tampa Bay. Castillo has converted 37 of his 55 minor league save opportunities in his career, including 12 of 19 in Triple-A. He's converted 35 of his 47 save opportunities in the Major Leagues.

PRATO POWER UP: Anthony Prato has displayed his ability to reach base, leading the team with 23 walks, ranking second in the International League. He's hit .292 (12-for-41) in his last 11 games, drawing 12 walks to 13 strikeouts in that stretch. Prato's .475 on-base percentage is the third-highest in the IL. In his Triple-A career, Prato has reached base in 83 of his 95 games. He is currently riding a six-game hit streak, the second-longest of the season for the Saints. Prato is hitting 8-for-22 (.364) during the streak.

REHAB ROUNDTABLE: The Minnesota Twins reinstated Jhoan Duran from the Injured List on Tuesday, leaving Justin Topa as the only rehab assignment on the Saints roster. Topa has appeared in two games, allowing two earned runs in 2.0 innings, walking one and striking out four.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins won their ninth consecutive game on Tuesday, beating the White Sox 6-5. The Twins rallied for three runs in the last two innings of the game, getting RBI singles from Carlos Correa and Trevor Larnach, followed by a go-ahead sacrifice fly from Max Kepler to give the Twins the 6-5 lead. Jhoan Duran picked up his first save of the season in the win.

They swept through the tournament taking down Chico State, 4-0, beating South New Hampshire, 13-7, defeating Catawba in the semifinals, 2-1 and shutting out Delta State for the championship, 9-0.

MVP MVP MVP: In winning the DII College World Series with West Chester (PA) University as a sophomore, Gunkel was simply tremendous during the tournament. He tossed 18.0 scoreless innings including a shutout in the championship game, a 9-0 win over Delta State. For his efforts, Gunkel was named the Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

TRADE BAIT: Joe has been traded not once, but twice in his career. He was traded from the Boston Red Sox to the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for OF Alejandro De Aza on June 3, 2015. Less than two years later he was traded again this time from the Baltimore Orioles to the Los Angeles Dodgers in exchange for a player to be named later on April 10, 2017.
