**LAST GAME:** The Space Cowboys extended their winning streak to five games with a 7-4 win over Oklahoma City on Wednesday night. Franklin Barreto went 2-for-4 with a double and three RBI. Corey Julks hit his first home run of the year, a solo shot in the ninth.

**ON THE RUN:** The Space Cowboys stole a season-high four bases in Tuesday's win. Their 24 stolen bases on the season are tied for second-most in the Pacific Coast League. David Hensley and Pedro León are both tied for fifth in the PCL with five stolen bases.

**FRANKIE FLAMES:** Over his last five games, Franklin Barreto has hit .333 (5x15) with three double and five RBI.

**PUNCHIES:** The Space Cowboys pitching staff leads Minor League Baseball with 209 strikeouts. The next-closest Pacific Coast League team is Sacramento (190 SO). The staff matched its season high with 15 strikeouts in Saturday's win at Tacoma.

**FEELING EXTRA:** Two of the Space Cowboys' last four games have gone into extra innings, winning both of those games. They're 2-2 in extra-inning games this season.

**RIP IT AND FLIP IT:** Prior to their game on April 20, the Astros selected the contract of IF JJ Matijevec from the Space Cowboys. It marks the first career promotion to the Major Leagues for Matijevec, who led the Space Cowboys in home runs (4), RBI (10) and OPS (1.134). Matijevec was tied for fourth in home runs and was sixth in OPS on the Pacific Coast league leaderboard at the time of his promotion. Matijevec is the second Space Cowboys player to have his contract selected by the Astros this season, joining LHP Parker Mushinski. The Astros selected Matijevec in the second round of the 2017 MLB Draft from Arizona.

**SOME PEOPLE CALL THEM:** Opening Day on April 5 was the first-ever game for the Astros' Triple A affiliate under the Sugar Land Space Cowboys brand. The Astros re-branded their Triple A affiliate on Jan. 29, following the purchase of the Sugar Land franchise in 2021. Sugar Land had played under the "Skeeters" brand for the first 10 years of its existence. They spent 2012-20 as members of the independent Atlantic League and rose to the Triple A level for the 2021 season.

**FAMILIAR FACE:** Sugar Land and Oklahoma City met 24 times in 2021, splitting the season series at 12-12. This will be the first-ever game between the 'Space Cowboys' and Dodgers.

**PATIENCE IS KEY:** The Space Cowboys drew a season-high nine walks in Tuesday's win. David Hensley drew three of the walks and leads the Pacific Coast League with 16 walks this season. The Space Cowboys are second in the Pacific Coast League with 89 walks, trailing just Oklahoma City (90).

**STREAKING:** The Space Cowboys are amidst a five-game winning streak, which is their longest of the season. The five-game winning streak is the longest active streak of Triple A teams.

**KING JAMES:** Josh James recorded his third save of the season on Saturday at Tacoma and is tied for first in the Pacific Coast League. James has collected 11 strikeouts through his first 7 1/3 innings of the season.

**VOTE FOR PEDRO:** Pedro León hit his second homer of the season last Friday night, traveling 422 feet to left-center at Cheney Stadium. It was the second-longest Space Cowboys home run of the season. León, who's rated as the Astros' No. 4 prospect by MLB Pipeline, leads the Space Cowboys with 12 RBI.

**DOUBLE THE DE GOTI:** Alex De Goti is tied for second in the Pacific Coast League with six doubles. De Goti is also tied for second with two triples and tied for fifth with 11 walks.

**WRECK 'EM:** The Astros on April 16 selected the contract of left-hander Parker Mushinski from the Space Cowboys, while placing right-hander Ryan Pressly on the 10-Day IL. Mushinski was the first Space Cowboys player to receive a promotion to the Astros this season. Mushinski made his MLB debut on April 18 at SEA, striking out one in a scoreless inning of relief. He picked up his first career strikeout against Seattle third baseman Eugenio Suarez. The Astros selected Mushinski in the seventh round of the 2017 MLB Draft from Texas Tech.

**NOW HERE'S A STOREY:** Mickey Storey returns for his third season as the manager of the Astros' Triple A affiliate and his second with Sugar Land. Storey joined the Astros organization as a coach in 2016 and has managed with Single A Quad Cities (2018) and Triple A Round Rock (2019), along with two seasons in Sugar Land. Storey appeared in nine seasons at the professional level as a right-handed pitcher, including stints at the Major League level with the Astros (2012) and Blue Jay (2013). He appeared in four collegiate seasons at Florida Atlantic and was selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft.

**TO INFINITY AND BEYOND:** Key elements of the Space Cowboys brand include the Mission Patch, Horizon Gradient and Primary Space Cowboys Logo.

- **Primary Logo:** The primary logo features the Space Cowboy donning a traditional cowboy hat, a bandana and a blast shield over his face that is peppered with space dust and has a starburst at the eye.
- **Horizon Gradient:** Inspired by a shot of the horizon of the earth from space, the color palette and gradient feature light blue, navy, orange, gray and black notes that are prominent in the franchise's logo and uniforms. The colors represent the ever-expanding Sugar Land community and an exciting new chapter on the horizon
- **Mission Patch:** This patch will be featured on all three uniforms and serves as an alternate logo. It intertwines elements from the Texas state flag, with a rocket superimposed over the front ready to launch.

**READY TO RIDE:** The Space Cowboys brand pays respect to elements that are key to the identity of Greater Houston. The NASA Johnson Space Center is located in Houston and the Cowboys element is a nod to the rugged, Western roots that are embedded in Houston as Texas' largest city.

**KEEPING IT 100:** Korey Lee enters the season rated as the No. 70 overall prospect in baseball, per Baseball America. RHP Hunter Brown is rated as the No. 95 overall prospect in baseball – and Lee rated at No. 97 – per FanGraphs.

**THE FUTURE:** The Space Cowboys Opening Day roster featured nine players ranked within the Astros' top 30 prospects (per MLB Pipeline): C Korey Lee (No. 2), RHP Hunter Brown (No. 3), IF Pedro León (No. 4), RHP Peter Solomon (No. 7), RHP Shawn Dubin (No. 8), LHP Jonathan Bermudez (No. 19), RHP Tyler Ivey (No. 20), OF Alex McKenna (No. 22), OF Corey Julks (No. 28).

**EAST, WEST:** Sugar Land won the Eastern Division of the formerly-named Triple A West, with a record of 75-55. They posted the second-best record in all of Triple A West, behind only Tacoma (78-52).

**PISTOL PETE:** RHP Peter Solomon was named Triple A West Pitcher of the Year and the Sugar Land Pitcher of the Year in 2021. Solomon ranked among the Triple A West leaders in wins (8, T-3rd) and strikeouts (112, 3rd).

**LEVEL UP:** The Space Cowboys enter their second season as the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. By approximate mileage, the Space Cowboys are the second-closest Triple A team to their parent club (22 miles), trailing only the St. Paul Saints (Triple A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins).

**WHERE TO FIND US:** Beginning in 2022, all 150 Space Cowboys games can be heard on ESPN 92.5 FM (Gow Media). An audio streaming link is also available at slspacecowboys.com. All Space Cowboys can be seen on MiLB. TV. Longtime Houston broadcaster Gerald Sanchez returns as the play-by-play voice of the Space Cowboys.

**A LITTLE ABOUT US:** Through their first nine seasons, Sugar Land played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons. Sugar Land still holds Atlantic League single-season records for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from its '13 season. Sugar Land was managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, Sugar Land went 601-502. Notable people to appear for Sugar Land include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino

**REST OF THE CREW:** Joining manager Mickey Storey on the Space Cowboys coaching staff are pitching coach Erick Abreu, hitting coach Rafael Peña and development coach Wladimir Sutil. Abreu returns for his second season in Sugar Land as the pitching coach for the Astros' Triple A affiliate. He's previously worked as the pitching coach for Astros affiliates at the Single A, Short-Season, Appalachian League, Gulf Coast League and Dominican Summer League levels, joining the organization as a coach in 2014. Peña enters his first season on the Sugar Land staff after serving as the hitting coach for Double A Corpus Christi in 2021. He joined the Astros organization as a coach in 2018. Sutil enters his first season on the Space Cowboys staff after serving as the manager for the Astros' Florida Complex League team in 2021. He's worked as a manager for Astros affiliates at the Short-Season and Gulf Coast League levels, joining the organization as a coach in 2014.

**HYPER LOCAL:** The Space Cowboys have three players on their roster that grew up in the Houston area in RHP Chad Donato (Cypress), OF Corey Julks (Friendswood) and RHP Nick Hernandez (Missouri City). Hernandez graduated from Dulles H.S. in Sugar Land, which is located less than five miles from Constellation Field, home of the Space Cowboys. Both Julks and Hernandez went on to play for the University of Houston, with both earning All-American Conference First Team honors at points during their career with the Cougars.

**ROAD TO THE SHOW:** Six players went on to make their Major League debut in 2021 after appearing with Sugar Land: RHP Tyler Ivey, RHP Ralph Garza Jr., LHP Ryan Hartman, OF Jake Meyers, OF Jose Siri and RHP Seth Martinez. Siri and Meyers were both members of the Astros' postseason roster, with Meyers appearing in the ALDS before sustaining a season-ending shoulder injury and Siri appearing in both the ALCS and World Series.
