## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints snapped their 10-game losing streak with a 7-6, walk-off victory over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre in 10 innings on Wednesday. The Saints trailed 6-1 after six innings, but Diego A. Castillo got the Saints within a run by hitting his first professional grand slam in the seventh, making it 6-5. A dropped third strike in the eighth inning allowed Rylan Bannon to score the tying run. Hobie Harris and Caleb Baragar combined to throw 4.0 shutout innings to finish the game. After Baragar put up a zero in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning, Chris Williams bunted Jair Camargo over to third and Anthony Prato hit a single to right field to score the winning run and give the Saints their third walk-off win of the season.

**WE ALL MAKE SACRIFICES:** The Saints have laid down only 16 sacrifice bunts since joining the International League in 2021, the fewest in Triple-A (next closest is OKC with 23). For the first time in franchise history, the Saints had two sacrifice bunts in one game on Wednesday in their 7-6 win. Chris Williams put down his first sacrifice bunt of his career in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning, pushing the winning run to third base. Only three of the Saints 16 sacrifice bunts have come in extra innings, with the club going 7-8 all-time when executing a sacrifice bunt.

**FEELING GRAND:** Diego A. Castillo clubbed his first career grand slam in the seventh inning on Wednesday, the Saints fourth of the season and first since Brooks Lee hit one on June 18 against Toledo. The Saints 30 grand slams since 2021 are the most in the International League and the third-most in Triple-A.

**ELECTRIC EELES:** Since joining the Saints on July 4, he has constantly found ways to get on base, sporting a .431 on-base percentage in Triple-A. He's reached base in 31 of the 36 games he's played in, drawing 18 walks and been hit by a pitch six times. He is third among full-season minor league players in on-base percentage at .445 across three levels. Of the two players ahead of him, only one has played in Triple-A.

**GOING FOR A PERFECT 10:** Caleb Boushley will look to become the Saints first 10-game winner since joining the International League in 2021. He is currently tied for the season-season record with nine wins, along with Randy Dobnak's nine wins this year and Chandler Shepherd, who did so in 2021. Boushley previously won double-digit games in 2022, going 12-2 with Nashville. No IL pitcher has had multiple 10+ win seasons since 2021. Only 16 IL pitchers have posted multiple 10+ win seasons in the Statcast Era (2015).

**DK100:** With his single in the second inning on Tuesday, DaShawn Keirsej Jr. became the fifth Saint to eclipse 100 hits in a season. He joins Jose Miranda (2021), Tomas Telis (2021), Jermaine Palacios (2022) and Andrew Stevenson (2023) as the only Saints to hit the century mark in hits in a season. He is in position to climb the single-season hit charts, trailing Palacios (111), Miranda (117), Telis (125) and the franchise record set by Andrew Stevenson at 132 hits last season.

**SUMMERTIME SEVERINO:** In Yunior Severino's 63 games since May 21, he has hit .324 (78-for-238), with 12 home runs, drawing 40 walks, owning a .941 OPS. In that time, Severino ranks second in the league in batting average, third OPS and RBI (48), fifth in on-base percentage (.416), sixth with 77 hits and ninth in slugging percentage at .525.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Twins used a seven-run fourth inning to beat San Diego 11-4. Simeon Woods Richardson picked up his fifth win of the season, striking out seven over 5.0 innings, allowing one run. Trevor Larnach went 4-for-6 with a pair of doubles and Matt Wallner smacked a three-run homer, his eighth in the Big League this season.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** 8/16 @ IND...made 21<sup>st</sup> start of the season, throwing his eighth quality start, allowing one run on six hits, one home run, walking none and striking out eight, tying his season-high...retired nine of his first 10 batters before allowing three straight singles with two outs in the third...allowed a solo home run to Billy McKinney to open the fifth inning...retired the next six batters to finish the start...was countered by Bubba Chandler, who struck out 11 Saints in 6.0 innings...did not factor into the decision in a 3-2 Saints loss.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 8/10 v COL...made 20<sup>th</sup> start of the season, allowed four runs on nine hits, three home runs (tying a career-high), walking none and striking out two...was the fourth time in his last seven starts allowing seven-or-more hits...gave up three home runs for the first time since April 9 against Iowa, marking the fourth time in his career giving up three homers...six earned runs the most allowed since July 3 against Gwinnett...allowed solo home run to Kyle Manardo in the first inning, a two-run homer to Estevan Florial in the second and a triple, followed by another Florial two-run homer in the third...took fifth loss of the season in 11-8 Saints defeat

**WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP:** Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

**SOMETHINGS BREWING:** One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

**GIVE BACK:** Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
