Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound today, looking to run his personal winning streak to three games (Clippers are 3-0 in last 3GS). The Saints will counter with RHP **Ryan Gallagher**. Columbus is 50-34 (.595) versus right handers this year. Gallagher has pitched against the Clippers twice in his career, going 0-2 with a 10.00ERA (9.0IP, 12H, 10R, 10ER, 4BB, 12K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 5-5 against the Saints in Ohio last year (2G cancelled), on the way to a 9-7 series record, and has won 51 of the last 83 overall opposing the Saints (445-356 run differential; 15 of 32 losses by a single run, only 11 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **David Fry** has hit .327 (18x55) with 3HR and 9RBI in 17G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 4HR and 16RBI in 15G).

Getting Offensive

Over the last 16G, the Clippers have plated a total of 121 runs (most in the IL, 7.6 per game), after coming out of the All-Star Break with 35 runs in the first 9G (16th in the IL, 3.9 per). They scored at least five runs in 13 straight games until Thursday (longest stretch in IL this year). The scoring barrage has seen 83 tallied in the first four innings of the game (32 scored in the 1st), including six innings of 5+.

Homer Time

Columbus has gained 15 in the homer column over the last 16G (40-25; out-homered 36-21 in 19G prior) to get back in the black (+2, 9th in the IL). Despite neither team going deep Saturday night (first time since 7/23 at St. Paul), the 65HR combined in the last 16G still yield an average of 4.1 per contest. The Clippers have gone deep in 14 of the last 16G, as their 40HR lead all of pro baseball since 7/28.

Ingle is Back

In 27G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 37x108 (.343), drawing 21BB (.450OBP) with 16XBH (6HR, .602SLG). He is the only batter in the IL hitting .300/.400/.500 (44PA from permanently qualifying for rate statistics), but is just 3x28 in his last 8G (season OPS has dipped below 1.000 for first time since 7/28). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.317OPS (15HR) in 42G (.642OPS and 3HR in 35G between DH and LF).

Deep Fry'd

David Fry was 0x9 (3K) in his first 2G after getting optioned on 8/3, but has rebounded to go 8x20 with a double, 5HR and 13RBI in his last 5G. He passed 100RBI as a Clipper with a career best 6RBI on 8/12 vs. Omaha (107RBI in 157G for Columbus). Thursday's bomb came at catcher, as Clipper catchers lead the IL in hitting (.295), OBP (.414), SLG (.558) and HR (26; tied for fewest last season: 8HR).

Bring it on Home

Ralph Velazquez had 4HR in 5G at Syracuse (21AB; had 2HR in 100AB of previous 25G on the road), boosting his OPS away from Huntington Park to .709. He owns 3HR in 4G this week (.978OPS in 33G at home) and, dating to 7/28, he leads the IL in HR (10), RBI (20; RBI in 12 of 15G) and SLG (.877). Aside from the trip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G, 7/21-7/26), he is hitting .331/.410/.640 since 6/18.

All or Nothing

Over his last 16G, since 7/25, **Kody Huff** is mired in an 8x54 (.148) slump, though he has connected for 5HR (18HR on the season; had 18HR in career prior). He scored his 100th run as a Clipper last night and, this season, Huff has career highs in runs (69) and RBI (65), leading the team in both (set to become the fourth 70-70 Clipper since 2019). His next hit will match a career best (82 with Akron in '24).

New Perks

Blake Perkins is 7x22 (.318) with a double, triple and homer since joining the Clippers at the deadline (was 6x27, all singles, in 7G for Nashville earlier this year). He has also drawn 8BB in just 30PA (27%), as the Clippers have an IL-best 64BB in 10G since his arrival (47BB in previous 9G, 7/22-8/3, 9th most). Last night marked the ninth time Columbus has had 10+ (most in the IL).

Problems on the Back End

Since allowing 7ER in 4.1IP at Lehigh Valley on 7/12, the Clipper bullpen has registered an IL-worst 7.09ERA in 26G (106.2IP, 84ER). Clipper relievers have surrendered 20HR in that time (4th most in the IL), allowing a line of .276/.383/.504. The bullpen has not put together a scoreless outing since back to back games vs. Louisville from 7/4-7/5 (98ER in 31G since; 70ER in 31G prior).

This Date in Clipper History

8/18/1998

Scott Pose went 3x3 with 3SB to propel the Clippers to a 6-2 win over Charlotte. Pose swiped 47 bases in 1998 to lead the IL, becoming the 6th stolen base champion in team history. The Clippers have had two more champs since then, **Bernie Castro** in 2007 and **Michael Brantley** in 2009, tying them with Toledo for the most in the League (8) since Columbus joined the IL in 1977.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,472 to 1,422).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 169-133 (.560) in pitch reviews, with batters going 87-80 (.521) and pitchers/catchers going 82-53 (.607). They have run out of challenges in 45G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 825, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 140 through 117G (on pace for 176SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 43CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (54; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 166 runs while crafting an .893OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 107 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +59 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 266-171 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,981RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.41 through 117G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 195HR (4th most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 63G this season (38-25, .603), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 7th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 9th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 38). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 449-460 (.494), 419-414 with Columbus (.503).

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 68 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 50.0IP, ranking 29th among that group with a 4.57ERA (80.2IP, 41ER) and 39th with a 1.44WHIP. He ranks 5th with 85K thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24; had second career 0K game on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley).

That's Over:

From 5/9-7/23, the Clippers went 1-12 in Peterson's 13G, as he personally went 0-8 (longest losing streak of career, had 10 losses in previous two seasons combined). He registered a 5.52ERA (58.2IP, 36ER) over the stretch, while the bullpen produced a 6.99ERA (47.2IP, 37ER) and blew three saves. In 3GS since 7/29 vs. Toledo, he is 2-0 and owns a 2.40ERA (15.0IP, 4ER), as the Clippers have been victorious in each game.

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 40 times over his short career (17G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 14-10 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.48ERA (225.0IP, 176H, 66R, 62ER, 49BB, 219K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.43 over 57G (278.1IP, 294H, 158R, 137ER, 70BB, 254K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaalen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters were 3x3B with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). That all changed in his 13th start, at Lehigh Valley on 7/9, when he labored through the opening frame on 41 pitches, allowing a trio of runs (3x6, 2BB). In 5G since, including his relief outing on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, Peterson has held the opposition to 1ER in his first inning of work (5x21, 1BB, 4K). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .917OPS off Peterson (7HR in 122AB), while batters 4-9 produce a .682OPS (3HR in 188AB).

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .323 (41x127) with runners on base (.338, 25x74 with RISP) this year, while going just 44x183 (.240) with the bases empty. Only 22.9% of at bats end in a strikeout with RISP (17K, 74AB), compared to 28.8% in all other scenarios (68K, 236AB). He did not uncork a wild pitch this season until his 410th offering with men on base, 7/9 at Lehigh Valley (had another wild pitch in next outing, 7/18 vs. Indy; 3WP in 1,172 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).

From the 'Pen:

Peterson made his third career relief appearance (all with Columbus) on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, picking up a suspended game in the 4th inning against the Indians. Pitching on his regular day of rest, he threw 72 pitches over 4.0IP, while allowing 4ER (15.0IP, 11ER in relief career).
