That Was Last Time - The Saints win streak extended to seven games with a 7-3 win over lowa, completing the six-game sweep against the I-Cubs. The Saints hit four homers for the second time in the series, led by JT Riddle who hit a pair and drove in four RBIs. Bailey Ober struck out eight Cubs in four innings in the win.

Today's Game - Coming off of a sweep against lowa, the Saints take their streak to Louisville against the Bats, who are last place in the Triple-A East Midwest Division. Charlie Barnes goes back on the hill, coming off a gem in his last start where he pitched seven innings, and struck out a season-high seven batters. The Saints are 3-1 in games Rappes starts

Saints are Streaking - The Saints have won seven games in a row now, and have propelled themselves from a 6-11 mark, to second place in the Midwest Division at 13-11 now. Over the course of this streak, St. Paul's offense is averaging 6.7 runs per game, while the pitching staff is sporting a 3.28 ERA in that span.

Riddle is Raking - Dating back to May 23rd, JT Riddle has found his stride in the Saints offense. He's currently riding a six-game hit streak, with a .458 average in that stretch, with an OPS of 1.333. His last four games have all been multi-hit efforts. Riddle has also had a touch for the clutch, driving in nine runs during his hitting streak after collecting just four RBIs in his prior 16 contests.

Starters Strength - Since May 21st, the St. Paul starting pitchers have put together some excellent outings. The Saints starters collectively own a 2.10 ERA in that stretch, allowing only 10 earned runs in 42.2 innings, spanning the last nine games.

Telis Timing it - Tomas Telís has been on a tear for the Saints since May 16th. He went on a five-game hit streak, the last four of which were multi-hit games. Telís is batting .300 in this stretch with 15 hits in his last 12 games. After driving in just two runs in his first 17 games of the year, Telís has driven in seven runs in the his last five games.

Keeping it in the Park - The Saints pitching staff has a collective ERA of 4.22, good for 13th in the Triple-A East, and have not been damaged by round-trippers. St. Paul's pitching staff has given up just 12 homers, which is the the fewest in all of Triple-A, with the next-fewest being the 18 homers surrendered by Lehigh Valley. The Saints have not given up a homer in seven games

Saints Dig the Long Ball - The Saints' offense has come in bunches through 24 games this season, because nearly half of it has come from home runs. Of the 108 runs that St. Paul has scored this season, 46 (42.6%) of them have been accounted for by home runs. Brent Rooker and Ryan Jeffers are tied for the team lead in homers with five.

Rooker's Good Reads - While currently riding a six-game hit streak, OF Brent Rooker is also currently tied for sixth in walks in the Triple-A East, drawing 15 this eason. He's gotten on base in all but two games he's played in (17 of 19) with a on-base percentage of .366 this season. Rooker has two games with three walks this year.

Roster Notes - OF Gilberto Celestino and INF Sherman Johnson were promoted from Double-A Wichita to St. Paul, and OF Mark Contreras was transferred back to Wichita. RHP Shaun Anderson was also optioned to St. Paul.

- Earned his first Spring Training invite prior to the 2020 season, was sent to the Twins' Alternate Training Site on September 5th, and spent the final month of the regular season there. Following his time there, he played in the Twins' Fall Instructional League in October.
- Pitched at three different levels in 2019, starting in Adv.-A Fort Myers, finishing at Triple-A Rochester. While with the Red Wings, he started 4 games that resulted in a 1-2 record and a 6.75 ERA. In total, he started 25 games, which was more than any other Twins' minor league pitcher.
- Has started all but two games in his minor league career, averaging a 7.7K/9 over the course of his three year career.
- Graduated from Clemson in three years, becoming the 13th member of his family to earn a degree from Clemson. His brother James, was a redshirt-freshman quarterback on the 2016 football team that won a national championship.

Last Series: 1-12, 2B, 2R | Current Series:

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Brewers alternate training site, reuiniting with them after spending 2016-18 with Milwaukee.
- Saw Big League action with 3 different teams in 2019, suiting up for the New York Mets before being traded to the Baltimore Orioles and then being claimed off waivers by the Seattle Mariners hitting a combined .167 for the season.
- Was a 20-20 player in the Majors in 2017 hitting .220/20/49 and stealing 21 bases. Broxton was 5th in speed at 29.4 ft/sec. 30 ft/sec is elite & average is 27.0 ft/sec

- He crushed left-handed pitching with Minnesota, hitting .300 with a .417 OBP.
- Going into 2020 he was fourth best Twins' prospect and and the best defensive catcher in the system by Baseball America. He caught the third-most games amongst rookie catchers in the majors with 25.
- Jeffers started in professional baseball on a tear in 2018 with Elizabethton, he played 28 games hitting .422 with a .543 OBP and a staggering 1.121 OPS.
- Among all Twins catchers with a minimum 150 innings caught at the major league level, Jeffers is third in catcher ERA at a 3.89. He is only behind Butch Wynegar with a 3.73 in 1976 and Joe Mauer with a 3.36 in 2004.

- After signing with the Twins, Johnson was assigned to Double-A Wichita, where he hit .107 through 11 games. Two of his three hits were doubles.

- Did not see any action in the 2020 season. In 2019, he spent time between Double-A Pensacola and Triple-A Rochester. He played 108 games with the Red Wings in 2019, smacking ten homers and collecting 46 RBIs.
- In those 108 games, he finished with a career-high .788 OPS. His ten home runs were also a career-high, doubling his previous best of five long balls with 2017 Oklahoma City Dodgers.
- His younger brother, Beau, also played with Drew at Arizona State and was a 24th round pick by the Royals and made it as far as Triple-A. His brother Joe played at the University of Arizona and won a College World Series.
- Was an All-Star in three straight seasons from 2014-16, he was also named a Twins' organizational All-Star in 2019.

- Made the 2018 Opening Day roster with Miami, the first and only of his career.

Relief Highs - IP: 4.0 H: 3 SO: 4 BB: 2

- Was on the Giants' Opening Day roster last season, the first of his career. His first 16 career appearances came as a starter, but since 8/24/19 has been used exclusively as a reliever.
- In 2020, he inherited ten runners, allowing only three to score and help opponents to a .182 average.
- Threw his slider 53.4% of the time last season, which was eighth among right-handers (min. 250 pitches) and resulted in a 39% whiff percentage on that pitch. His opposition only hit .108 againt the slider.
- Ended the 2020 season on a 5.1 inning scoreless streak that started on August 25th.
- Drafted with the last pick of the 40th round of the 2013 draft, making him the 15th winner of the MLB.com "Don't Count Him Out Award"
- Pitched in college at the University of Florida, was in the same class as Pete Alonso.

26 COULOMBE, DANNY LHP

Relief Highs - IP: 3.0 H: 5 SO: 5 BB: 4

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Alternate Training Site, had his contract selected on August 22nd and made two appearances with the Twins throwing 2.2 scoreless innings.
- Has spent parts of six of the last seven seasons on Major League rosters. He spent most of his time in the Bigs with Oakland, making 134 appearances with the A's over three seasons.
- The 2017 season called Coulombe's name 72 times with the A's. He was didn't allow a run in 57-of-72 games but pitched less than 1.0 IP in 42-of-72 outings.
- He was a two-time selection of the Los Angeles Dodgers draft pick.
 Once in the 17th round 2008, then opted for college and was picked again in the 25th round of the 2012 draft. Three years later, he was dealt to the A's.

- Spent the 2020 season with the Texas Rangers. Had his contract selected on July 23rd. Was optioned to the Alternate Training Site in August while he led the team in appearances with 14.
- Allowed runs in just five of his 14 games, he held lefties to a .192 average, while righties faired a bit better, hitting .273 against him.
- Prior to his time with Texas, he was a member of the Tampa Bay Rays organization, where Baseball America ranked him the 18th best Rays' prospect after the 2018 season.
- During the 2018 campaign, he was named an International League All-Star with the Durham Bulls.
- Has had his run-ins with injuries, missing his junior season of HS and most of his sophomore year of college due to injury.
