YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the SeaWolves, 8-7, to open the homestand. Erie scored a run on an error in the top of the first inning. In the bottom of the first, Richmond recorded five consecutive hits to take a 3-1 lead, including an RBI single by **Parks Harber** and a two-run single by **Charlie Szykwoy**. **Diego Velasquez** hit an RBI single in the bottom of the fourth to open a 4-1 lead. After an Erie run in the top of the fifth, **Bo Davidson** hit a solo homer in the bottom of the inning for a 5-2 Flying Squirrels lead. Andrew Jenkins hit a two-run single in the seventh to pull the SeaWolves within a run. In the bottom of the seventh, Harber hit a two-run homer and Szykwoy added a solo homer to push the Richmond lead to 8-4. In the ninth, Erie plated a run on an error and Izaac Pacheco hit a two-run homer to close the score to 8-7 before **Tyler Vogel** entered out of the bullpen to record the final out. **Ben Peterson** picked up his first Double-A win.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This is Erie's first-ever visit to CarMax Park. Richmond lost their season opener at Erie before winning the final two games of the three-game series from April 3-5. The Flying Squirrels returned to Erie and split a six-game series from May 12-17. The SeaWolves return to CarMax Park for a three-game series from July 17-19.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 35-16 start is the best in team history through 50 games, passing a 28-23 start in 2013 and 2022. Richmond has won five series and split four so far this year. Seven-of-16 Richmond losses have been by one run.

RELENTLESS: In their 35 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 16 of them. In 11 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchey** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS lead the Southwest Division by 7.5 games over Akron and Harrisburg with 17 games remaining in the Eastern League's first half. They have the best record in Double-A. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Richmond offense ranked tied for third in doubles (114), fifth in batting average (.284) and had the fifth-fewest strikeouts (424). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, hits (489), doubles and triples (16) and ranks second in runs (326), total bases (791), OBP (.366), SLG (.459) and OPS (.825).

THE SEAWOLVES are in fourth place in the Southwest Division, 10.5 games behind Richmond. Erie split last week's six-game series against the Baysox at home. Erie's roster features two players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects, including SS John Peck (No. 15) and C Thayron Liranzo (No. 20). MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospects list features four Erie players, including Liranzo (No. 5), Peck (No. 13), 3B/1B Izaac Pacheco (No. 18) and OF Brett Callahan (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Cesar Perdomo** makes his eighth Double-A start and 10th appearance of the year. He last pitched on Thursday in Akron and allowed two runs over four innings with five strikeouts. In his previous start on May 21 against Binghamton, Perdomo retired the first nine batters he faced and 16-of-the-first-17 batters into the sixth before allowing a two-run double with two outs in the sixth, the only runs he surrendering over 5.2 innings. Perdomo spent all of last season with High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.96 ERA in 26 starts. For the year, he led the Northwest League in innings pitched (127.1) and ranked tied for first in games started (26), second in WHIP (1.24), tied for third in wins (8), fourth in ERA (3.96) and fourth in strikeouts (118). Among Giants minor leaguers, he ranked tied for second in starts (26), fourth in innings pitched (127.1), eighth in strikeouts (118) and ninth in ERA (3.96). Perdomo split the 2024 season between Low-A San Jose, where he posted a 1.26 ERA in 13 outings and was a California League Post-Season All-Star, and Eugene. He signed with the Giants as an international free agent in 2021. *For more on Perdomo, see page two.*

FOR ERIE: Right-hander Kenny Serwa makes his 11th start of the year and the sixth of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Thursday against the Baysox and allowed five runs (three earned) over three innings. Over five starts in his career against the Flying Squirrels, Serwa is 2-1 with a 3.92 ERA (9 ER/20.2 IP). He last faced the Flying Squirrels on May 17 at UPMC Park and worked four scoreless innings. In his start against Richmond on April 4, Serwa allowed five runs on Richmond's two outs before being removed in a loss. Last year, he made back-to-back five-inning, scoreless starts in August at UPMC Park against Richmond. In his first affiliated season in 2025, Serwa began the year with High-A West Michigan and went 3-1 with a 2.75 ERA in 10 outings (five starts). He was promoted to Double-A on June 5 and made 17 starts for the SeaWolves, posting a 6-6 record with a 3.95 ERA. Serwa began his college career with one season at NCAA Div. I St. Joseph's (Ind.) College before spending three seasons at SIU Edwardsville. He then pitched one season at the University of Central Florida before spending his final college season at Dayton in 2022. Serwa pitched in independent baseball with the Billings Mustangs in 2022, did not pitch in 2023 and spent the 2024 season with the independent Chicago Dogs.

SOARING TO THE SHOW: **Jonah Cox** was called up to the San Francisco Giants directly from Richmond on Sunday and made his MLB debut that afternoon in Denver, less than a half hour from his hometown, against the Colorado Rockies. Cox entered as a pinch-runner in the eighth and scored a run before picking up a double in his first plate appearance in the ninth. Cox hit .400 over 44 games with the Flying Squirrels, which led the minor leagues. He was the second batter to hit .400 or better over the first two calendar months of an Eastern League season, joining Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (2018). Cox was second in the minors in OPS (1.097), fifth in SLG (.644) and tied for seventh in stolen bases (27). He led the Eastern League in batting average, OPS, SLG, stolen bases, OBP (.453), hits (64) and triples (5) at the time of his promotion. Cox was the sixth player called up directly from Richmond to make his MLB debut, joining **Daren Ford** (2010), **Matt Duffy** (2014), **Hunter Strickland** (2014), **Dan Slania** (2017) and **Miguel Gómez** (2017).

PARKS & WRECK: **Parks Harber** has homered seven times and picked up 25 RBIs in his last 22 games since May 7. He had seven RBIs over two games on May 13 and 14 at Erie, including two homers. He hit a solo home run on May 20 against Binghamton before driving a game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth, his second walk-off hit for the Flying Squirrels this year. Harber had 23 RBIs in the month of May, which was fourth-most in the Eastern League. On Tuesday night, he drove in three runs and hit a two-run homer.

TUGBOAT HONORED: **Matt Wilkinson** was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on Monday after throwing seven scoreless innings and allowing one hit against his former team in Akron last Wednesday. After allowing a leadoff single in the first, he retired the next 19 consecutive batters until a hit-out walk in the seventh. With the outing, he lowered his season ERA to 1.87, which is second-best in the Eastern League. Wilkinson was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on Tuesday.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 295 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,075).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.400), first in OBP (.453), first in SLG (.644), first in OPS (1.097), first in hits (64), first in triples (5), second in stolen bases (27), fourth in total bases (103), tied for fifth in RBIs (35), tied for seventh in extra-base hits (22). **Parks Harber** is sixth in batting average (.323), seventh in SLG (.577), seventh in OPS (.967) and 10th in OBP (.390). **Scott Bandura** is fifth in batting average (.324) and second in OBP (.430). **Joe Whitman** is first in strikeouts (65), second in WHIP (0.97), tied for second in wins (5), fifth in BAA (.154), second in ERA (1.87) and third in innings pitched (50.1). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in WHIP (0.83), first in BAA (.154), second in ERA (1.87) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (49). **Jack Choate** is tied for second in wins (5). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (7). **Mitch White** is tied for fourth in saves (5). **Cesar Perdomo** is tied for seventh in BAA (.220) and seventh in WHIP (1.20).

SHUFFLING: Richmond left-handed pitchers **Joe Whitman** and **Matt Wilkinson** were promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on Tuesday. It is the first time at the level for both players. Richmond added RHP **Yunior Marte**, LHP **Charlie McDaniel**, RHP **Ryan Vanderhei**, INF **Jean Carlos Sio** and C **Onil Perez** from High-A Eugene.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Joe Whitman** (No. 18), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14) and INF **Mau Ahuna** (No. 20).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

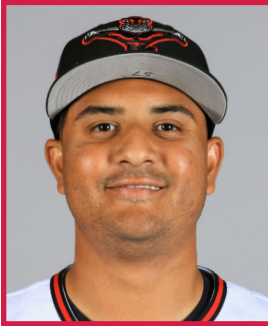
2008: The Richmond Braves beat the Durham Bulls, 7-0, in Durham. Charlie Morton started and threw eight scoreless, one-hit innings and struck out 13 batters. He improved to 5-1 with a 1.70 ERA, the lowest in Triple-A.

2018: The Flying Squirrels beat the Reading Fightin Phils, 4-3. Jerry Sands went 2-for-2 with a homer, a double and two RBIs. Ronnie Jebavy drove in two runs. Relievers Carlos Diaz, Patrick Ruotolo and Dillon McNamara combined for three scoreless innings to finish the game. The win snapped a streak of seven straight June 3 losses to open the franchise's history.
